

# In the Loop with Pastor Clay – The Hand

Thanksgiving Day was near. The 1st grade teacher gave her class a fun assignment – to draw a picture of something for which they were thankful. The teacher expected that the subjects of the students' art would be those things we associate with the holiday such as family, turkeys, other favorite foods, trees with autumn colors, maybe even a pet. And they were. But Brian made a different kind of picture. The teacher knew that he came from a family that was struggling, financially and otherwise. Brian was withdrawn, quiet, shy, and often seemed unhappy. At recess, when other students were playing, Brian was more likely to spend most of his time standing by her side. He received time and age-appropriate resources from the school counselor, but because the teacher was somewhat familiar with Brian's home situation, she was still concerned about his seeming sadness.

Yes, Brian's picture was different. When asked to draw something for which he was thankful, Brian drew a hand. Nothing else. Just the outline of an empty hand. His abstract image caught the imagination of his classmates and a discussion ensued. Some guessed the image represented the hand of a farmer because farmers provide our Thanksgiving feasts. Others thought it was the hand of a police officer because the police protect us. Still others suggested it was the hand of God because God blesses us with those things for which we are thankful. And so the discussion went, until the teacher squatted next to Brian's desk and asked him share whose hand it was. In a soft voice, Brian said, "It's your hand, Miss Anderson."

As tears began to well up in her eyes and her throat tightened, Miss Anderson recalled the times she had taken Brian's hand in hers and walked him here or there. How often she had said, "Take my hand, Brian, let's go outside." Or, "I'll show you how to hold your pencil." Or, "Let's do this together." Douglas was most thankful for his teacher's hand!

This story speaks about more than thankfulness. It says a lot about good teachers teaching; good parents parenting; good grandparents encouraging, and good friends sharing friendship, and how much it means to the Brians of the world, children and adults alike. It says a lot about the hand of God which he extends to us with blessing after blessing, with his offer to take our hand when we're walking through a dark valley, and ultimately with the offer of eternal life with him when we grasp his hand in trust and faith, just like Brian trustingly took his teacher's hand.

This Thanksgiving we give thanks for God's hand in our lives.

*Deuteronomy 8:17-18 Do not say to yourself, "My power and the might of my own hand have gotten me this wealth." But remember the LORD your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth, so that he may confirm his covenant that he swore to your ancestors, as he is doing today.*

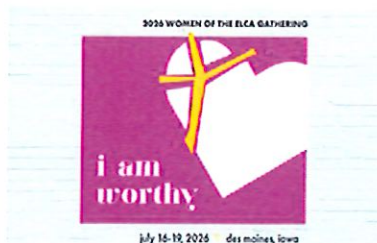

## OLD BAGS FOR GRACE

November 2025

We continue with our program to recycle **SOFT** plastics. Thank you to all who have been so diligent to bring in plastic on a regular basis. And here's an invitation to all of you who have not yet caught on to the excitement. Start saving your soft plastic and you'll be surprised at how quickly you have a considerable amount to provide.

Remember, this is only **SOFT** plastic ... **NO** pop bottles, milk jugs, or stiff plastic containers for this project... only soft plastic. Also no plastic bags that have aluminum threads or fiberglass threads woven in them. But think about all the places there is plastic in your life... including produce bags, store bags, and ice bags as well as Ziploc bags, cereal box liners, and bread bags. Bubble wrap, newspaper covers, and plastic e-commercial covers as well as water softener salt bags and dry cleaning bags. Keep watch...you'll find more than you think!! Recently, we have encountered garbage in the donations... PLEASE pay close attention and make sure that ONLY SOFT plastic make it into our containers.

Each week we go through the donations and find materials that DO NOT belong in this recycling effort. PLEASE help us reduce our work by making sure you are only giving us the SOFT plastics. We have removed pop bottles, deli containers, and dirty diapers!! PLEASE double check your bags!!

Thank you in advance for all your donations!! You can bring in your donations on Sundays or whenever the building is open... OR there is a container outside of the Grace Preschool/Sunday School entrance that can be used to donate plastic when the building is not open. 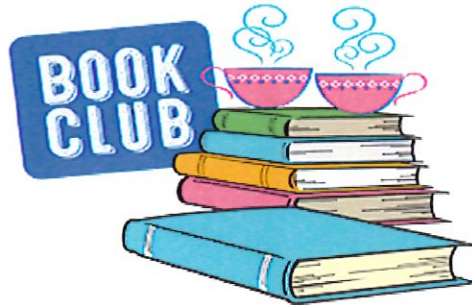

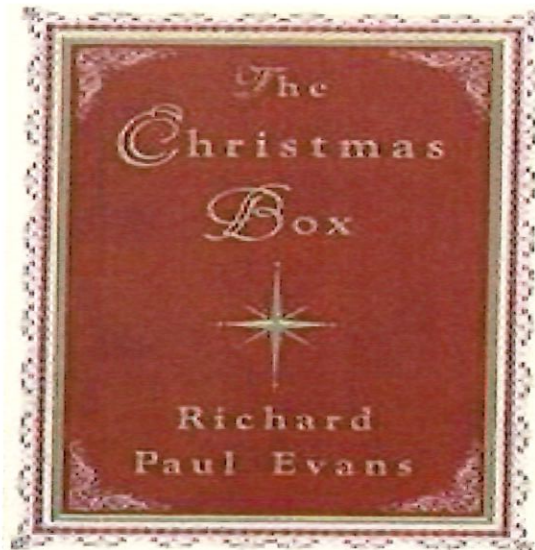
