In the Loop with Pastor Clay – The Deck of Cards



One Sunday morning an Army Chaplain was leading a chapel service for members of his unit while they were deployed overseas. During his sermon, the Chaplain noticed one of the soldiers looking at a deck of playing cards. The Chaplain was a bit miffed by this and after the service he asked the soldier why he wasn't paying attention to the sermon. The soldier explained that on a recent long-range patrol he had neither his Bible nor his Lutheran Prayer Book for the Armed Services, so he used his deck of playing cards instead.

The soldier explained, "When I look at the Ace, it tells me that there is one God and no other. When I see the 2, it reminds me that there are two parts to the Bible, the Old Testament and the New Testament. The 3 tells me of the Holy Trinity – God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The 4 reminds me of the four Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. When I see the 5, I'm reminded of the five unwise bridesmaids who were lost and the five who were saved. (Matthew 25:1-13) The 6 and the 7 remind me of the Creation Account, during which God created the Earth in six days and rested on the seventh. (Genesis, chapter 1) The 8 calls to mind the great flood, in which God destroyed all land-dwelling life except for eight people: faithful Noah, his wife, their three sons, and the three sons' wives. (Genesis, chapters 7 and 8) When I see the 9, I think of the nine lepers that God healed. There were ten lepers in all who were healed, but only one turned back to praise God and thank Jesus. (Luke 17:11-19) The 10 reminds me of the Ten Commandments carved in the stone tablets by God. (Exodus 20:1-21 and Exodus 31:18) The Jack makes me remember the Prince of Darkness. Like a roaring lion, your adversary the devil prowls around, looking for someone to devour. (1 Peter 5:8) When I look at the Oueen, I see the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of Jesus. (Matthew 1:18-25) As I look at the last card, the King, it reminds me that Jesus is King of Kings and Lord of Lords. (Revelation 17:14) The sum of all the cards (Ace = 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, Jack/11, Queen/12, King/13, plus one Joker) equals 365 and that's the number of days in a year. There are 12 face cards and that's the number of seasons in a year. You see, Chaplain, my deck of cards can serve as my Bible, my prayer book, and my almanac. My deck of cards reminds me that I need Jesus 365 days, 52 weeks, and 12 months a year, and that I should pray "4" others.


The Chaplain was amazed. He commended the soldier for his faithfulness and thanked him for providing the sermon material for next week's Chapel service!




None of us knows were our life began or where it will end. We did not know what we will be when we were born, and we don't know what will be after out death. Let us make
