How to Be Saved

To provide a remedy, God sent his only Son, Jesus, to live the perfect life God demands. **Romans 6:23**: “*For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.*” Although humanity through sin has separated itself from God, the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross bridged that gap. **Romans 5:8**: “*But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.*” All God asks is that a man or woman repent of his or her sins, turn from them and accept the sacrifice Christ made on the cross for those sins. **Romans 10:9**: “*If you declare with your mouth, ‘Jesus is Lord,’ and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.*” God promises in the Bible that anyone who accepts Christ as Savior shall be saved. **Romans 10:13**: “*Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.*”

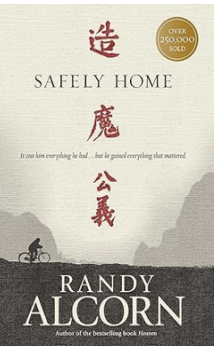
RECIPE: Red Velvet Crinkle Cookies



Ingredients	
• 2 1/4 Cups of All Purpose Flour	• 1 Cup Granulated Sugar
• 2 Tbsp Unsweetened Cocoa Powder	• 2 Large Eggs, Room Temperature
• 1 Tsp Baking Powder	• 1 Tbsp Red Food Coloring
• 1/4 Tsp Salt	• 1 Tsp Vanilla Extract
• 1/2 Cup Unsalted Butter, Softened	• 1/2 Cup Powdered Sugar, For Rolling
<div>Instructions</div> <div><div><div>1. Preheat your oven to 350°F. Line two baking sheets with parchment paper.</div><div>2. In a medium bowl, whisk together the flour, cocoa powder, baking powder, and salt. Set aside.</div><div>3. In a large bowl, beat the butter and granulated sugar until light and fluffy, about 2 minutes.</div><div>4. Add the eggs one at a time, mixing well after each addition. Stir in the red food coloring and vanilla extract.</div><div>5. Gradually mix the dry ingredients into the wet ingredients until a soft dough forms.</div><div>6. Scoop tablespoon-sized portions of dough and roll each one generously in powdered sugar.</div><div>7. Place the dough balls 2 inches apart on the prepared baking sheets.</div><div>8. Bake for 10 to 12 minutes, until the tops are crackled and the centers are just set.</div><div>9. Let the cookies cool on the baking sheet for 5 minutes before transferring to a wire rack.</div></div><div></div></div>
