

I'm Shiloh, a proud American dog. My brothers and sisters come in all breeds, sizes, and colors. Treat us well and we'll be your friend for life.

My ancestors helped to build this great country. Native Americans kept us for hunting and for protection from warring tribes. When early American colonials moved west, we went with them as part of the family. We are a part of history.

During our nation's wars, we served alongside our human brethren. We were messenger dogs, patrol dogs, guard dogs, mine dogs, Red Cross dogs, and search dogs. Today, more of us are trained to protect and serve our country.

When the twin towers were destroyed on 9-11 by terrorists and thousands were killed or went missing, dogs were called to action. We found survivors and risked our lives alongside the first responders who were there.

Whenever hurricanes and other disasters occur, my search and rescue cousins are called upon to help. Where there is danger, we run toward it, not away from it.

We are loyal and dependable service dogs and therapy dogs. Many veterans who are disabled or have PTSD rely on us. People suffering from medical issues find solace and support when we offer our friendship.

There are almost 77 million dogs in America, according to the American Veterinary Medical Association. Not all of us have families, but we should. There is a dog for everyone who wants one. If you bring us into your life, you will have a dedicated friend and we will have a purpose.

Who is New Life K9s?

New Life K9s is a nonprofit that provides service dogs free of charge to veterans and first responders with PTSD. Our mission is saving lives through the healing power of the human-canine bond. A service dog's presence and skills enable their recipients to re-engage with the world. Most importantly, our dogs help rebuild a sense of safety and trust for their veteran or first responder.



How service dog Nara saved her recipient

"My name is Alejandro [Army veteran]. I am writing to express my sincere appreciation for New Life K9s, and my utmost gratitude for all they have done to help me. They introduced me to Nara, who has become my favorite person as well as my service dog.

While I am not physically disabled, even simple tasks can be difficult for me. With Nara, I can interact with people and be in situations that would seem impossible. It gives me a semblance of normality that wasn't possible before I met with New Life K9s.

Today, I waited in line at a gas station and made conversation with a stranger, and I was happy. When I got in my car, I couldn't help but cry. Before Nara, the thought of even looking at people would have made me panic. Every day I get a bit of my life back. Nara has saved my life."

YOUR DOG READS YOU LIKE A BOOK, AND IT'S NOT A MYSTERY!

You and your dog communicate all the time, although you may not recognize it. Your dog is an expert at reading your cues. When you get prepared to go to work, your dog knows that you are getting ready to leave. Your canine can tell when you are going to feed them, take them for a walk, or to do almost anything that you routinely do.

When it comes to empathy, according to Dr. Lisa Pinn McFaddin, medical director at Independent Hill Veterinary Clinic in Manassas, Virginia, and host of a podcast called "Vetsplaining", "They can sense minute physiologic changes in people and other animals and respond accordingly."

"Dogs frequently try to comfort and calm upset owners," Dr. McFaddin explains," People do not always recognize these cues from dogs, as they may be subtle: laying down next to the person, putting their head on the person's leg, making physical contact with the person or trying to distract the person with a toy.

The closer the human-animal relationship, the greater the response, adds Dr. McFaddin.

On top of that, studies have shown that dogs can read your facial expressions, so they are more in tune with their masters than expected.

It turns out your best friend knows you very well indeed!
