From the Rector

It's October! And at St. Peter's we begin our month with two celebrations of St. Francis, frst the Transitus on October third and then the blessing of the animals on October fifth. When most people think of St. Francis of Assisi, they picture him standing quietly in the garden, forever holding up a stone bird bath. It's almost comical that this saint—whose life was marked by deep faith, radical humility, and fiery devotion—has been reduced to lawn decor. And yet, maybe there is wisdom hidden in that image. For Francis' life was, in many ways, the faithful act of holding up love for others—holding it steady, holding it open—so that they might drink deeply of God's grace and be washed clean in the waters of life.

Francis' story reminds us that Christian faith is not about power, winning, or being right. It is about service. On his deathbed, he asked for the gospel about Jesus washing the disciples' feet to be read aloud. That image—our Lord kneeling, pouring water, and touching the dirt of tired feet—was the image Francis wanted to carry him into eternity. Humility, not victory; service, not domination.

We live in a time when many are more interested in grasping power and enforcing might than in loving neighbor or welcoming stranger; when many are more interested in winning arguments than listening to other's stories; when many are more interested erasing identities than embracing differences. But Francis' life points to another way. What would it look like if, instead of rushing to defend our own positions or to claim the upper hand, we sought to offer water to others—even to those with whom we disagree? What if our first posture was not one of arguing or conquering, but of kneeling and serving? After all, the victory of Christ came through humbling himself unto death.

I know we are living in a politically charged time. And it is difficult to speak on such emotionally charged matters. But I will say this: we need more of Francis' witness in our world. We need more true Christians in this world. For the measure of true Christian faith is humility and service in love. In your own political engagement and reflection--and in all your relationships and life circumstances--remember that. And the next time you see Francis in the garden, holding his little basin for the birds, take it as a holy reminder. That's what Christian faith looks like: to stand ready, to hold out the love of God, and to offer cool water to weary souls. That is the kind of humble faithfulness our world needs today.

St. Peter's welcomes you to St. Nick's Chapel for Children!


At St. Peter's, we have a special worship space run by adult and youth volunteers for children 6 years old and younger called St. Nick's Chapel for Children. You'll see it on the south side of the church—designed just for little ones to experience worship in ways that fit them.

Children are invited to be in the chapel space with our volunteers, who help lead them in worship. Parents/guardians are welcome to sit with their children in the chapel or find a seat elsewhere in the church—whatever works best for your family. The chapel is here to support you! If you decide to sit elsewhere and leave your children in the chapel, we ask that children remain in the chapel space until you pick them up. We will help with that.

If your child needs you for a bathroom break, a diaper change, or just a tough moment, feel free to move through the church as needed. There are bathrooms available in Bender Hall, just down the ramp through the north doors. If you are sitting elsewhere in the church, we'll let you know if you are needed. No worries!

The space is also available during the week between 9:00am and 5:30pm for private prayer and play.

At St. Peter's, children are not only welcome—they belong. This space is one way we show that worship is for all of us, whether it's your first Sunday or your hundredth. We're so glad you're here.



Southern States Bully Rescue is a Florida Non-Profit Incorporation that strives to be a saving grace for 'bully type breeds' throughout the Southern States. Our efforts are based out of the state of Florida but expand to Louisiana, Alabama and Georgia. We are a foster based Rescue, meaning all of our dogs are entrusted to foster families that devote their time to saving and rehabilitating them. Many of the dogs that come through the rescue come from horrific beginnings of abuse and neglect. We are a bully breed rescue so the vast majority of the dogs coming into the rescue are Pit Bull, American Bulldog, Bull Terrier, American Bully, English Bulldog, Staffordshire Terrier or French Bulldog MIXES. Unfortunately along with rescuing the most unwanted breed comes the challenges that make them the unwanted; our rescue differs from others in many ways: a lot of our dogs require professional training to rehabilitate them from their previous lives, at times extensive & life saving medical treatment. Bullies being a highly discriminated breed (we work to change perception on the breed everyday!), we also face challenges and extra precautions when placing our pups; ensuring adopters own their homes, don't have breed regulations and understand the importance of not only being their adopted dog's safety net but because our goal is to build a better reputation for the breed, make sure their adopted dog does nothing but make the breed a better name!

We are a small but mighty organization. Run by primarily three people and a group of dedicated fosters, adopters, donors and volunteers who believe in our mission as much as we do. If trying to reach us, please be patient as we all work full time jobs as well as have dogs of our own in addition to running the rescue.

19th Annual Christmas Meals on Wheels Basket Outreach


It's that time of year again (hard to adjust to how fast time moves by)!

We are in need of the below items:




If possible, unisex items are preferred, but all donations will happily be used.

Provide the name and the consent of the nominee to a member of the Vestry.

Deadline for nominations is: Sunday, December 14, 2025.




