## From the Rector

I've been in the market for a new cassock.

The one I use each morning for prayer is a bit shabby and doesn't quite fit right, so I've been shopping around. I ordered one online, but I sent it back. I didn't like it.

The other day after Morning Prayer I happened to be looking through the closet of the vesting room and noticed a cassock at the very back with a plastic covering over the top of it. I pulled it and out and saw that it was quite beautiful. It was simple with no frills, but it had some great little details to it. I tried it on. It fit almost perfectly; it just needed an ever so slight adjustment. I wondered, "Where did this cassock come from? Whose is it?" It was then that I noticed the tag on the inside seam, "The Rev. Grayson Garvin, 1978." Fr. Garvin was the rector of St. Peter's from 1975-1989 and is responsible for leading the congregation through the expansion of the church with the adding of the transepts, the bell tower, and the organ. He was liturgically strict but wonderfully beloved. He died just a few years ago and his cremains are buried in our Memorial Garden under the altar.

There was something quite moving about taking up Fr. Garvin's cassock. It reminded me of the history of our community, which turned 136 years old this past week. It reminded me of all the clergy and lay people that have come before us, shepherding the mission of this congregation in Plant City and the world. We have inherited quite a history.

It also reminded me that sometimes in our search for something new in the church, we need only to look to our history and make a few contextual adjustments. We are, of course, called to be creative and innovative and courageous as we step out in faith to do things out of our comfort zone. And yet at the same time, we are rooted in over a century of tradition at St. Peter's and an ancient faith in Christianity. Sometimes what is innovative is simply applying the wisdom of the past to the context of the present. Like making a few adjustments to a cassock.

We are experiencing an exciting new chapter at St. Peter's: an increase in attendance and energy, new opportunities for community partnerships, an emerging vision for the future. I wonder what wisdom from our past experiences in this parish and in our ancient tradition speak to the moment we are living. I wonder what cassocks are simply sitting in the back of the closet, ready for us to take up again. Do you have any ideas?

#### **PathFinders**

Pathfinders is our adult Sunday school class, which gathers each Sunday from 9:15 to 10:15 a.m. in Bender Hall for classes on Scripture, faith, theology, and living as Christians in the world. Parents/ guardians are welcome to sit with their children in the chapel or find a seat elsewhere in the church—whatever works best for your family. The chapel is here to support you! If you decide to sit elsewhere and leave your children in the chapel, we ask that children remain in the chapel space until you pick them up. We will help with that.

If your child needs you for a bathroom break, a diaper change, or just a tough moment, feel free to move through the church as needed. There are bathrooms available in Bender Hall, just down the ramp through the north doors. If you are sitting elsewhere in the church, we'll let you know if you are needed. No worries!

The space is also available during the week between 9:00am and 5:30pm for private prayer and play.

At St. Peter's, children are not only welcome—they belong. This space is one way we show that worship is for all of us, whether it's your first Sunday or your hundredth. We're so glad you're here.

# A New Partnership-Plant City Homeschool Collective

I am excited to share with you that St. Peter's has entered a new partnership with Plant City Homeschool Collective, a new community of homeschool families in our area. Beginning in September, they will be leasing Bender Hall from us Monday-Wednesday during business hours (9:00am-3:00pm) to offer classes, activities, and community for families with children.

Why this is Exciting News

At St. Peter's, we "celebrate children and youth", as our mission statement affirms. When we say we celebrate children and youth, we don't just mean our own, but all children and youth! By making our campus available to local families, we are providing more opportunities for children and youth to be loved and cared for as they grow into maturity, and we celebrate the gift they bring to this world.

In addition to our emphasis on young people, our vestry has been discerning a call to become more of an active and influential member of Plant City and the wider community. We want people to know about us because of the work we are doing in the community! By opening up our campus to local families, we are fostering deeper relationships with our neighbors and planting seeds for future partnerships that will impact our community for the better.

Finally, we want our beautiful campus to be filled with life, joy, and energy throughout the week, rather than lying quietly dormant between Sundays and Wednesday evenings. This partnership allows our campus to be a blessing to others throughout the week in the spirit of the ancient Benedictine ministry of hospitality. Churches should be not only the place for worship, but the center of community life as they often were in other times and places.

I'm calling this relationship a partnership rather than using landlord-tenant language for a few reasons. First, the physical space we offer will be shared space, and as such it will take the support of both our communities to steward it well for our mutual benefit.

Second, the mission of St. Peter's and the mission of Plant City Homeschool Collective are both centered on the building of community and we have been strategizing how we can do this work together. For example, our parish is full of educators, active and retired, and there are opportunities to offer your passion and experience by leading an activity or class or experience. Please reach out if you are interested. I hope to lead some offerings on faith myself!

Third, like us, Plant City Homeschool Collective is interested in outreach and service for the community. They hope to instill in their children the importance of caring for those in need and they have expressed interest and openness to working with us on various projects of community service.

Bender Hall will be in use Monday-Wednesday from 9:00am-3:00pm by Plant City Homeschool Collective. This includes the main parish hall, the kitchen, the playground, and the nursery. It does not include the choir room, the altar guild room, the Godly Play room, the church, or the office.

Please refrain from entering the main parish hall, kitchen, nursery, and playground on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays from 9:00am-3:00pm.

Midweek Bible Study and Commission meetings will continue to take place at their regularly scheduled days and times in the altar guild room.

The church will remain open weekdays for prayer.

When using Bender Hall, please clean up after every event to ensure the space is prepared for the Homeschool Coop.

Please keep the work of the Plant City Homeschool Collective in your prayers as one of our close partners.

Please be welcoming and friendly to our new friends, especially when you see them on campus or when they join us for worship!

Please also know that our lease with the Plant City Homeschool Collective is carefully detailed about how the space will be used to ensure the campus is honored and does not negatively impact our regular ministries. As this is a new community and we are new to sharing our campus, this lease is currently month-to-month through December as we try things out.




