The celebrant stands in the doorway between the hallway and parish hall.

Celebrant

Behold, I stand at the door and knock, says the Lord. If you hear my voice and open the door, I will come into the house, and eat with you, and you with me.

R. **From this time forth for evermore.**

Let us pray (*Silence*)

Sovereign Lord, you are Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end. You have walked with your people day by day for more than a century in this place and in this community. We give you thanks for the ministry of Colonel Whitney and all those who have offered themselves to the ministry of this parish. Bless the saints of St. Peter's, those living and those who have gone on before, that our shared ministry may bring glory to your name and comfort to this world.

Bless this hallway, that it may be a reminder to us that the Church is your people, and your people are the Church, and may all those who pass through it find grace and peace in the blessed communion that you are creating before us and among us, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The celebrant asperges the hallway as the congregation processes into the church with the singing of a hymn.

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.

Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

The First Lesson: Leviticus 26:9-13 *(Please be seated)*

I will look with favour upon you and make you fruitful and multiply you; and I will maintain my covenant with you. You shall eat old grain long stored, and you shall have to clear out the old to make way for the new. I will place my dwelling in your midst, and I shall not abhor you. And I will walk among you, and will be your God, and you shall be my people. I am the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, to be their slaves no more; I have broken the bars of your yoke and made you walk erect.

Lector The Word of the Lord.

The Psalter: Psalm 100 (*people respond singing bold text*)

1 Be joyful in the Lord, all you lands; *

The Second Lesson: 1 Corinthians 12:12-27

Just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot would say, “Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body,” that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear would say, “Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body,” that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many members, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, “I have no need of you,” nor again the head to the feet, “I have no need of you.” On the contrary the members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and those members of the body that we think less honorable

we clothe with greater honor, and our less respectable members are treated with greater respect; whereas our more respectable members do not need this. But God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honor to the inferior member, that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it. Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it.

The Nicene Creed *(standing)*

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father [and the Son]. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the ☩ resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Give them strength and grace to continue your mighty work.

We pray for this community of Plant City and for our neighbors who live with hunger, are without shelter or clothing, and for those who are alone. Comfort those who are in need,

And guide us to continue to reach out to them in ways that you have taught us.

Heal the sick, Lord and comfort the weary and grieving. Especially those we now name: *(Pause)* Renew their strength.

And guide them with Your light and peace.

We pray for those who have departed this life, especially Ken Holtane, and remember their contribution to the world around them. *(Pause)* Grant them eternal rest.

Let light perpetual continue to shine upon them.

We thank you for all the blessings of this life, that we may continually declare how much God has done for us.

God provides goodness and blessings.

Lord, we honor the legacy of faith that built this church, and Your love that has sustained it for 50,000 days. We offer gratitude for countless children, adults, parents, and grandparents who have been part of your St. Peter's family. Guide future generations who will worship in this church and serve our community.

With thanksgiving for the past, joy in the present, and with hope for the future, we celebrate this anniversary.

Empower us in our various vocations as members of St. Peter's to continue the good works started by those who have gone before us, staying steadfast in our service to You and reaching out to others with love and kindness.

Holy Spirit empower us.

In the beginning,

God was.

Here and now,

God is.

In the future,

God will be.

Celebrant It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, through Jesus Christ our great High Priest; in whom we are built up as living stones of a holy temple, that we might offer before you a sacrifice of praise and prayer which is holy and pleasing in your sight. Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, “Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.” ✠

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." ✠

✠ Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN.**

Celebrant ✠ The Gifts of God for the People of God.

You are invited to receive communion this morning, an ancient practice intended for all baptized Christians, no matter your tradition. You may receive just the bread (which is full participation in the sacrament), or both the bread and the wine by sipping directly from the chalice. You may also receive by intinction, in which case the minister will dip the bread in the chalice for you. You may receive the bread in your hand or on your tongue.

Gluten-free wafers are available; please make your need known to the minister. If you would prefer not to receive communion, you may also come forward and cross your arms over your chest for a blessing.
