## *Regular Opportunities for Prayer and Worship*

### **Holy Eucharist (Mass)**

**Sundays at 8:00am and 10:30am**

Holy Eucharist is the principle service of community worship at St. Peter's. In Catholic circles it is called, Mass; in Protestant circles it is called Holy Communion or the Lord's Supper. Our Sunday Eucharist at 8:00am is a quiet, spoken service with no music and uses Elizabethan English. Our Sunday Eucharist at 10:30am includes hymns, anthems, and a choir. Note: there will be a single, combined mass on January 18, 2026 at 9:45am for our patronal feast day and annual meeting.

### **Family Eucharist (Mass)**

**Last Sunday of the Month at 10:30am**

Every last Sunday of the month is Family Sunday at St. Peter's, our most attended service of the month. Our 10:30am Eucharist is adapted to be especially inclusive of younger members, and the service includes a children's homily.

### **Morning and Evening Prayer**

**Weekdays at 8:00am & 5:15pm**

Every weekday at St. Peter's we observe Morning Prayer (Matins) and Evening Prayer (Vespers), a beautiful tradition from *The Book of Common Prayer*. The liturgies includes readings from Scripture, a Psalm, appointed prayers, as well as moments of silence and opportunities for personal prayer. We will offer an instructed Morning Prayer and instructed Evening Prayer to explain the liturgy on Tuesday, February 3rd.

**Evensong-** Each Wednesday Evening Prayer will be sung with hymns.

### **Major Feast Days (Mass)**

**Various Weekdays at 8:00am**

On Major Feast Days (special celebrations of the church), in place of Morning Prayer will be a service of Holy Eucharist (mass) at 8:00am. Upcoming Major Feast Days include: The Presentation of Our Lord (Feb 2), Ash Wednesday (Feb 18), St. Matthias (Feb 24), St. Joseph (March 19), the Annunciation of Our Lord (March 25), St. Mark the Evangelist (Apr. 24, Trans.), St. Philip and St. James (May 1), and the Ascension of Our Lord (May 14).

### **Centering Prayer**

**Weekdays at 7:30am**

Centering Prayer is a form of silent Christian meditation in which we let go of our reflections and thoughts in order to rest in the presence of God. You can ask Fr. Derek for more information about the method, or simply come and pray in silence.

### **Private Prayer in the Church**

**Weekdays from 7:30am-5:30pm**

The Church is open for private prayer every weekday. Whether you have a few moments before a doctor's appointment, are passing by on your way to the store, or need some quiet time away from the kids, the church is open for you.

# *Special Opportunities for Prayer and Worship*

---

## **Feast of the Epiphany**

**Monday, January 5, 2026 at 5:30pm**

Join us on the Twelfth Night of Christmas for a Family Mass celebration of the Feast of the Epiphany. The service begins outside the church with a procession around the block before bringing the wisemen into the creche. It ends with the traditional chalking of the doors as a blessing over the church in the new year.

## **Burning of the Palms**

**Tuesday, February 17, 2026 at 7:00pm**

This short, informal prayer service takes place outside around a fire pit where the palms from last year's Palm Sunday are burned into ash to be used at the following day's Ash Wednesday services. It takes place after the celebration of Shrove Tuesday, the last "hurrah" before the more solemn season of Lent begins.

## **Ash Wednesday**

**Wednesday, February 18, 2026**

The services on Ash Wednesday are Holy Eucharists and feature the imposition of ashes, a liturgy in which congregants come forward to have a small amount of ash put on their foreheads in the shape of a cross. The congregants are then invited to observe a holy Lent with prayer, fasting, and self-denial. This is the kickoff to the whole Lenten season. At St. Peter's, there will be three services to choose from: a spoken mass at 8:00am, a sung mass with music at 12:15pm, and a sung mass with music at 7:00pm.

## **Confession**

**Wednesdays at 4:45pm or by Appointment**

The Sacrament of Reconciliation, also called Confession, is an important liturgy in *The Book of Common Prayer* (pg. 446). While more common in the Roman Catholic Church, Episcopalians also practice confession, often with the guiding phrase, "All may, none must, some should." The liturgy is a simple one. The confessor voices before the priest any sins that might weigh heavy on the heart and the priest offers some brief guidance and the absolution and assurance of God's forgiveness. It is a vulnerable, yet liberating sacrament that draws us closer to the love of God. Anything discussed remains strictly in confidence (unless it involves abuse to self or others). Fr. Derek will be in the church from 4:45pm-5:15pm before Evensong. Please enter quietly. If a confession is in progress, please wait outside.

## **Adoration with the Blessed Sacrament**

**Weekdays at 7:30am**

Gather at 7:30am for 30 minutes of silence in the Corpus Christi Chapel before Morning Prayer, with the consecrated bread and wine present for quiet reflection. As Episcopalians, we believe in the real presence of Jesus in the consecrated bread and wine. Come spend some time with Jesus.

## *in Holy Week*

### **Palm Sunday**

**Sunday, March 29, 2026 at 8:00am and 10:30am**

Palm Sunday is the Sunday before Easter and the beginning of Holy Week. It is also called Passion Sunday and commemorates both the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem before his crucifixion and the crucifixion itself. The service begins outside with palm branches being distributed to all. We then process into the church. In place of a homily, there is a dramatic reading of the crucifixion.

### **The Night Watch**

**Thursday, April 2, 2026**

On the night before Jesus was arrested and crucified, he prayed through the night at the Garden of Gethsemane with his disciples, who struggled with staying awake. "Could you not keep watch with me for one hour?" Jesus asked them. In observance of Jesus' vigil, we invite you to sign up to pray for one hour (or more) in the church through the night.



### **Maundy Thursday**

**Thursday, April 2, 2026 at 7:00pm**

Maundy Thursday is one of the most beautiful and dramatic liturgies of the Church year. It is the first part of the Triduum, a single liturgical service spread across three days. It commemorates Jesus' last supper with his disciples before his crucifixion. The service is a Eucharist and features a foot washing ceremony in which the congregation is invited to come forward to symbolically wash one another's feet, an optional, but powerful action of humility that follows Jesus' example. The end of the service includes the stripping of the altar, when members of the altar guild slowly and reverently remove or cover all ornamentation in the church to prepare for the darkness of Good Friday. There is no final blessing or dismissal, as the service will continue the next day on Good Friday. The people exit in silent darkness. A community meal proceeds the mass.

### **Good Friday**

**Friday, April 3, 2026 at 12:15pm and 7:00pm**

The Good Friday liturgy is the second part of the sacred Triduum. There is no Eucharist at this service. Instead, solemn collects (thematic prayers) are read and a wooden cross is brought into the church for special prayers in remembrance of the crucifixion. Again, there is no final blessing or dismissal as the service continues the following day with the Great Vigil. At St. Peter's we offer this liturgy twice, once at the traditional hour of the crucifixion (12:15pm), and once in the evening at 7:00pm.

### **The Great Vigil of Easter**

**Saturday, April 4, 2026 at 8:00pm**


This is the third and final part of the sacred Triduum and the climax of the entire Church year. It is the most dramatic, most important, most ancient service of the year and the first celebration of Easter. It begins outside just after sunset with the lighting of a new fire. The paschal candle is then lit and leads a procession into a dark church where the Exsultet is sung and Scripture readings outlining the whole of salvation history are offered. Then there are baptisms or the renewal of baptismal vows followed by the acclamation of Easter Alleluia with the ringing and clanging of bells, hymn singing, and the first mass of Easter. The service lasts about two hours.





## *More Special Opportunities for Prayer and Worship*

### **Easter Day** **Sunday, April 5, 2026**

Easter Day is a joyful celebration of the resurrection of Christ and our most attended services of the year. People love to dress up in their spring best for these Eucharists. They take place at our regular times of 8:00am (spoken) and 10:30am (sung w/ music). Both masses include the flowering of the cross and congregants are invited to bring flowers with them and come forward to participate in the observance. The music is always particularly special. All are welcome for Easter and all our services. Bring some friends! 

### **Pentecost Sunday** **Sunday, May 24, 2026**

The 50-day season of Easter comes to a close with Pentecost Sunday on which we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit and the ministry of the Church. The mass will include baptisms and/or the renewal of baptismal vows. It is traditional to wear red on this day.

### ***Diocesan Prayer and Worship***

#### **Absalom Jones** **Saturday, February 7, 2026 at 10:00am**

Join the Diocese of Southwest Florida and the Cathedral of St. Peter for the celebration of the Feast of Absalom Jones, the first black priest in the Episcopal Church. The day begins at 10:00am with a workshop presentation by Dr. Kathy Hood Culmer, author, professional storyteller, and Christian educator, and concludes with Holy Eucharist and reception at 2:45pm.

#### **Good Friday Cross Walk** **Friday, April 3, 2026**

Join Holy Innocents' Episcopal Church in Valrico on Good Friday morning for their annual Cross Walk down State Road 60, symbolizing Jesus' journey to the Cross. Led by the Holy Innocents' youth group but open to all, this walk is a time of prayer and reflection.

#### **Ecumenical Good Friday Stations of the Cross** **Friday, April 3, 2026**

Join Bishop Scharf, the Church of the Redeemer, and 100 other congregations from various Christian denominations for the annual Stations of the Cross through three-quarters of a mile of downtown Sarasota beginning at 7:00am and ending with Morning Prayer at Church of the Redeemer at 8:30am.



## *Regular Opportunities for Community Gathering*

### **Coffee Hour**

**Sundays at 9:00am**

Every Sunday at 9:00am our community gathers for coffee and refreshments in Bender Hall. For those that choose to attend, Sunday School begins at 9:15am. Others are welcome to continue socializing just outside the hall. Donations to offset the cost of coffee and refreshments are always welcome.

### **Engage Cafe**

**Wednesdays at 5:30pm**

### **50,000 Day Celebration**

**Sunday, July 19, 2026**

On August 26, 1889, after a season of dreaming, discernment, and prayer, the Episcopal Church acquired property in Plant City, Florida, to establish its first parish in the city. Under the leadership of the Rev. John Henry Weddell and Dr. Olin S. Wright, the fledgling community celebrated its first baptism less than a year later. In those early years, the mission of St. Peter's gathered in the local schoolhouse until the church building was completed in 1908. For more than 136 years, the people of St. Peter's have loved and cared for Plant City as the Body of Christ—day by day, making ordinary life an act of ministry.

On July 19, 2026, we will mark the 50,000th day since that first dream began to take shape.
