Charles Washington's estate, Happy Retreat, was erected in 1780. In 1786, on 80 acres of his adjoining land, Charles laid out the streets of Charles Town, naming many of them after his brothers and one after his wife, Mildred. He donated the four corner lots at the intersection of George and Washington Streets for public buildings of the town and county. We will visit historical places and enjoy beautiful Autumn colors in and around the stunning Shenandoah Valley area. Watch your email for registration soon!

There was zero visibility and high heat conditions without fire hose support. They located the individual and evacuated the person from the building. For their efforts that day, they were awarded The Sons of the American Revolution Heroism Award. John said that the highlight of all of this volunteer committee work occurred one day after a presentation when a young wife of an award recipient approached me and said, "Thank you, I had no idea that organizations like this even existed".
