#### Notes from the Interim Pastor...

Greetings from your new Interim Pastor,

I am Pastor Peter Coen-Tuff and am delighted to join all of you during this time of transition. My first day in the parish will be July 8<sup>th</sup> and am looking forward to getting to know the good members of the Dennison-Vang parish.

A little bit about me as we get started: I grew up in Breckenridge, in Northwestern Minnesota, however I have spent all my pastoral ministry in North Dakota. I am a graduate of Concordia College in Moorhead, Minnesota and Wartburg Theological Seminary in Dubuque, Iowa. During my college years, I spent summers working at Lutheran Bible camps and that is where I met my wife, Karla. We both felt called to pastoral ministry and decided to go to seminary together.
