- > For appointment in a Prescribed Position under the *Child Safety (Prohibited Persons) Act (2016)*, a current Working with Children Check (WWCC) is required from the Department for Human Services Screening Unit. For other positions, a satisfactory National Police Certificate (NPC) assessment is required.
- > For 'Prescribed Positions' under the *Child Safety (Prohibited Persons) Act (2016)*, the individual's WWCCs must be renewed every 5 years from the date of issue; and for 'Approved Aged Care Provider Positions' every 3 years from date of issue as required by the *Accountability Principles 2014* issued pursuant to the *Aged Care Act 1997 (Cth)*.
- > Appointment is subject to immunisation risk category requirements. There may be ongoing immunisation requirements that must be met.
- > Depending on work requirements the incumbent may be transferred to other locations across SA Health to perform work appropriate to classification, skills, and capabilities either on a permanent or temporary basis subject to relevant provisions of the *Public Sector Act 2009* for Public Sector employees or the *SA Health (Health Care Act) Human Resources Manual* for Health Care Act employees.
- > The incumbent may be required to participate in Counter Disaster activities including attendance, as required, at training programs and exercises to develop the necessary skills required to participate in responses in the event of a disaster and/or major incident.

### SA Health Challenges:

The health system is facing the challenges of an ageing population, increased incidence of chronic disease, workforce shortages, and ageing infrastructure. The SA Health Care Plan has been developed to meet these challenges and ensure South Australian's have access to the best available health care in hospitals, health care centres and through GPs and other providers.

### Health Network/ Division/ Department:

The Procurement and Supply Chain Management service performs both a state-wide strategic leadership and operational role in sourcing, contract management, commercial advice, supply chain and logistics and fleet management to support the delivery of public health services in South Australia. - > Managing the procurement, storage, replenishment, and distribution of items to public hospitals, dental clinics, pathology laboratories, ambulance stations and primary health care centres.
- > Undertaking an emergency management role in supply chain and logistics.
- > Managing SA Health's fleet of vehicles.
- > Leading and participating in cross Agency and cross-jurisdictional initiatives.

Procurement and Supply Chain Management supports the operations of the Product Standardisation Committee by providing executive office services, liaising with internal and external stakeholders in relation to product standardisation and undertaking primary evaluation of proposals and written reports for the Committee on new products and product standardisation initiatives.
