As the curtain comes down on the dramatic 9½ year run that has been Pastor Chip and Melinda Hatcher's ministry at Westminster, I couldn't help but think about my beginning as pastor here at Westminster. I went back and looked at my first sermon delivered on March 13, 2016. As a part of the sermon I asked the choir to sing the chorus of "Getting to Know You" from *The King and I* by Rodgers and Hammerstein. I preached that day on the Gospel Reading, John 12:1-8, the story of Mary (Lazarus & Martha's sister) who poured out a lavish offering of perfume onto Jesus' feet, which she then dried off with her hair. It's a dramatic portrait of her love for Jesus, literally being poured out. Today, as a way of expressing my gratitude to you for allowing me to serve the Lord among you at Westminster, I want to share the closing words of that first sermon as I write my last newsletter offering:

(With her extravagant offering of herself) "...Mary gave all that she had as her response to God's life-saving love. She gave all that she had in her adoration of Jesus. She had seen the Lord at work! She cherished his friendship. She knew she could trust him. Jesus had raised her brother from the dead. How could she respond to Jesus half-heartedly!

Yes, her gift of perfume was wastefully extravagant! It was lavish! But Mary did not see it that way. Her "over-the-top" gift was her way of expressing her "over-the-top" adoration and devotion for Jesus. And gospel-writer John tells us that the whole house was filled with the fragrance of her offering. The effect of her offering lingered. We marvel over it even today.

As I continue getting to know you in the days, weeks & months ahead, I pray that you and I will be known for such acts of devotion and love as Mary mirrors for us today. I pray that my service to you as pastor will reflect this kind of sacrificial offering. I pray that your service as members of this church will reflect this kind of lavish, over-the-top adoration and thanksgiving. I pray that people who come into this place of worship and service will be knocked over by the love for Christ that they witness in you and in me and in us together.

Because it truly is Christ's love that brings us here. It is our Savior's dying love for us on the cross, and the Father's wondrous power in the resurrection that is the whole reason for our being as the church. We have seen the Lord at work! You and I cherish his friendship and the friendships in Christ that we share with one another. We want others to know and to share that relationship, getting to know him and to take part in the new thing that is springing forth at Westminster! How can we respond to the Lord with anything other than whole-hearted devotion and love? (In the days ahead) let us think about how we might live out our complete devotion to Jesus. May our acts of love be known and seen and experienced. And as we do so, may this house, and indeed our whole community, be filled with the fragrance of our offerings.

With the fragrance from our common offerings lingering in the air, Melinda and I move back to Mississippi trusting that the same kind of devotion and love for Christ that we have witnessed over the past 9½ years will continue to be seen and felt and experienced in Hot Springs as you continue to serve the Lord as the infinitely marvelous collection of saints and sinners that you are at WPC. We are so glad that we "got to know you!" Please know that you always have our undying love and devotion.




Memphis has been
