

Together for the Upper Valley

This year, a record number of Upper Valley neighbors turned to LISTEN for help. Rising costs for basic needs left many families facing financial hardship. Nearly one-third of those we served were children, almost one in ten were seniors, and more than **2,600 people came to LISTEN for the first time** seeking support.

Because of our community's generosity, help was there.

Together we served
9,050
neighbors across New Hampshire and Vermont.

That's **673 more neighbors than last year**, receiving food, housing and heating assistance, service coordination, and other essential resources that help people regain stability and move forward.

As needs continued to grow, so did our response. Compared to last year, service coordination **increased by 44%**, heating and electric assistance **rose 24%**, meals served at our Dining Hall **grew 24%**, housing assistance **increased 8%**, and Food Pantry visits **climbed 6%**.

She especially values that we provide all of our services free of charge and address so many essential needs. For Betsy, volunteering is also deeply rewarding. "LISTEN gives me the opportunity to feel like I am fully participating in the community, sharing what I have to benefit others," she says. "I get so much satisfaction from my time here."

MORE THAN THRIFT STORES

Turning Generosity into Impact

LISTEN's three Thrift Stores in Lebanon, Canaan, and White River Junction are powered by an incredible team of staff and volunteers who make affordable shopping, environmental sustainability, and community impact possible every day. Over the past year, **volunteers contributed nearly 14,850 hours** to help sort donations and create welcoming stores for shoppers.

This year, we **expanded our selection of \$1 items**, making everyday essentials even more affordable while giving donated items another opportunity to find a home. Our growing book departments also had a remarkable year, with more than **134,800 books purchased** by readers across the Upper Valley. Every sale supported LISTEN's mission.

This year, **420,000 pounds of unsellable textiles were recycled, and 144,300 pounds of books were redirected to secondary uses**, such as nursing homes, helping extend the life of donated materials while reducing waste.

Thrift Store revenue generates approximately 13% of the funding that supports LISTEN's programs, including food assistance, housing support, heating help, and service coordination. When you donate, shop, or volunteer at LISTEN, you're doing more than supporting a thrift store - you are helping build a stronger, more compassionate Upper Valley.

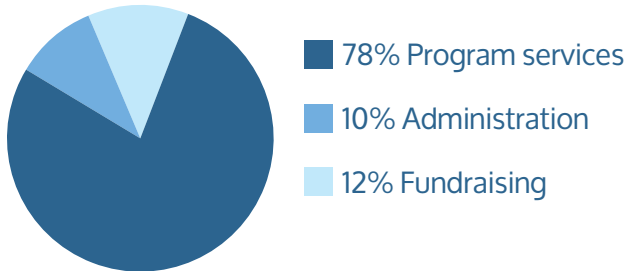
ADVOCACY IN ACTION

When Martha's federal food assistance through SNAP expired, she found herself navigating renewal paperwork and waiting weeks for her application to be processed while raising her two grandchildren on a fixed income. Unable to afford the gap in benefits, she turned to LISTEN's Food Pantry and Community Dining Hall to make sure her family had enough to eat. A LISTEN Service Coordinator helped her complete the paperwork, advocated on her behalf, and stayed with her through the process until her benefits were reinstated.

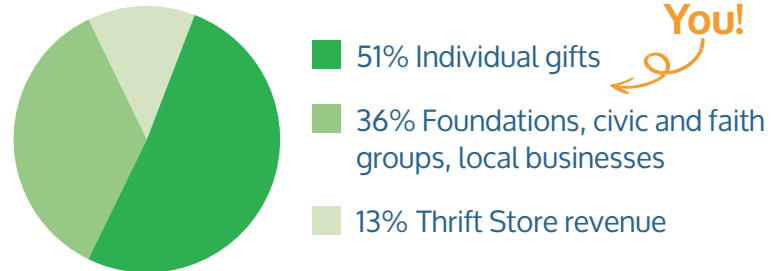
