For many centuries, Catholics and some Christians of other denominations have prayed the Via Crucis or "Way of the Cross," especially during Lent, traditionally with fourteen stations. A more recent tradition is to pray a Via Lucis or "Way of Light," especially during the Easter Season. It also has fourteen stations, which commemorate the resurrection of Jesus, the appearances of the Risen Lord, and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (which ends the 50-day liturgical season of Easter). In contrast to the traditional "Stations of the Cross," only nine of which are directly biblical, all of the "Stations of the Resurrection" are scripturally based.
