Things we like about [Name]

This section should be a proud list of young person's achievements and attributes Use the "What I like about myself" and "What others like about me" worksheets to create this section.

Make it clear and keep it positive.

Aspirations

This section should contain a list of the hope, dreams and ambitions of the young person (YP). You could use the "Hopes Dreams and Aspirations" worksheet to complete this. This section should then be used to set the YP's outcomes within the EHCP document. See the "Aspirations & Outcomes" guidance sheet for more information.

What's Important to [Name]

- This section needs to have enough detail so that someone who does not know the YP could understand what matters to them
- Include things about all areas of the YP's life, school/college, hobbies, interests, passions. It is really important for people to know and understand what motivates them
- This section should have enough detail that if you took the name and photo off the profile, someone who knows the person could easily identify them
- You could use the "My thoughts about Me",
 "My Thoughts about School", "My Thought
 about My Favourite things" and
 "Important" worksheets to help you think

How to Support [Name]

- This section should include information on specific issues the young person needs support with. What others can do to help them be more comfortable in their surroundings, be more positive and productive
- This should include the type of language to use and what support the YP needs to speak and listen
- This should also include sensory difficulties and how those needs affect them and what to do to support them
- Include what learning support needs the YP has and what resources they may need to help them
- You could use the "Good Day/Bad Day", "My
 Thoughts about School", "My thought's about
 Me", "Working/Not Working", "Important",
 "My Thoughts about My Sensory Difficulties",
 and "My Thought about My Social Skills"
 worksheets to help you complete this section

Next Steps - How you can use the One Page Profile

When you are happy with your completed Profile document you can share it with the school/college, after-school clubs, and any other services that support your YP.

You could also place the worksheets you used in a folder with the profile to create a SEN Support document which can be shared at review meetings and used to chart the YP's progress.
