In today's Gospel, Jesus preaches – with authority – and he heals.


The second aspect, the healing, shows us that Christ's preaching is intended to defeat the evil present in humankind and the world.

Year of Prayer

in his Angelus address from the window of the Vatican on January 21, 2024.


This Year of Prayer is to prepare for the 2025 Jubilee.

The Pope said that this *Year of Prayer* (which started on January 21) will be "a year dedicated to rediscovering the great value and absolute need for prayer in one's personal life, in the life of the Church, and in the world." This is all in preparation for the 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope - the first ordinary jubilee since the Great Jubilee of 2000.

A jubilee is a special holy year of grace and pilgrimage in the Catholic Church. It typically takes place once every 25 years, though the Pope can call for extraordinary jubilee years more often, such as in the case of the 2013 Year of Faith or the 2016 Year of Mercy.

The 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope will begin on December 24, 2024 (Christmas Eve), and conclude on January 6, 2026. Let us begin to pray!

Pray the Lord's Prayer Attempt to imitate the practice of the early Church: pray the Lord's Prayer three times a day – in the morning, at noon, and in the evening. Try to do this every day.






