☐ <b>To seek opportunities for encounter,</b> so as to grow in deeper understanding and communion that leads to an authentic solidarity with those in need.
☐ <b>To consider what it means to be a good neighbor</b> and how I am called to reflect the love and hope of Christ to others.
☐ <b>To encourage civic dialogue</b> that places the human person and the sanctity of families at the center of policymaking, especially toward the end of meaningful immigration reform.
☐ <b>To join with Pope Leo in praying</b> for all migrants and refugees as fellow travelers on the journey to our true homeland.


