Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

November 9, 2025



The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica holds great significance in the Catholic Church.

As the Cathodral Church of Rome, the Lateran Basilica is considered the Mother Church of all churches worldwide.

The liturgical events and ceremonies conducted annually on this day highlight the importance of the Lateran Basilica in the liturgical calendar. (The St. John Lateran Basilica gets its name from two sources – the "Lateran" part comes from the Laterani family who owned the land, while the "St. John" part refers to the later dedication of the basilica to two saints: St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist. The basilica was originally dedicated to Christ the Savior, but over time, dedications to the two St. Johns were added, eventually leading to the common name.)

Pope Leo XIV formally took possession of the St. John Lateran Basilica as the Bishop of Rome on May 25, 2025, symbolically claiming his cathedral seat from which he governs both the Diocese of Rome and the universal Church. He celebrated a Mass there, emphasized his role as the bishop of Rome, and pledged to continue the synodal path of listening and



accompaniment for the Church in Rome. This installation is a significant part of the papal succession and a formal acknowledgment of his position as the bishop of Rome.

At the beginning of his homily, after greeting the cardinals, bishops, the "dear priests," and the beloved faithful, the Pontiff emphasized that "Rome is the heir to a great history, grounded in the witness of Peter, of Paul, and of countless martyrs, and it has a unique mission, perfectly expressed by what is written on the façade of this cathedral: to be Mater omnium Ecclesiarum, the Mother of all Churches."

He then quoted Pope Francis, who often "invited us to reflect on the maternal dimension of the Church and on its defining traits: tenderness, readiness for sacrifice, and that capacity for listening which not only makes it possible to help, but often to anticipate needs and expectations before they are even expressed. These are qualities we hope will continue to grow within the People of God everywhere — and here as well, in our great diocesan family: among the faithful, among the pastors, and, above all, within myself," affirmed Pope Leo XIV.

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

Thank you for the wonderful celebration at my installation as pastor last Sunday. Bishop Hicks preached beautifully on remembering everyone on All Souls Day. We remember all those who have died and, in our time, we remember all the living, especially those living here alongside of us, and those who need special care and attention: the elderly, our children and youth, those struggling to provide food and shelter for their families. Thank you to the people of God at St. Patrick Parish for all that we do to remember everyone.

Our school building was constructed in 1913. The boiler in the building is from the early 1990s, so it is over 30 years old. The boiler is leaking water. We attempted a temporary fix of the leak with chemical sealant, but that did not work. Replacement of the boiler is estimated to cost between \$100,000 and \$150,000. A recent analysis of our buildings and grounds by an architectural engineer hired by the Diocese of Joliet proposes numerous improvements of the parish and school buildings over the next ten years. The Parish Council recommends that we do not invest more financial resources in the school building. This means that we need to shut down the building and winterize it, so that the water pipes do not burst with freezing over the winter.

We have decided to have the Religious Education Program use space in the rectory for the remainder of this school year. Thanks to Eileen Kregor and her team for understanding the situation and working with us to best accommodate our students. We also hope to make the Shamrock Room more suitable for parish gatherings like donut Sunday, by storing the couches and putting in another table or two to accommodate more people.

The Parish Council Chair, Michael Spilsbury, and I are also in the process of forming a committee to review the Parish Assessment done by the architectural engineer. That committee will evaluate our current situation, consider the needs of parish groups for our ministries, and make recommendations for how we can best proceed.

I did not want to deal with building issues in my first year as pastor, but this is the need at this time. Know that I will continue to communicate with you as we move forward. If you have questions or ideas, please share them with me or with members of the Parish Council.

FROM THE PASTOR

Queridos amigos en Cristo,

Gracias por la maravillosa celebración en mi instalación como pastor el domingo pasado. El obispo Hicks hizo una bella homilía sobre recordar a todos en el Día de los Fieles Difuntos. Recordamos a todos los que han muerto y, en nuestro tiempo, recordamos a todos los vivos, especialmente a los que viven aquí junto a nosotros, y a los que necesitan cuidados y atención especiales: los ancianos, nuestros niños y jóvenes, los que luchan por proporcionar comida y refugio a sus familias. Gracias al pueblo de Dios en la Parroquia de San Patricio por todo lo que hacemos para recordar a todos.

El edificio de nuestra escuela fue construido en 1913. La caldera del edificio es de principios de la década de 1990, por lo que tiene más de 30 años. La caldera tiene fugas de agua. Intentamos una reparación temporal de la fuga con sellador químico, pero eso no funcionó. Se estima que el reemplazo de la caldera costará entre \$ 100,000 y \$ 150,000. Un análisis reciente de nuestros edificios y terrenos realizado por un ingeniero arquitectónico contratado por la Diócesis de Joliet propone numerosas mejoras de los edificios parroquiales y escolares durante los próximos diez años. El Consejo Parroquial recomienda que no invirtamos más recursos financieros en el edificio de la escuela. Esto significa que debemos cerrar el edificio y prepararlo para el invierno, para que las tuberías de agua no estallen con la congelación durante el invierno.

Hemos decidido que el Programa de Educación Religiosa use espacio en la rectoría durante el resto de este año escolar. Gracias a Eileen Kregor y su equipo por comprender la situación y trabajar con nosotros para acomodar mejor a nuestros estudiantes. También esperamos hacer que el Shamrock Room sea más adecuado para reuniones parroquiales como el domingo de donas, almacenando los sofás y colocando otra mesa o dos para acomodar a más personas.

El presidente del Consejo Parroquial, Michael Spilsbury, y yo también estamos en el proceso de formar un comité para revisar la evaluación parroquial realizada por el ingeniero arquitectónico. Ese comité evaluará nuestra situación actual, considerará las necesidades de los grupos parroquiales para nuestros ministerios y hará recomendaciones sobre cómo podemos proceder mejor.

No quería lidiar con problemas de construcción en mi primer año como pastor, pero esta es la necesidad en este momento. Sepa que continuaré comunicándome con usted a medida que avancemos. Si tiene preguntas o ideas, compártalas conmigo o con los miembros del Consejo Parroquial.


