

Lessons Learned from the Woman Caught in Adultery

As for the application of this Gospel passage, it carries several important lessons.

Firstly, it reminds us of the importance of compassion and forgiveness.

Jesus, though fully aware of the woman's sin,
does not condemn her, but offers her a fresh start.

This teaches us the power of redemption
and the need to extend forgiveness to those who have fallen.

Secondly, it emphasizes the need for self-reflection and humility.

Jesus challenges the accusers to examine their own hearts before passing judgment, reminding us that none of us are without sin.

This calls us to approach situations with a spirit of humility and self-awareness.

Lastly, this passage invites us to move beyond legalism and to embrace a spirit of grace.

The religious leaders were focused on strict adherence to the law,
but Jesus demonstrates that true righteousness goes beyond mere legal requirements.
He emphasizes – to all of us – the importance of personal transformation
and a commitment to living a life free from sin.

In today's Gospel, the Scribes and Pharisees want to a stone a woman to death because of her past. In their eyes, she is only the sum of her past ... a common sinner who deserves condemnation.

But, for Jesus, she is a woman who, like all of us, has made mistakes. He frees her from her past and reminds the onlookers that we, too, have pasts that need to be dealt with.

During Lent, we certainly try to do penance to make amends for our sins, but we are not to be wallowing in self-pity or shame; rather, we are joyful because of the Lord's love, his complete mercy, and his forgiveness, which free us from our pasts and cleanse us of our sins.


Let us PRAY for a continued return to better health for Pope Francis!

More News from the Viatorian Community Our New Commitment to the People of Pembroke Township

For over 25 years, Associates Ken and Michelle Barrie have been bringing young people from Kankakee County to serve local needs in Pembroke Township, including at and around its Catholic church, Sacred Heart. From now on, when they visit for service and fellowship, they will be at a Viatorian parish: Bishop Ronald Hicks of the Diocese of Joliet appointed Bishop Christopher Glancy, CSV, as Parochial Administrator of Sacred Heart, effective March 2.

"When I heard the news that Bishop Hicks had approached the Viatorians to minister and serve the people there, my heart almost leapt out of my body," Ken said. "I have witnessed the decline in the ways that the parish is just hanging on. As we have kept up our commitment and continued bringing groups out there, I was worried that its days could be numbered. Yet I knew in my heart that we could do it and we would do it. This is answered prayer. God has a special place out there and put us and the Viatorians there."



Bishop Glancy began exploring the idea in earnest during last summer's Hearts of Hope Mission, the service program the Barries run for local youth, by bringing lunch out to the group and visiting with people. He made several return visits and dialogued with the now outgoing pastor, Fr. Ray Lescher, a retired priest of the Diocese of Joliet. He learned about the poor fertility of the soil on the large lots and the preference for raising animals over farming. Bishop Glancy also learned how the Sisters of the Holy Heart of Mary assisted with founding the church in this majority Black community in the 1930s. Hopkins Park remains in one of the most materially poor areas in Illinois.

"The Viatorians are called to serve those counted of little importance by some in our world. The people of Sacred Heart Church are among those folks," Bishop Glancy said. "The experience of St. Patrick youth and the many parishioners who have supported them is to encounter in the people of Pembroke Township people who humbly live their faith and inspire us to do the same."



The Sunday noon Mass typically draws a few dozen people. Already, the Viatorians have noticed an uptick, especially for the March 23 kickoff breakfast, for which several Viatorians pitched in. Additionally, with a growing Spanish-speaking population in the area, Bishop Glancy intends to offer bilingual Mass frequently and will invite other Viatorian priests who assist there to do the same. "Today

about 20% of the area is Hispanic and half or more of those who go to church are also Hispanic," Bishop Glancy said. Bishop Glancy, the Barries, and other Viatorians in the area – including in our three other parishes – intend this to be the first of many faith formation and fellowship events to come. "This is a way of making what we have been working to do more official. It can be a way toward rebirth and new life," Michelle said. "When we had our first meeting out there, someone called Sacred Heart *holy ground*. We always talked about how there may not be much there, but it is special and we are drawn to it. Sacred Heart is what the Viatorian charism is all about."
