Brothers and Sisters,

A few weeks ago, all the priests of the diocese gathered to discuss the upcoming diocesan synod. Msgr. Heintz offered a reflection in which he discussed the way that our relationship with Jesus Christ is manifested through our participation in a particular community. As part of his reflection, he observed that Catholics often overlook this. Many Catholics, he pointed out, tend to worship in multiple parish communities, and thus are not firmly grounded in any one particular community. This creates a situation of having people who "worship everywhere but belong nowhere."

Msgr. Heintz's words have led me to pray about the question of belonging. Belonging is an important concept for Christians. While our relationship with Jesus Christ is personal, it is not private. It is formed and lived in community.

As I reflected upon the idea of belonging, I recalled the listening sessions we held when I first arrived at the parish. Many of you mentioned the ideas about belonging, stating that your families have been part of St. Stanislaus Kostka for multiple generations. And even our newer parishioners spoke of belonging, recognizing that the liturgy, music and people provide a sense of belonging.

But it is not only a parish community to which we belong. We also belong to a particular Church. A particular church is not the same as a parish. A particular Church, in broad terms, is a portion of the people of God governed by a Bishop. In short it is a diocese. And just as the parish is important for forming and assisting us in living out our Catholic faith, so too is a Diocese.

For many Catholics, the sense of belonging to a diocese is hard to understand. In fact, there are even Catholics who view their diocese as something to be lamented rather than a community to which they belong. But the diocese is not to be lamented, but rather a means for us to deepen our communion with Christ and with one another. As we begin preparations for the diocesan synod, I think it is important that we reflect upon the way in which belonging to a diocese deepens our communion with Christ and one another. We need to pray about how being a part of the particular Church of Fort Wayne-South Bend brings us into a relationship with Jesus Christ in a way that could not be accomplished individually or even on a parish level. This question needs to be asked not on a functional or practical level, but a spiritual level. So, I ask you pray upon this, and share the fruits of your prayer. It is important that we all understand how the various levels of belonging deepen our relationship with Jesus Christ.




