Worship Series: The Creeds

The Methodist movement has often been misunderstood. From the very beginning John Wesley and his brother, Charles, were judged harshly because they became involved in activities which were questionable. The Wesleys did so for good reason most times.

For example, John Wesley began "field preaching" despite his personal reservations about the practice. In the Church of England (modern day Episcopal Church) the practice was frowned upon. It was deemed uncouth by both clergy and members of the Church. However, George Whitfield had tried it and discovered so many people wanted to learn about Jesus. Many in his crowds would not attend Church for a variety of reasons. Some felt unworthy. That's like a sick person waiting to get healed before going to the doctor. So, Whitfield started going to them.

On his first attempt at field preaching, John Wesley chose a graveyard, because of the acoustics. The crowd was huge. For Wesley it became standard practice, and lead to other practices you and I would recognize from years past in our lifetimes. This practice changed his beliefs on some things.

Beliefs are important.

Each week we join together and profess "The Apostles' Creed". It only takes a few minutes. We have substituted other creeds at times. In each creed we see central beliefs intentionally put together to form a single statement about Christianity. Each creed answers a simple question. What are Christianity's core beliefs?

Good beliefs lead to good Christian behavior. Some beliefs are so foundational we hold onto them despite circumstances. Beliefs surrounding the practice of field preaching came and then they went. They were helpful for a time, but no one considers them central to Christianity.

Some church leaders looked to creeds from the early church as one tool among many to help Christians better understand their faith. At the heart of Christianity, we find the Bible telling us about God and God's faithful servants. Then, the Creeds could more easily be memorized than one of the gospels. Therefore, Christians could go to others and recite a Creed. Hymns serve a similar function. Think about Philippians 2:5-11. It talks of Jesus "self-emptying" even though he was God. It may have been one of our earliest hymns. The beauty of the language still attracts attention even today. In a few minutes any Christian could share a central idea about Christianity and not worry about how important the idea really was. Creeds help us do this.














### A word from the Old to the Young From Merilyn Holcombe






