John Wesley's Gift

We hear lots about John Wesley from time to time. Some ministers talk about him too much. Others don't talk enough. As the founder of Methodism and a key leader in the Evangelistic Revival spiritually igniting the churches of the eighteenth century, his historical place is secure.

What does he offer our age though?

In his day most British people were done with religion. After the Protestant Reformation and the conflict produced by King Henry the VIII, (one day the king would be Protestant, and the next day a new king or queen had declared them Catholic.) The violence committed by one Christian against another. Most people didn't want to return to this. Being a Christian was mostly a political act in those days.

After the violence of the Protestant Reformation, John Wesley went to Oxford to become a minister like his father. Ancient books had been discovered thanks to archaeological scientists. This discovery ignited a firestorm of intellectual activity at Oxford's seminary. The newly discovered books showed the Christian movement to have been more concerned about a person's spiritual well-being than about his or her political affiliation. Emphasizing the spiritual nature of the church lead to implications reaching into all areas of life.

Through preaching to the people who were not attending church and then organizing them into small groups, Methodism taught and lived out a radical hospitality (grace upon grace). It also embodied Christians living out high standards of behavior (justice) and calling for others to follow their lead. Methodism made use of many innovations to church work: field preaching, lay preachers, small group studies, and taking religion and its practices into all areas of life. (The "12 -Step program" of Alcoholics Anonymous was supposedly developed in this period.)

Adam Hamilton uses his pulpit to address any and all subject matters patterned after Wesley. Many come to see what he will say next. This takes a tremendous amount of time to do it well. Adam spends the time doing this. However, they also have a mix of small groups to foster fellowship, and other small groups embrace local community social projects – soup kitchens, Habitat for Humanity, et cetera.

Imagine what a small group of six to twelve people could accomplish as they met regularly and sought make changes in how people viewed nature. I first thought this way during seminary. During my time in Lexington, a group of us went deer hunting regularly during the fall. People who had not felt comfortable in church their whole lives soon became highly involved in that church. We talked about the harm our nation does to nature – the shrinking areas to safely hunt. This included the shrinking habitats of the animals we hunted. What could we do? These problems were so big.

In John Wesley's day he would have tried to solve these problems. With what you know about Wesley, what might he have done about our environmental concerns?


Ladies Retreat

Joy Class News

The Joy Class was formed in 1975. We have always been a group of people who love and care for each other. We support each other during times of happiness and through times of sadness.

We also support several organizations in Horry County by giving them donations quarterly. One of our missions that we support is *New Directions* which is located in Myrtle Beach. Between July 1,2024 and June 30,2025 they did the following: They provided 66,351 safe nights off the street, 135,710 meals, and they served 1,349 men, 418 women, 137 children, 49 veterans, and 63 families.

They empowered: 497 individuals and 16 families to go home to reunite with family or other support systems, 226 individuals and 18 families to secure permanent or transitional housing, and 39 individuals to connect to long-term recovery. 44% of people served secured a permanent positive solution to their crisis.

The Joy Class (Jesus 1st, Others 2nd and yourself 3rd) is more than just a Sunday School Class that meets once a week from 9:30 to 10:15 in the Fellowship Hall.

Everyone is welcome to join us and to be a member of our caring class. We not only support our members but we also support others in our community.


