SKILL LEVELS

ALL LEVELS: All students from beginner to advanced are welcome. The teaching artist provides balanced and responsive instruction suitable for participants at any experience level.

BEGINNING 1: Students have little to no experience with the medium and would like step-by-step instruction throughout class. Teaching artists will cover the basics of the medium.

BEGINNING 2: Students have some experience, having taken at least one class in this medium. Teaching artists will provide guidance during class, and students will continue to learn the foundations of the medium.

INTERMEDIATE: Students are comfortable with the medium. They will receive some guidance from the teaching artist, as well as time to work independently.

ADVANCED: Students have taken multiple classes in the medium and are confident in their abilities. Students are self-motivated and interested in developing their artistic voice.

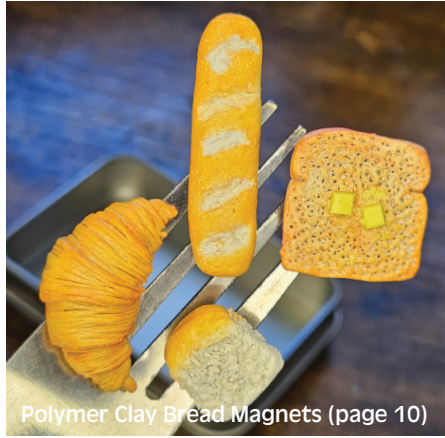

General Class Policies

- Please respect the instructor's time to prepare; do not arrive at your studio more than 10 minutes before class.
- WBCA is a community space; please clean up any messes made during class before the class ends.
- WBCA reserves the right to remove a student from our programming if their behavior is deemed disruptive or not aligned with WBCA's values of inclusion or accessibility by the instructor and/or WBCA staff.
- WBCA is unable to prorate, refund, or issue class credit for a missed class session or late registration.
- In unique circumstances and with instructor permission, students may register for a class series after the first class session. Prorating is unavailable for late registrations and students are responsible for the full tuition amount.
- WBCA reserves the right to cancel a class due to low enrollment or unsafe weather conditions. In the case that WBCA cancels a class, students will receive a full refund for the class. To avoid seeing your favorite class canceled, we encourage you to register early.
- Unless otherwise stated, WBCA programs are held onsite at 4971 Long Ave, White Bear Lake, MN 55110. Classes held offsite will list the location in the catalog, online class description, and registration confirmation email.

Cancellations

- Refund requests for a canceled or transferred registration will only be considered if received at least 7 business days prior to the class start date. If approved, refunds will be made to the original form of payment or in the form of class credit. For a series class with multiple sessions, a refund request would need to be made at least 7 business days prior to the first session of the class.
- Cancellations or transfers submitted less than 7 full business days before the class start date are not eligible for a refund or class credit except in the case of a family/medical emergency. If a refund is approved in the case of emergency, refunds are only available in the form of class credit.
- If requesting class credit for a missed class due to a family/medical emergency, students should notify WBCA as soon as they are able, either by calling us at 651-407-0597 or emailing wbcawhitebeararts.org. A request for class credit may be denied if it is received more than 7 business days after the date of the missed class.

Accessibility

Supply Lists and Material Fees

- If your class has a material fee, please bring payment in exact change in the form of cash or the form of payment listed in the class listing online. Material fees are not included in your registration and are due to the instructor on the first day of class.

Financial Assistance

- WBCA's scholarship fund has been established to help make art accessible to everyone. Scholarships are intended to help students who otherwise would be unable to afford class fees, and each student is trusted to decide the extent of their need. Each student is limited to two scholarships for each 4-month catalog, no matter the length or fee for the class.
- Scholarships are available at two levels: 50% of tuition covered, or 100% of tuition covered.
- Scholarships do not cover any material fees associated with a class, nor do they supply materials. WBCA scholarships cannot be used for any off-site classes or classes led by visiting teaching artists. Additional exemptions may apply; check the class catalog for more details.
- Registrations with scholarships follow our cancellation policy. Requests for cancellations or transfers must be received at least 7 business days prior to the class start date.
- Scholarships cannot be applied to online class registrations. Please call Visitor Services at 651-407-0597 or email wbcawhitebeararts.org to request a scholarship.

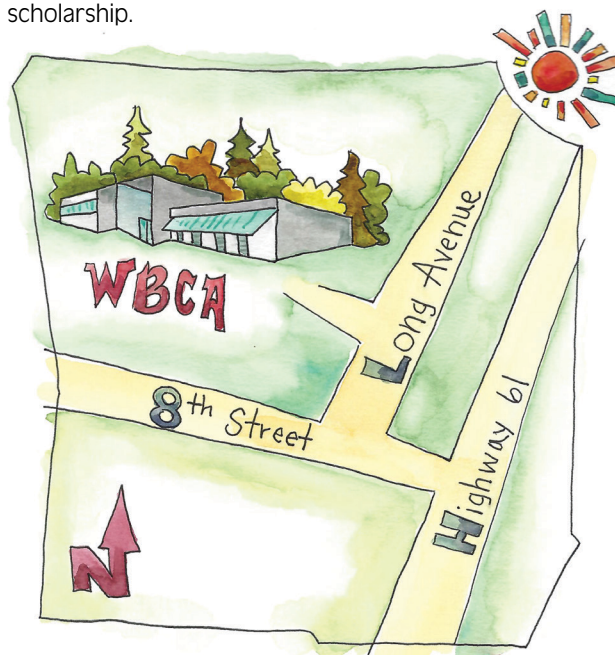
