



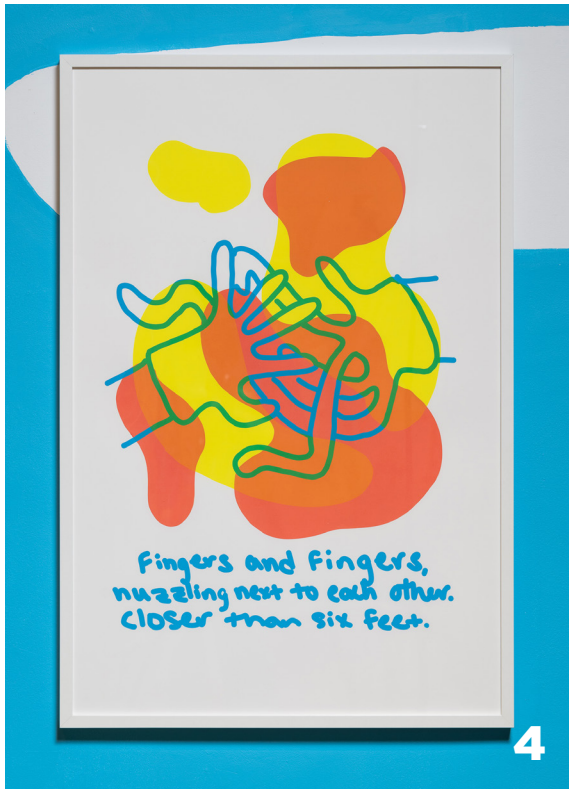

- Please do not share class links. If you know someone who would enjoy the class you are in, please encourage them to sign up with us rather than share our links.

## GENERAL CLASS POLICIES

- **Scholarships are available!** If you require a scholarship to take a class, please call 651-407-0597 or email [wbca@whitebeararts.org](mailto:wbc@whitebeararts.org)
- Prorating is not permitted.
- Refunds and WBCA class credit will not be issued for cancellations less than 2 full business days before the class start date.
- Refunds or class credit will not be issued for missed classes except in extraordinary circumstances.
- Check to see if your class has a supply list prior to the class start date. Supply lists are posted online; if you are unable to access the supply list, notify the office.
- We will make every effort to accommodate individual needs. Please notify the office if you have any special requirements or need assistance accessing a virtual class.
- WBCA reserves the right to remove a student from our programming if their behavior is deemed disruptive by the instructor and/or WBCA staff.
- Material fees are payable directly to the instructor on the first day of class. Do not include the material fee with the class tuition. Please bring cash or check in exact change. Credit cards are not accepted for material fees unless otherwise noted.

- Please do not arrive more than 10 minutes before class, instructors need preparation time.

At the time, Donald was one of only five African-American graphic designers in the United States working at a major newspaper. In 1982, Donald decided to go into business for himself. He teamed up with baseball great Dave Winfield and opened up two art galleries in the Twin Cities.

**Rajine Williams**

Rajine Williams is a visual multimedia artist and filmmaker based in the Twin Cities. Her work centers around femininity, body and identity of Black women. Her artwork is an amalgamation of what it means to be a proud Black woman.

**Amanda Wirig**

Amanda Wirig's paintings and mixed media work utilize pop culture and humor to address social and political issues in a meaningful and forthright manner. In addition to her art, she is a musician, teaching artist, and the owner of 119 North Weatherly art gallery in Minneapolis. From 2018-2019 she served as a fine arts juror as part of the White House Commission on Presidential Scholars.

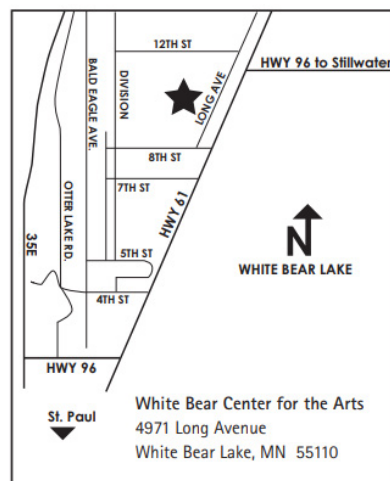
