FROM THE GRAND MASTER

Brothers and Sisters,

As we head into the dog days of summer, I would like to continue the notion of growing the Order. The passing of our beloved PGM Grady Jerald Smith reminds us we all owe our mortal coil, and the Order must continue to bring candidates in to continue our Order for future generations. Grady would happily sell you a raffle ticket, and tell you why you need to join Odd Fellowship. He will be missed by everyone that knew him.

Decades ago, sociologist Robert Putnam published *Bowling Alone*, a book detailing a sharp rise in “civic disengagement.” He noted a strange trend: more people were bowling than ever, but they were no longer playing in leagues. They were playing individually.

This remains the defining challenge of our modern era. People are starving for genuine connection, yet the habit of stepping out and committing to a community has atrophied. To engage new people today, we must understand this isolation and offer the antidote.

Here are three ways to turn “lone bowlers” into engaged members:

1. Highlight Our “Bridging Capital”

Putnam argues that healthy communities need “bridging social capital”—spaces that bring diverse groups together. While modern social media creates isolated echo chambers, our lodges do the opposite. We connect people across different generations, professions, and backgrounds.

The Takeaway: When speaking to prospects, emphasize the rare opportunity to build deep, multi-generational friendships rooted in shared values.

2. Lower the Barrier to Entry

In a world hesitant of long-term commitments, jumping straight into a fraternal order can feel daunting. People want to see value before they invest their time.

The Takeaway: Create low-stakes entry points. Invite prospective members to a casual lodge dinner, a community service project, or an open house before discussing petitions. Let them experience our workflow and fellowship firsthand.

3. Be the Ultimate “Third Place”

A “third place” is an anchor of community life that isn’t home and isn’t work. With remote work and digital isolation on the rise, people are missing this sanctuary. Our lodges are uniquely positioned to fill the void.

The Takeaway: Ensure the lodge environment feels active, welcoming, and distinct from the transactional outside world. It should be a physical place where people instantly feel they belong.

The Bottom Line: The civic decline Putnam warned us about isn’t a barrier, it is our greatest opportunity. The world is looking for exactly what we offer. By building intentional bridges, offering low-pressure invitations, and being a true center for community, we can help our neighbors stop bowling alone and start building together.

FROM THE GRAND SECRETARY

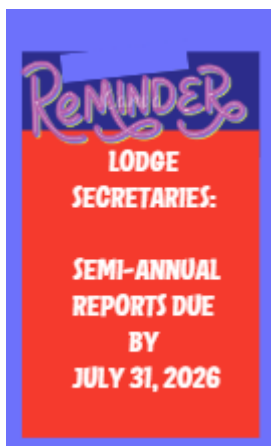
Hello to all the Brothers and Sisters of this Order.

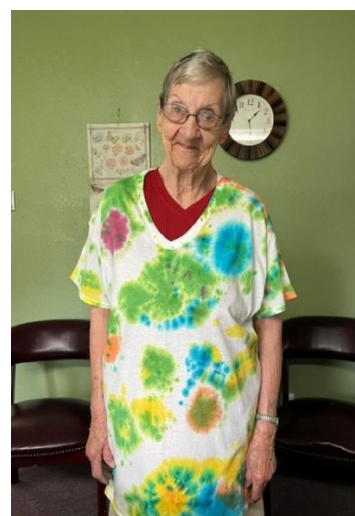

A Visit to a Boys Home in the Hill Country

For over a decade, the Capital Lodge No. 23 in Austin has had an annual commitment to support the two main children's homes in Austin. We do this to fulfill our mission to "Educate the Orphan."

Each year we give \$12,000 to the Helping Hand Home, which serves elementary and middle school-aged children coming from families with significant trauma. In addition to the cheque each year, we take our Hot Wheels Rally to the children at Helping Hand Home twice a year for a fun afternoon racing cars on our 25' double-track. And at the end of Rally, each child gets to keep their favorite car.

As the girls at Helping Hand Home age into high school, many of them go to the Settlement Home. We also give \$12,000 a year to this home which is exclusively for teenage girls.

But we have been wondering what happens to the boys who age out of the Helping Hand Home. On our last visit, I asked their development director this question—and many of the boys go out to a ranch operated by the Burke Center for Youth near Driftwood, Texas.

A contingent of brothers from the Capital Lodge visited the ranch at the beginning of December—and we celebrated our Christmas Lodge Dinner at the Salt Lick afterward!

The Burke Center ideally homes about 30 boys, with a capacity for 40. They live on a beautiful ranch with a working farm, a dozen horses, a school, a welding shop, and an automotive shop. They grow so much food that they regularly contribute to the local food pantry.

And as they age-out of the foster system, the Burke Foundations maintains an adjacent transitional house for 18-year-olds finding their way out into the world. Fun fact: They are given the car they have been working on at the Ranch, so they can drive and find their first jobs!

The Capital Lodge sent our first gift of \$12,000 to the Burke Center this year. We are looking forward to bringing our Hot Wheels Rally to the boys this summer. The director says many of the boys from Helping Hand Home have fond memories of it.

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Obituaries



Grady Jerald Smith **April 27, 1947 — June 9, 2026**

Grady Jerald Smith, age 79, of Caddo Mills, Texas, passed away surrounded by loved ones after a life defined by devotion, leadership, and joy. Born on April 27, 1947, in Royse City to Herman Samuel Smith and Lois Ina (Hurst) Smith, Grady lived a life as big and bold as his personality.

A proud graduate of Royse City High School (Class of 1966), Grady went on to earn his BBA from East Texas State University (now East Texas A&M University) in December 1970. That same year, he married the love of his life, Peggy, on May 30th—a partnership that would span more than five decades and serve as the foundation of a loving family.

Grady is preceded in death by his parents, Samuel and Lois Smith; his brothers, Carl Wayne and Floyd Ray Smith; and his nephew, Tim Smith. He is survived by his devoted wife, Peggy; sons Chris and Lance; favorite daughter-in-law Elizabeth; and three cherished grandchildren, Hunter, Kylie, and Colten Smith.

Grady was the life of every room he entered—an outgoing, Type A personality with a heart full of passion for his family and friends. He was a tireless cheerleader for his sons and attended countless games and tournaments in baseball, football, Tae Kwon Do, basketball, tennis, and golf. He coached their baseball teams and shared unforgettable adventures through the Indian Guides program. His love of travel took him to all 50 states and 22 countries across five continents, with favorite memories from cruises through the Baltic Sea and Mediterranean. He often said he wanted to show his boys the world—something he never had the chance to do as a child.

Grady's career in sales spanned respected companies including Xerox, NCR Corp, Storage Technology, Canon USA, Brother International, and Lucent Technologies. After retiring in 1996, he continued to stay busy as a real estate agent with Payne Real Estate. His work ethic began early—at age 8, he was fixing flats and pumping gas at his father's service station for 25 cents an hour. He saved every penny from that first job to open his first bank account that same year.

His commitment to community and leadership began during his high school years, where he served on numerous committees and participated in many sports and activities including football, golf, track, basketball, band, rodeo and FFA. He held the roles of President of the Royse City Quarterback Club, President of Royse City FFA and Lone Star Farmer of the Year. In the early 1970s, Grady lent his voice to Royse City High School football games as an announcer, becoming a familiar and spirited presence at local events. Together with his close friend Butch Ford, Grady organized popular Sock Hops, Royse City Teen Club, and school fundraisers that brought students and families together. Their most notable achievement was launching Royse City's first-ever "Battle of the Bands," hosted at the Glenn Dodson Grainery—a milestone that sparked a wave of youth culture and musical celebration in the town.

Grady's leadership extended across countless organizations. He was deeply involved in Masonic service for 50+ years at Royse City Lodge No. 663, Fate Lodge No. 802, and Claude L Austin Lodge No. 1450. He held honorable roles such as Worshipful Master, Treasurer, Fundraising Chairman, District Deputy Grand Master, and was the recipient of the Golden Trowel Award and the Class C Certificate. He was also 32nd Degree KCCH Scottish Rite, York Rite, and member of the Hella Shrine, where he held numerous leadership positions and earned prestigious honors including the Shriners International Gold Membership Award, Texas Shrine Shotgun Sports Association President, Texas Shrine Patrol Association President, and Hella Shrine Marching Patrol Hall of Fame Induction.

Grady also served the Independent Order of Odd Fellows with distinction, including terms as Texas Grand Master, Past Grand Patriarch, and Commander of the Department Council. His civic contributions were vast—serving on boards for the Good Samaritans of Garland, Garland Sports Hall of Fame, YMCA Youth Indian Guides, Garland Little League, and many more. He was a certified auctioneer who lent his voice to countless charitable events.

Faith was central to Grady's life. He was a member of Lake Pointe Church in Rockwall and previously attended First Baptist Church of Garland and Orchard Hills Baptist Church.

Grady Jerald Smith leaves behind a legacy of laughter, leadership, and love. He will be remembered not only for his boundless energy and generosity, but for the way he made everyone feel like family. His impact will ripple through generations, and his memory will be cherished by all who had the joy of knowing him.
