## **I. Bethel Statement of Faith**

WE BELIEVE...

There is only one true God who is the eternal King, Creator and Redeemer of all that is. He is perfectly holy, just, loving and truthful. He has revealed Himself to be eternally self-existent - one being in three persons: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.

The Bible to be the inspired and only infallible and authoritative Word of God.

Humankind was created in the image of God to know and enjoy Him yet we willfully rejected the Lordship and glory of God for which we were intended. Because of this, sickness, death and judgment entered the world and now creation experiences the effects and consequences of sin.

The Lord Jesus Christ, the one and only Son of God, was conceived of the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin, Mary, and is God's Anointed One, empowered by the Holy Spirit to inaugurate God's Kingdom on earth. He was crucified for our sins, died, was buried, resurrected and ascended into heaven, and is now alive today, in the presence of God the Father and in His people. He is "true God" and "true man."

We are saved by God's grace, through faith in the person and work of Jesus Christ. Anyone can be restored to fellowship with God through repenting, believing and receiving Jesus as their Savior and Lord. The Holy Spirit convicts, regenerates, justifies, sanctifies and adopts us as we enter the Kingdom of God as His sons and daughters.

In the ongoing sanctifying power of the Holy Spirit, by whose indwelling the Christian is enabled to live a holy life and minister supernaturally. The baptism of the Holy Spirit according

to Acts 1:4-8 and 2:4 is poured out on believers that they might have God's power to be His witnesses.

The victorious redemptive work of Christ on the cross provides freedom from the power of the enemy - sin, lies, sickness and torment.

The Church consists of all who put their faith in Jesus Christ. He gave his church the ordinances of Baptism and Communion. The Church exists to carry on the ministry of Jesus Christ and further advance His kingdom by undoing the works of the enemy, preaching and living the good news of God's love, discipling the nations, baptizing and teaching them to love and obey God.

In the ever-increasing government of God and in the Blessed Hope, which is the glorious visible return of the Lord Jesus Christ to rule and reign with His overcoming bride - the church.

Heaven and hell are real places. There will be a resurrection of the saved and the lost, the one to everlasting life and the other to everlasting death.

## **II. Four Cornerstones of Revival**

### **God is Good**

God is good, so we're required to dream big. Our faith will only explore areas where we believe God is good. Jesus represented the Father in everything He did, we are called to do the same.

### **Nothing is Impossible**

God describes Himself as nothing is impossible. He created us to be in His image, giving us the same attribute when we believe. It is in our DNA to pursue impossibilities and see them bow to Jesus. A huge part of our life is taking risk in his love.

### **Everything was Purchased at Calvary**

Everything we'll ever need was dealt with at the cross and made available to us. The Christian life is learning how to access everything He purchased for us. We believe He provided an answer before there was a problem so we owe Him trust when things look confusing or bad.

### **We are Significant**

We owe every person respect and honor because everyone is made in the image of God. While each of us is significant, we don't discover this until we discover our own insignificance. God gives graces and gifts to every person to love and bring heaven to earth.

## **III. 13 Core Values**

### **God Is Good**

God describes Himself as gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love. God is good and, by nature, in a good mood. Psalm 103:8–13; Acts 14:16–17; James 1:17–18; 2 Peter 3:9; Matthew 7:11; Galatians 5:22–23; Psalm 119:68; Zephaniah 3:17; Psalm 104; Exodus 34:5–7; Acts 17:22–31

The message, ministry, and sacrifice of Jesus perfectly reveal the nature of God as a good Father. John 3:16–17; Hebrews 1:2–3; John 14:6–7; Isaiah 9:6; Colossians 1:19, 2:9; John 1:1, 18; 8:1–11, 19

God is a good Father; we can trust Him regardless of our circumstances. Romans 8:28–32; Hebrews 11:6; Nahum 1:7; James 1:12–18; Matthew 10:29–31; Acts 16:23–26

Enemies come to steal and kill, but Jesus came to destroy demonic works and give us abundant life. John 10:10–11; 1 John 3:8; Acts 10:38; 1 Peter 5:8–10; Ephesians 6:12; Mark 5:1–19

God's goodness is extravagant. As we remem-

ber and retell what He has done through our testimonies, faith is created that He is able and eager to do it again. Romans 10:15–17; Hebrews 13:7–8; Acts 10:34–48; Revelation 19:10; Psalm 44:1–5, 119:11; Mark 5:18–21; Deuteronomy 6:17–24; 1 Chronicles 16:23–36; Joshua 4:1–9

### **Salvation Creates Joyful Identity**

Jesus has won absolute victory! We are forgiven and freed from the enemy's power of sin, sickness, lies, and torment. Now we live in the power of righteousness, healing, truth, and joy! Romans 8:1–4; 2 Corinthians 5:17; Romans 6:4; Galatians 2:20; Hebrews 2:14–15; Galatians 5:22–24; 1 Corinthians 15:56–57; Revelation 1:12–18

We are adopted as royalty into God's family and commanded to help others be reconciled with the Father and come home. Romans 8:14–17; John 1:12; 2 Corinthians 5:18–21; 1 Peter 2:9; 1 John 3:1; Luke 15:11–32

We are simultaneously joyful servants, trusted friends, and beloved children of our Lord. John 15:12–15; Psalm 16:11; Hebrews 1:9, 12:2; Matthew 25:23; Psalm 100:2; Galatians 1:10; Matthew 23:11–12; John 1:12; 1 John 3:1; Matthew 25:14–30

We are new creations, not merely sinners saved by grace but saints who have been given His righteousness so we can partner with our Father God. 2 Corinthians 5:17–21; 1 Corinthians 1:30; Romans 3:21–26, 8:1, 30; Galatians 2:19–20; Acts 26

### **Responsive to Grace**

We joyfully experience the astounding, undeserved love of God and His ongoing power to transform us. His transforming love and power are inseparable from one another. John 3:16–17; Ephesians 1:4–5, 2:8–10; Romans 5:6–11; Mark 5:1–20

God scandalously loves His lost creation and extends grace to us, empowering believers to love Him and others at a higher standard than the law. Romans 5:7–8; 2 Corinthians 5:14–18; Romans 6:11–14; Matthew 5:21–28; Romans 8:2–4; Acts 9:1–22, 26:1–23

Deeply experiencing grace teaches us about righteousness, which empowers us to overcome sin and failure. The Father's love keeps us from focusing on sin or hiding in shame if we fail. Ephesians 3:14–21; 2 Corinthians 3:17–18; Titus 2:11–13; Colossians 3:1–5; Acts 2:14–41

God's grace breaks the mentality that says "I am a powerless victim of circumstances" and creates a new identity that declares, "In Christ, I am a victorious overcomer, no matter the situation." John 16:33; 1 John 4:4; Romans 8:31–32, 35–39; 1 Corinthians 15:57; 2 Corinthians 2:14; Deuteronomy 28:13; Jeremiah 29:11

### **Focused on His Presence**

Our first ministry is to God. As we behold Him, we are moved to worship with joyous passion. Psalm 27:4; Luke 10:39–42; James 4:8; Psalm 1:1–3, 23:6, 26:8; John 4:23; Psalm 22:3

God delights in us and He has always desired to be with us. We focus on His presence because we have discovered that He is focused on us. Ephesians 1:4–5; Zephaniah 3:17; Jeremiah 31:3; Psalm 65:4; 1 John 3:1; Revelation 3:20; 1 John 4:19

Purposefully cultivating a hunger for God's manifest presence and an openness to experiencing the Holy Spirit deepens our friendship with God and our awareness that we carry His presence for the sake of the world. Psalm 73:28, 107:9; John 1:16; Matthew 5:6; Isaiah 55:1–2; 1 Corinthians 3:16

As a lifestyle, we practice recognizing God's presence while we minister to others, attempting

to say what He is saying and do what He is doing. John 5:19–20, 30, 12:49–50, 14:10; 1 John 4:16–17

### **Creating Healthy Family**

We are adopted into God's family, so we intentionally create family and community wherever we go. Ephesians 1:5, 2:19; Matthew 12:48–50; Galatians 6:10; Romans 8:15–16; 1 Peter 2:17; Acts 2:41–47

We think like healthy family members and do what's best for the whole environment, mutually submitting to one another in love and not being selfish. Philippians 2:3; Romans 12:9–21; Ephesians 5:21; Galatians 5:13; 1 Corinthians 13; Ruth 1:16–17

In covenant relationships, we purposely grow our capacity to trust and be trusted as we empower and confront one another in order to live out who we truly are. Matthew 18:15; Luke 17:3–4; Ephesians 4:15–16; 1 Corinthians 4:14–21; 1 Thessalonians 5:14; 1 Samuel 20

We are loyal, which is demonstrated most radically when people fail. We do not punish and abandon those who fail in order to save face or show we hate sin, but instead we commit to helping them be restored. Galatians 6:1; Matthew 18:15; John 8:1–11; Psalm 141:5; John 21

### **God's Word Transforms**

The goal of Scripture is to bring us into a relationship with the Author and transform us into His likeness. John 5:39–40; 2 Timothy 3:15–17; Matthew 4:4; 2 Corinthians 3:15–18; James 1:22–25; Ephesians 5:25–27; Psalm 119:11; Luke 24:13–35

As God encounters us in His Word, faith is released into our lives. Studying God's truth empowers us to believe in who He is, who we are, and how He wants us to live. Romans 10:17; 1 Thessalonians

2:13; John 17:17; Matthew 7:24–28; Colossians 3:15–17; John 8:31–32; Psalm 119:105; Romans 15:4; 1 Corinthians 10:1–13; Acts 8:26–40

The primary lens through which we interpret the Bible is the person, life, and redemptive work of Jesus, because He is the most complete revelation of who God is and what God cares about. John 5:37–47; Luke 24:25–32; John 1:14, 14:9–11; Colossians 1:15–20, 2:9; Hebrews 1:1–3; 2 Peter 1:16–21

The Bible is the source of infallible truth and authority by which we judge all insight and prophetic revelation. 2 Timothy 3:15–17; Matthew 22:29; John 8:31–32; 2 Thessalonians 2:13–15; 2 Peter 1:16–21; Proverbs 30:5–6; Psalm 119:160; Matthew 4:1–11

### **God is Still Speaking**

God wants to communicate with His family. It is important for us to actively listen for His voice and experience the variety of ways He communicates. John 10:26–28, 16:13; Matthew 4:4; Isaiah 50:4–5; 1 John 2:27; Acts 2:17; Numbers 11:29; 1 Kings 19:9–13

Scripture calls us to earnestly desire the gift of prophecy, which is to speak on God's behalf to strengthen, encourage, and comfort people. We desire to say what the Father is saying to help people grow in their identity and discover their God-given purpose and value. 1 Corinthians 14:1–4; John 12:49; 1 Timothy 4:14–16; Acts 2:17; 1 Corinthians 14:24–25; Acts 13:1–3

Prophecy is not one-way communication. It involves two people hearing from God: the one who gives the prophetic word and the one who receives it. With the Holy Spirit, Scripture and our community, we judge the spirit and accuracy of the words we give and receive. Holding on to what is good, we let go of what is not. 1 Thessalonians 5:19–22; 1 Corinthians 14:29; Luke 9:55;

Acts 21:10–22:24, 27:10, 22–24

The Bible is the ultimate, authoritative revelation unlike any other; nothing will be added to it. Therefore, prophecy should never contradict properly interpreted Scripture. Galatians 1:6–9; 2 Timothy 3:16–17; 2 Thessalonians 2:13–15; Matthew 7:15–20; John 8:31–32; 2 Peter 1:16–21

### **Jesus Empowers Supernatural Ministry**

Jesus promised signs would follow believers and they would do even greater works than He did. John 14:12–14; Acts 2:17–18; Luke 9:1–2; Mark 16:15–18; Acts 5:12–16

We owe the world an opportunity to experience the power of God and an invitation to salvation because Jesus sent us into the world, just as the Father sent Him, with the power of the Holy Spirit. John 20:21–23; 1 Corinthians 2:4–5; John 17:18; 1 Thessalonians 1:5; Matthew 28:18–19, 5:14–16; Luke 10:1–9

Nothing is impossible with God. Therefore, no person or situation is beyond His ability to bring complete restoration. Matthew 17:20; Mark 10:25–27; John 15:7; 1 Corinthians 6:9–11; Psalm 103:1–7; Luke 1:34–37

We believe all can be healed because Jesus demonstrated the Father's will in healing all the sick and demonized He encountered. Matthew 4:23, 12:15, 14:14, 24–33; Luke 9:11; Acts 10:38; Psalm 103:3–4; Acts 3:1–10; James 2:14–18; Mark 10:46–52; Matthew 9:27–38

### **His Kingdom is Advancing**

God is big and victorious. The devil is small and defeated. We are in a battle, but the outcome is not in doubt! 1 John 4:4; Colossians 2:13–15; 1 John 2:13, 5:4–5; Romans 8:31–39; John 12:31; Acts 4:23–31; 1 John 3:8; Hebrews 2:14–15; John 16:33; Mark 5:1–13

We believe and live the prayer, "Your Kingdom come, Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven." Therefore, we partner with the King in natural and supernatural ways to establish mercy, justice, and righteousness until He comes. Matthew 6:9–10, 10:7–8; Isaiah 9:7, 33:5–6; Micah 6:8; Matthew 10:42, 25:40; John 14:12; James 1:27; Matthew 12:22–29

As believers, we are all in full-time ministry as God advances His Kingdom into every area of society. Our work and efforts both inside and outside the church are sacred and valuable acts of worship to God. 1 Peter 2:9; Romans 12:1; Matthew 5:13–16; Colossians 3:23–24; Daniel 6:3; Proverbs 22:29; Ephesians 6:5–9; Matthew 25:31–46

Although we will experience resistance and conflict as the Kingdom advances, we expect the culture to be changed as people come to salvation and take their places in God's purpose for the world. John 15:19–21, 16:33; Colossians 1:13–14; 2 Corinthians 4:8–11, 12:10; Nehemiah 2:1–10; Matthew 5:13–16; Acts 19:11–41

### **Free and Responsible**

Christ died to set us free from sin, death, fear, and shame in order to establish us in freedom so we can live and love as God's glorious children. Romans 8:1–2, 15–21; Galatians 5:1; Romans 6:4, 14–22; 2 Corinthians 3:17, 5:17; 1 John 4:17–18; Luke 19:1–10

Freedom is very personal, but it is not self-centered. We have been given freedom so we may present ourselves to the Lord as a willing sacrifice, surrendered and ready to serve. Galatians 5:13–14; Romans 12:1–2, 14:7–9, 15:1–7; Matthew 4:1–11

Freedom and responsibility are inseparable. We experience true freedom as we cooperate with

the Holy Spirit to produce the fruit of self-control and use our freedom to bless others. As a BLN influence leader, I agree and commit myself to the following standards:

I take responsibility as a disciple of Jesus to continue to enjoy my own close, obedient, loving friendship with the Lord. (John 15:1-17).

My life evidences a genuine experience of regeneration:

- the new birth (John 1:12-13; 3:3-8; I Peter 1:18-25)
- a commitment to holiness, wholeness and our Bethel Leaders Network family (Romans 6:4, 8:1-4, 13:13-14; Eph. 4:17-32, 5:1-2,15; I John 1:6-7).

I affirm the sacredness of sexuality and marriage between a man and a woman.

In marriage, I will be completely faithful to my spouse emotionally and physically (Heb. 13:4).

I believe Scripture teaches that sex is a blessing to be rightly experienced only within heterosexual marriage. Therefore, I do not participate in sex outside of marriage, pornography, living as husband and wife when not married, and/or homosexuality (Matt. 15:19; Rom. 13:13; I Cor. 6:9-20).

I will follow the wisdom of the Lord by refraining from intoxication with alcohol and/or drugs (Rom. 13:13; Gal. 5:19-21).

Should I stumble in any of these areas, I will get up again with the help of the Holy Spirit and my church family.

If offended, I will not abandon my commitment but will speak the truth in love and work through conflict with gentleness, grace and forgiveness (Eph. 4:1-3, 25).

I will be thankful and live humbly and honorably in all my relationships with both Christians and non-Christians, so as to be a faithful ambassador of Christ's Kingdom (Col. 3:15; Eph. 4:1-6; II Cor. 5:20).

I will contribute to the support of Bethel Leaders Network by faithfully fulfilling my annual financial contribution on time.

I will make a commitment to attend bi-monthly online revival group (small group).

I will be accountable to keep these commitments and welcome correction, if need be.

If the Lord seems to be transitioning me to a different leadership network or covering, I will not simply leave BLN, but agree to process this decision with my BLN revival group leader.

#### **V. BLN Financial Policies**

##### **Delinquent Accounts**

Monthly payments are considered delinquent 72 hours after the payment deadline. If delinquent accounts are not brought current within 30 days of payment deadline, membership will become inactive until payment has been made in full.

##### **Refund Policy**

**Application Fee** - The application fee is non-transferrable and non-refundable.

**After 60 Days** - BLN Influence is a 6-month minimum time commitment. It can take up to 14 days to cancel your BLN influence membership.

## Relational Commitment

### **BLN Influence leaders must be committed to:**

Position yourself as a son or daughter to receive and grow from Bethel Leaders and other BLN leaders in your revival group and wider BLN network.

Make a commitment to attend monthly online revival group (small group).

Seek to raise up leaders in other regions and spheres.

## When can I apply to join bln influence?

We have two intakes per year for new Influence members:

**February 1:** Applications close January 15

**August 1:** Applications close July 15

We recommend starting your application process at least 6 weeks prior to the start date. The application process requires an application fee, online form, two references, and an interview. Interviews will not be scheduled until the form, application fee, and both references have been received.

- Verify you are a senior leader of a church, ministry or ministry organization
- Pay \$200 non-refundable application fee
- Submit your online application form
- Submit two completed personal references
- Schedule your online interview

Within two to four weeks of your interview, we will notify with a decision on your application.

### If accepted:

- Payment must be made two weeks prior to start date of BLN Influence membership to secure your spot.

- Complete BLN's Introduction to Kingdom Culture online course within 12 months of joining BLN.

## How do I leave bln?

BLN membership is voluntary and withdrawal of membership can be made at any time.

BLN Influence membership withdrawal process:

- Share your reasons for leaving with your revival group leader
- Ask your revival group leader to initiate the process for withdrawal

## Can I be asked to leave bln?

In order to maintain BLN membership, we expect all BLN leaders to align their actions with the BLN core values, standards, and financial commitment. If for some reason a leader chooses to conduct outside of the expressed guidelines, the BLN team reserves the right to suspend the leader's membership for a time. This process will be overseen by the Bethel Leaders Network Executive Team, or the leader's home oversight team, as necessary.

The BLN leadership team is committed to walk through all issues with love and honor, prioritizing the protection of relationships. We will defer to the membership agreement in place when a change needs to happen. Our desire is to empower people to take responsibility for their actions and discover the root causes of behavior so they may be restored to wholeness. BLN values help and restoration above discipline and punishment.

# BLN influence

## FAQ's

### Is my spouse included in my Influence membership?

Yes! The Influence membership is for a senior leader and their spouse. All Influence membership benefits are per household, not per person.

For example:

- The two sozo sessions per year included in the senior leader benefits is two per household, not two per person. Each household can use up to two sessions per year, and can be used by either the senior leader or their spouse.
- The senior leader and their spouse will have the opportunity for a *joint* 30 minute monthly connection with their Bethel Revival Group Leader (RGL).

### How often will I hear from Bill, Kris & Dann?

As a member of BLN Influence, you can expect the following access to Bill Johnson, Kris Vallotton and Dann Farrelly:

- Opportunity to receive from Bill, Kris, Dann and other Bethel leaders speaking at BLN annual events.
- Monthly online Q & A sessions with Bill, Kris, Dann and other Bethel and BLN leaders.
- Receive regular leadership insight from Bill, Kris, and other Bethel leaders through our BLN resources.

### What about other Bethel leaders?

BLN Influence members have access to other Bethel leaders through a variety of ways:

- Special guests in your revival group as organized by your revival group leader
- Through BLN Online Courses
- Strategic connection with Bethel speakers to invite to your church or ministry

### Are speakers/teams available to come to my church?

Yes. BLN provides Influence leaders with strategic connection to invite Bethel speakers to come teach at your church/ministry on a variety of revival and Kingdom culture topics.

### Can I use the BLN name and/or logo for my church/ministry?

No. The use of the BLN Influence logo is for the personal use of Influence members only.

### Are there any size requirements for churches to join?

BLN is for leaders of any size church or ministry.

### After joining, how do I develop connection and relationship within BLN?

Upon your acceptance into BLN Influence you will:

- Receive information explaining how to access all your benefits
- Be contacted by your BLN revival group leader and invited to your monthly connection time
- Be added to the private BLN Influence Facebook group to begin connecting with other members

### Can I get ordination or licensing through BLN?

No. BLN is not an ordination or licensing organization.

### Can I be part of another network or denomination simultaneously?

Yes.

# What type of spiritual and organizational covering does BLN provide?

We believe spiritual covering is accessed as individuals position themselves as sons and daughters to receive from spiritual fathers and mothers. The apostolic five-fold ministry of Bethel desires to be a foundation, not a capstone, for strengthening and empowering current and future leaders to take the Kingdom further.

## As a BLN member, you'll have opportunity to:

- Experience the blessing of alignment and spiritual covering with Bethel's apostolic five-fold ministry leaders, such as Bill Johnson, Kris Vallotton and other fathers and mothers of the Bethel and BLN family.
- Experience the inheritance of fathers and mothers who have forged a relationship with God and whose blessing transcends time and space.
- Experience mutual covering, strength, and support by partnering in covenant relationships with other BLN members.

## BLN covering does NOT include:

- Direct, personal connection or access to Bethel Senior Leaders.
- Personal or organizational direction, management or oversight from Bethel leaders. (We expect every BLN leader to have a healthy support system in place to successfully manage their organization's finances, ministry, and conflict resolution).
- Vetting or endorsement of a church. BLN is a place for leaders to belong.

## Is BLN a denomination?

No. Bethel is not called to create a denomination, but instead to empower the whole body of Christ to bring heaven to earth. BLN exists to add strength to all leaders in the body of Christ, no matter their denomination.

## Our commitment to you:

The Bethel Leaders Network Executive Team commits to foster a trustworthy leadership team that submits to the authority of the Word of God (I Tim. 3:1-13 & Titus 1:6-9, I Peter 5:1-7). We commit to provide a place where leaders can belong to the Bethel family and connect, encourage and empower one another to transform our world. We will encourage and empower you "for works of service so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ" (Eph. 4:12-13). We will seek to set an example in speech, life, love, faith and purity (1 Tim. 4:12) and accurately teach the Word of Truth (2 Tim. 2:15). We will be approachable and teachable and create a family full of faith, hope, love and joy!
