

Parents or guardians are required to attend a baptismal preparation class prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are held on the first and third Saturdays. Please call us to register.

Baptismal prep classes:

Our baptismal preparation classes are held on the first Tuesday evening at 7:00pm. **This meeting must be attended before setting the date.** Please call us to register. 630-766-4509

Marriages:

It is necessary that all couples desiring to be married at Holy Ghost Church call the parish office to schedule an appointment with a priest at least six months prior to the date of their wedding and BEFORE they set a date with a banquet facility. Please call us to register.

Religious Education:

Our Religious Education Program builds and supports informed, practicing, and faith filled families. The program is held on select Sundays from September through April between 9:00-10:15 AM. Families are then encouraged to attend mass together either at 8 AM or at 10:30 AM Please call us to register.

Instruction for children on these sacraments is currently being offered within the religion curriculum in the Faith Formation programs. It is diocesan policy that a person be in the Faith Formation program for two full years before receiving sacraments. CATHOLIC FOUNDATIONS WITH FR. SAM

21st Sunday in Ordinary Time





WHAT THE HOLY TRINITY not exist. IS NOT:

Dispelling Misconceptions

The Holy Trinity, the central mystery of the Christian faith, is often misunderstood. While we affirm that God is one in essence and three in persons (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit), many misconceptions arise when trying to grasp this profound truth.

Here's an exploration of **what the Holy Trinity is not**, which can help clarify the authentic Catholic understanding.

1. THE TRINITY IS NOT

THREE SEPARATE GODS (TRITHEISM)

The Trinity is not a form of tritheism, which would imply the

existence of three distinct gods.

Catholic theology firmly holds that God is one being in three persons, not a combination of three separate deities. The three persons of the Trinity (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) are distinct yet fully united in the same divine nature. They are not separate beings, but rather one God who exists eternally in a relationship of perfect unity and love.

2. THE TRINITY IS NOT MODALISM

Modalism is a heresy that suggests God is one person who appears in different modes or forms at different times (e.g., as the Father in the Old Testament, as Jesus in the New Testament, and as the Holy Spirit after Pentecost). The Trinity is not one God with three masks or roles. Catholic theology teaches that God is **three distinct persons** who coexist simultaneously, not three manifestations or roles played by a single person.

3. THE TRINITY IS NOT A DIVISION OF GOD

Some misunderstand the Trinity to mean that God is divided into parts, with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit each being one-third of God. This is not accurate.

Each person of the Trinity is fully God, not a fraction of the divine essence.

The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are co-equal and co-eternal, each sharing the fullness of the divine nature without division or hierarchy of essence.

4. THE TRINITY IS NOT A CREATION OF THE SON AND SPIRIT BY THE FATHER

Another common error is the idea that the Son and the Holy Spirit were created by the Father, with the Father existing first and the other two persons coming into existence later. This is false.

Catholic doctrine teaches that the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are co-eternal.

The Son is eternally begotten of the Father, and the Holy Spirit proceeds eternally from the Father and the Son. There was never a time when the Son or the Holy Spirit did

5. THE TRINITY IS NOT COMPREHENSIBLE BY HUMAN REASON ALONE

It's a mistake to think that the mystery of the Trinity can be fully understood or explained through human logic or

philosophical reasoning.
While analogies can help us grasp aspects of the Trinity, the mystery of one God in three persons is ultimately beyond human comprehension.

The Trinity is revealed through divine revelation (Scripture and Tradition), not human reasoning alone.

6. THE TRINITY IS NOT A HIERARCHICAL RELATIONSHIP Some people mistakenly think that the Father is superior to the Son and the Holy Spirit. This is incorrect.

In the Trinity, there is no hierarchy; the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are co-equal.

Although they have distinct roles and relations to one another (e.g., the Father is unbegotten, the Son is begotten, and the Holy Spirit proceeds), these distinctions do not imply a difference in status or power.

All three persons are equally divine.

7. THE TRINITY IS NOT A DUALISM WITH THE HOLY SPIRIT AS AN AFTERTHOUGHT

Some believe that the Holy Spirit is somehow a lesser or later addition to the Trinity, given that the Father and Son are more frequently discussed in Scripture. This is incorrect. The Holy Spirit is an essential, co-eternal, and fully divine person in the Trinity, equal in dignity and power to the Father and the Son. The procession of the Spirit from the Father and the Son does not imply subordination or a lack of divinity.

8. THE TRINITY IS NOT A MERE SYMBOL OF UNITY A common misunderstanding is that the Trinity is simply a symbol of unity or a metaphor for how humans relate to God. While the Trinity does reveal perfect communion and relational unity, it is not merely a metaphor or a symbol. The Trinity is the real, personal relationship within the Godhead, and it is essential to the nature of God.

9. THE TRINITY IS NOT UNSCRIPTURAL

Some claim that the doctrine of the Trinity is not found in the Bible, and is thus an invention of the early Church.
However, while the term "Trinity" does not appear in
Scripture, the concept is clearly present.
The baptismal formula in Matthew 28:19 ("In the name of
the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit") and the
frequent **interactions** between Father, Son, and Spirit
throughout the Corpola (a.g., at locary) point to the

throughout the Gospels (e.g., at Jesus' baptism) point to the reality of the Trinity.

10. THE TRINITY IS NOT THREE INDEPENDENT PERSONS The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are not independent of one another, each acting on their own accord.

Instead, they act in perfect unity, sharing the same divine will.

While each person has a distinct role within the divine economy (e.g., the Father as Creator, the Son as Redeemer, and the Spirit as Sanctifier), they are always working in concert with one another.

NEWS & EVENTS

11. THE TRINITY IS NOT MERELY AN ABSTRACT **DOCTRINE**

It is incorrect to think of the Trinity as an abstract theological doctrine with no practical impact. In reality, the Trinity is the foundation of Christian life and worship.

The mystery of the Trinity undergirds everything about the Christian faith, including how we pray, live in community, and understand our relationship with God.

- 12. THE TRINITY IS NOT SUBORDINATIONISM Subordinationism is the idea that the Son and the Holy Spirit are inferior to the Father in essence or divinity. This heresy was rejected by the Church, affirming that all three persons of the Trinity are equally divine and that their distinction lies in relation and origin, not in power or alory.
- 13. THE TRINITY IS NOT A CONFUSION OF PERSONS The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are not different aspects of the same person, as if God were sometimes the Father, other times the Son, and yet other times the Holy Spirit. Catholic theology teaches that the three persons of the Trinity are distinct persons, each fully and completely God, without confusion or blending.
- 14. THE TRINITY IS NOT A FORM OF POLYTHEISM A misconception among non-Christians is that the Trinity implies a belief in multiple gods. This is incorrect. The Trinity is one God in three persons, not three gods. The unity of the Trinity means that Christians are monotheists, worshiping one God, even while recognizing the distinct persons within the Godhead.

15. THE TRINITY IS NOT DIVISIBLE

Some may think of the persons of the Trinity as distinct in such a way that they could be separated or exist apart from each other.

However, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are inseparable in their divine essence and being.

There is no division within God; rather, the persons are distinct in relation but perfectly unified in substance.

CONCLUSION: Understanding What the Trinity Is and Is Not

By clarifying what the Holy Trinity is not, we better

understand what it is: a mystery of one God in three distinct but co-equal, coeternal persons. Each person is fully divine, and together they form a perfect unity of love and communion. The doctrine of the Trinity is essential to Catholic faith and is rooted in both Scripture and Tradition, guiding Christians in their worship and understanding of God's nature.


