Marriages:

It is necessary that all couples desiring to be married at Holy Ghost Church call the parish office to schedule an appointment with a priest at least six months prior to the date of their wedding and BEFORE they set a date with a banquet facility. Please call us to register.

Religious Education:

Our Religious Education Program builds and supports informed, practicing, and faith filled families. The program is held on select Sundays from September through April between 9:00-10:15 AM. Families are then encouraged to attend mass together either at 8 AM or at 10:30 AM Please call us to register. 630-766-4509

Reconciliation and Eucharist:

Instruction for children on these sacraments is currently being offered in the 2nd Grade. It is diocesan policy that a person be in the Faith Formation program for two full years before receiving sacraments. A child needs to be in First Grade Faith Formation to be on track to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist in Second Grade. Instruction in these sacraments are part of the Faith Formation (RE) program. Please call us to register. 630-766-4509.

Confirmation:

Youth instruction for the sacrament of Confirmation is currently being administered within the 8th Grade (Parish 8) religion curriculum in the Faith Formation programs. It is diocesan policy that a person be in the Faith Formation program for two full years before receiving sacraments. A child needs to be in Seventh Grade Faith Formation to be on track to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in Eighth Grade. For more information contact the (RE) Faith Formation Office at 630-766-4509.

Initiation Sacraments for Adults: Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation Through the parish OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation for Adults) process, adult candidates (individuals who were baptized and now wish to complete their initiation into the Catholic Church) may receive formation in the sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation. At the end of the instructional period, all candidates will complete their full initiation into the Church.

Adult Catechumen (individuals who seek to enter into the Catholic faith for the first time) will receive instruction in Baptism, First Eucharist, and Confirmation. THE INFINITE GRACES OF ATTENDING MASS: Read this over and over and over again.

Why Every Catholic Should Embrace It Fully (with Biblical References)

Attending Mass is one of the greatest spiritual gifts, providing countless benefits for your soul and the souls of others.

Here's an in-depth analysis of these reasons, accompanied by biblical references to highlight their significance:

1. COMFORT AT THE HOUR OF DEATH -At the moment of your death, the Masses you attended with devotion will bring immense comfort. Just as the sacraments prepare you for eternal life, Masses strengthen your soul. - "Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me." (Psalm 23:4)

2. ADVOCATE IN THE DIVINE COURT -Every Mass will serve as an advocate before God's judgment seat, calling for His mercy and forgiveness. - "For Christ entered the Holy Place not made with hands... but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf." (Hebrews 9:24)

3. REDUCTION OF TEMPORAL PUNISHMENTS -Mass helps reduce the temporal punishments due to your sins, especially when you participate fervently. - "But if we judged ourselves truly, we would not be judged. But when we are judged by the Lord, we are disciplined so that we may not be condemned along with the world." (1 Corinthians 11:31-32)

4. TRIBUTE TO THE HUMANITY OF CHRIST -Through Mass, you honor Christ's humanity and His sacrifice on the Cross.

- "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth." (John 1:14)

5. ATONEMENT FOR NEGLIGENCE - Mass compensates for the times you have neglected your spiritual duties.

- "For a righteous man falls seven times and rises again, but the wicked stumble in times of calamity."* (Proverbs 24:16)

6. FORGIVENESS OF VENIAL SINS -By attending Mass with sincere contrition, venial sins are forgiven. - "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."* (1 John 1:9)

7. LIBERATION FROM THE DEVIL'S DOMINION -Each Mass strengthens your soul against the devil's temptations.

- "Submit yourselves, therefore, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you."* (James 4:7)

8. AID TO SOULS IN PURGATORY -Your participation in Mass helps the souls in Purgatory find peace and move closer to Heaven.

- "It is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins." (2 Maccabees 12:46)

9. BLESSINGS IN TEMPORAL AFFAIRS -Mass brings blessings not only to your soul but to your daily affairs.

- "But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness," and all these things will be added to you."* (Matthew 6:33)

10. GREATER BENEFIT DURING LIFE THAN AFTER DEATH -A Mass attended during your life will benefit you more than those offered after death.

- "Store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal."* (Matthew 6:20)

11. PROTECTION FROM DANGERS AND MISFORTUNES -The grace received during Mass protects you from unforeseen dangers.

- "The Lord is faithful, and He will strengthen you and protect you from the evil one." (2 Thessalonians 3:3)

12. SHORTENING OF TIME IN PURGATORY - The Mass can help reduce the time your soul may spend in Purgatory. - "For the Son of Man will come with his angels in the glory of his Father, and then He will repay each person according to what he has done." (Matthew 16:27)

13. INCREASE IN HEAVENLY GLORY -Each Mass increases your eternal reward in Heaven. - "For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison." (2 Corinthians 4:17)

14. PROTECTION FROM TRAGIC DEATH - Attending Mass regularly brings God's protection against an untimely or tragic death.

- "He will command His angels concerning you to quard you in all your ways."* (Psalm 91:11)

15. PARTICIPATION WITH THE ANGELS -During Mass, you join the angels in worship, even though you cannot see them. - "And I heard the voice of many angels... saying with a loud voice, 'Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!"" (Revelation 5:11-12)

16. HONOR TO THE SAINTS -When you attend Mass in honor of a saint, you not only honor God but also invoke that saint's protection and intercession.

- "The praver of a righteous person has great power as it is working," (James 5:16)

17. DAILY SAINTLY INTERCESSION -By honoring the Saint of the day, you build a spiritual connection and gain their intercession.

- *"Are they not all ministering spirits sent out to serve for the sake of those who are to inherit salvation?"* (Hebrews 1:14)

18. GREATEST GIFT FOR SOULS IN PURGATORY - Mass is the most powerful gift you can offer for the souls in Purgatory, bringing them relief and peace.

- "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy." (Matthew 5:7)

19. ST. AUGUSTINE ON WORKING FOR YOUR OWN ADVANTAGE -When you pray, give alms, and attend Mass for the souls in Purgatory, you also benefit spiritually.

- "Give, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap." (Luke 6:38)

20. MASS FREES SOULS FROM PURGATORY -According to Saint Gregory, many souls are freed from Purgatory when a Mass is offered or attended with devotion.

- "Truly, I say to you, whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." (Matthew 18:18)

21. RELIEF FOR SOULS DURING MASS -During Mass, the pains of souls in Purgatory are eased, especially for those for whom the Mass is offered.

- "I desire mercy, not sacrifice, and acknowledgment of God rather than burnt offerings." (Hosea 6:6)

22. PLENARY INDULGENCE FOR PURGATORY - A plenary indulgence can be earned by offering Mass and Communion for the souls in Purgatory, particularly on specific days.

- "The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the Lord lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace." (Numbers 6:24-26)

23. CHARITY TOWARD SOULS IN PURGATORY -Offering indulgences and Masses for the souls in Purgatory is a profound act of charity.

- "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ." (Galatians 6:2)

24. THE GREATEST ACT OF WORSHIP - The Holy Mass is a re-presentation of Christ's sacrifice on Calvary and the highest form of worship. It is a must for all Catholics, especially on Sundays. - "Do this in remembrance of me." (Luke 22:19)
