

Marriages:

It is necessary that all couples desiring to be married at Holy Ghost Church call the parish office to schedule an appointment with a priest at least six months prior to the date of their wedding and BEFORE they set a date with a banquet facility. Please call us to register.

Religious Education:

Our Religious Education Program builds and supports informed, practicing, and faith filled families. The program is held on select Sundays from September through April between 9:00-10:15 AM. Through the parish OCIA (Order of
Christian Initiation for Adults) process,
adult candidates (individuals who were
baptized and now wish to complete their
initiation into the Catholic Church) may
receive formation in the sacraments of First
Eucharist and Confirmation. At the end of
the instructional period, all candidates will
complete their full initiation into the
Church.

Adult Catechumen (individuals who seek to enter into the Catholic faith for the first time) will receive instruction in Baptism, First Eucharist, and Confirmation. THE TRIPLE MISSION OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH:

Teaching, Sanctifying, and Governing in Christ's Name

The Catholic Church, established by Jesus Christ, carries a threefold mission: to teach, sanctify, and govern.

These distinct but interconnected responsibilities are rooted in Christ's own commands and His example, forming the very essence of the Church's purpose and activities in the world.

Let's delve into each of these missions to understand their significance and how they manifest in the life of the Church.

1. THE MISSION TO TEACH:



Proclaiming the Gospel to All Nations Biblical Foundation: Jesus commanded His apostles, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations,... teaching them to observe all that I have commanded vou" (Matthew 28:19–20).

This directive establishes the Church's fundamental role as a teacher, responsible for spreading the Gospel and instructing the faithful in Christian doctrine. Explanation:

The mission to teach is about proclaiming the truths of the Gospel and ensuring that every generation understands and lives according to God's revelation.

This includes catechesis, preaching, theological education, and moral instruction. The Church, through its bishops, priests, catechists, and educators, tirelessly works to share the teachings of Christ with all people.

Examples:

- Preaching and Homilies:

During Mass, priests and deacons deliver homilies that expound on Scripture and relate it to contemporary life, helping the faithful to understand and live out their faith.

- Catechism and Religious Education:

Catholic schools and parish religious education programs teach children and adults the doctrines of the faith, ensuring a strong foundation in Catholic teaching.

- Evangelization Efforts:

Missionaries and evangelists spread the Christian message to those who have not yet heard it, often risking their lives to bring the Gospel to distant lands.

2. THE MISSION TO SANCTIFY:



Administering the Sacraments and Leading in Holiness

Biblical Foundation: Christ also charged His apostles with the mission to sanctify, saying, "Baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the

Son, and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19) and "This is my body... Do this in remembrance of me" (Luke 22:19).

This authority to sanctify is further reinforced when He says, "Whose sins you shall forgive, they are forgiven them; and whose sins you shall retain, they are retained" (John 20:23).

Explanation:

The mission to sanctify involves the administration of the sacraments, which are outward signs instituted by Christ to

Through the sacraments, the Church helps the faithful grow in holiness, receive God's grace, and prepare for eternal life. The sacraments are the means by which the divine life is dispensed to us, transforming believers into the likeness of Christ.

Examples:

- Baptism:

Through Baptism, individuals are cleansed of original sin, become members of the Church, and begin their journey of faith.

- Eucharist:

The Church celebrates the Eucharist as the source and summit of Christian life, offering the Body and Blood of Christ to the faithful for their spiritual nourishment.

- Reconciliation (Confession):

The sacrament of Reconciliation provides a way for believers to confess sins, receive absolution, and restore their

3. THE MISSION TO GOVERN:



Guiding the Church Community in Faith and Morals Biblical Foundation: Jesus gave His apostles the authority to govern the Church, saying, "If he refuses to hear even the Church,

let him be to thee as the heathen and the publican... Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound also in heaven; and whatever you shall loose upon earth shall be loosed also in heaven" (Matthew 18:17–18).

He further affirmed this authority with the words, "He who hears you, hears me; and he who rejects you, rejects me" (Luke 10:16).

Explanation:

The mission to govern involves the Church's responsibility to lead and guide the faithful in faith and morals. This includes establishing and maintaining doctrinal unity, administering church laws, and making pastoral decisions that promote the spiritual welfare of the Church's members.

The authority to govern is exercised through the Magisterium, the Church's teaching authority, which includes the Pope and the bishops in communion with him.

Examples:

- Doctrinal Authority:

The Church defines and clarifies doctrines to ensure faithfulness to the teachings of Christ. Councils, such as the Council of Trent or Vatican II, have clarified and defined essential teachings in response to theological controversies.

Canon Law:

The Church's legal system, known as Canon Law, provides guidelines for governance, liturgy, marriage, and other aspects of ecclesial life, ensuring order and discipline within the Church.

- Pastoral Decisions and Discipline:

The Church makes decisions on pastoral matters such as the formation of clergy, the administration of sacraments, and the guidance of laypeople in their spiritual lives.

CONCLUSION:

The Church's Unified Mission in Service of God's Kingdom The threefold mission of the Catholic Church—teaching, sanctifying, and governing—reflects Christ's own ministry on earth and continues His work in the world today.

Through these missions, the Church fulfills her role as the Body of Christ, guiding the faithful in truth, bringing them closer to God through the sacraments, and governing them in love and justice.

Each mission is integral to the Church's identity and purpose, serving to build up the Kingdom of God and lead all people to salvation in Jesus Christ.

CORE (Christian Out Reach Effort)

Three days after Thanksgiving and the First Sunday of Advent is upon us. Fitting that these two themes occur so close together.

A way to express or show our gratitude for what we have is to share with those in need. This attitude is evident at Holy Ghost Parish. Our monthly CORE collection gives us a reminder of this attitude, as well as an opportunity to put it into practice.

With Advent comes our practice of the Giving Tree and the practice of outreach to those who need help putting food on the table. This past Easter you helped six-two families. That is a lot of people who were helped to have food for their Easter celebration. Because of you we can again help at Christmas.

In the Gospel we read," What you have done to others, you have done to me." And in Sirach 7:32 , "To the poor also extend your hand, that your blessings may be complete"
