

It is necessary that all couples desiring to be married at Holy Ghost Church call the parish office to schedule an appointment with a priest at least six months prior to the date of their wedding and BEFORE they set a date with a banquet facility. Please call us to register.

Our Religious Education Program builds and supports informed, practicing, and faith filled families. The program is held on select Sundays from September through April between 9:00-10:15 AM. THE NATURE OF GOD: A Catholic Exploration of **Divine Mystery**

The guestions "Who is God?", "Where is God?", "What is God?", "When was there a God?", and "How does He do what He does?" delve into the Catholic understanding of the divine.

Each question addresses different aspects of theology metaphysics, and philosophy as understood in the Catholic tradition.

Here's a Catholic perspective on these profound questions, along with examples to illustrate each concept.



1. WHO IS GOD?

Catholic Perspective:

In Catholicism, **God is the Supreme Being**, the Creator of the universe, and the ultimate source of all existence. God is understood as a Trinity—three Persons in one God: the Father, the Son (Jesus Christ), and the Holy Spirit. This mystery of the Trinity is central to Catholic faith and emphasizes that God is both one and relational.

- **God as Father**:

God the Father is seen as the Creator and Sustainer of all life. He is often described in relational terms, highlighting His desire for a personal relationship with each individual, as a loving parent cares for their children.

- **God as Son**:

In the Person of Jesus Christ, God becomes incarnate. Jesus, fully divine and fully human, reveals God's nature and will through His teachings, life, death, and resurrection. The Catholic understanding of Jesus as God emphasizes God's closeness to humanity and His willingness to suffer for the salvation of all.

- **God as Holy Spirit**:

The Holy Spirit is God active in the world, inspiring, guiding, and sustaining the Church and the faithful. The Spirit is seen as a helper and advocate, constantly working to bring about God's kingdom on earth.

Example: In the Gospel of John, Jesus says, "I and the Father are one" (John 10:30), illustrating the unity within the Trinity while also revealing the distinct roles each Person plays in the divine plan of salvation. The Catholic understanding of the Trinity invites believers into a relationship with a God who is both unity and community.



2. WHERE IS GOD?

**Catholic Perspective: ** In Catholic theology, God is omnipresent, meaning He is everywhere and not confined by space. God is both transcendent

(existing beyond the physical universe) and immanent (present within the universe and intimately involved with His creation).

- **Transcendence**:

God's transcendence indicates that He exists beyond all created things and is not limited by the physical constraints of space and time. God exists outside of creation but also sustains it. This concept is reflected in passages such as Isaiah 55:8-9: "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, declares the Lord. As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts. - **Immanence**:

God's immanence means that He is fully present in all parts of creation. Psalm 139 beautifully captures this idea, stating, "Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there" (Psalm 139:7-8). This suggests that God is intimately involved in every aspect of existence.

Example: The Catholic understanding of the Eucharist exemplifies God's immanence. Catholics believe that Christ is truly present in the bread and wine consecrated during the Mass. This presence is not symbolic but actual, demonstrating how God can be fully present in a specific place while also being everywhere.



3. WHAT IS GOD?

**Catholic Perspective: ** God, in Catholic teaching, is the Supreme Being, the Creator of all things, visible and invisible. God is

defined by His nature as omnipotent (all-powerful), omniscient (all-knowing), omnibenevolent (all-good), and omnipresent (everywhere present). The essence of God is love, as stated in 1 John 4:8: "Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love."

- **The Nature of God**:

God is a Trinity of Persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit each fully God, co-equal, and co-eternal. This understanding of God as a communion of persons emphasizes that God's very nature is relational and loving.

- **God's Attributes**:

Attributes of God include His eternity, meaning God has no beginning or end; His immutability, meaning He does not change; His simplicity, meaning He is not composed of parts; and His perfection, meaning He is complete and lacks nothing.

Example: The Trinity is a central mystery in Catholicism. It illustrates the complexity and depth of God's nature. Though there are three distinct Persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—they are one in essence. This can be loosely compared to the way water can exist as ice, liquid, and vapor but remains the same substance. However, this analogy is imperfect because God's oneness and threeness are far more profound.



4. WHEN WAS THERE A GOD?

Catholic Perspective: In Catholic teaching, God is eternal, meaning He exists outside of time and has no beginning or end. God

always was, is, and will be. The concept of God's eternity is central to understanding His nature as uncaused and self-existent.

- **Eternal Nature**:

Unlike created beings who have a beginning and an end, God's existence is necessary, meaning He is the ground of all being. God's name revealed to Moses in the burning



bush, "I AM WHO I AM" (Exodus 3:14), reflects His eternal and self-sustaining nature.

Timelessness:

God's existence is not bound by time; He exists in an eternal present. Saint Augustine, in his "Confessions," explains that God's view of time is different from human experience. God sees all of time—past, present, and future—simultaneously.

Example: The concept of God's eternity can be visualized by imagining a timeline. Humans perceive time linearly, moving from past to present to future. God, however, sees the entire timeline at once. He is not confined to any single point in time but is present at all times, in every moment, eternally.

5. HOW DOES GOD DO WHAT HE DOES?

Catholic Perspective:

Catholicism teaches that God acts through His divine will, which is always aligned with His omniscience, omnipotence, and omnibenevolence. God's actions are executed through His providence, grace, and sometimes, through miracles. **Providence**

God's providence refers to His continuous guidance and governance of the world and the unfolding of human history. He orders all things according to His divine plan, working through natural laws and human free will. As stated in Romans 8:28, "We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose."

Grace:

God operates through grace, which is His freely given love and help to humans, enabling them to respond to His call and live as His children. This grace is essential for salvation and sanctification, allowing individuals to grow in holiness and follow God's will.

- **Miracles**

At times, God intervenes directly in the natural order through miracles, which are extraordinary events that manifest His power and serve as signs of His presence and action in the world. Examples include the miracles of Jesus, such as turning water into wine (John 2:1-11) and raising Lazarus from the dead (John 11:1-44).

Example: One example of God's providence in Catholic teaching is the story of Joseph in the Old Testament. Though sold into slavery by his brothers, Joseph rises to a position of power in Egypt. Through a series of events that seem tragic, God's plan unfolds for the good of His people, demonstrating how God can bring good out of even the worst circumstances (Genesis 50:20).

CONCLUSION:

The Catholic Understanding of God In Catholic theology, God is omnipresent, transcending space while being fully immanent within it. God is a Trinity of Persons, each fully divine, eternal, and unchangeable.

He exists outside of time, having no beginning or end, and His actions are expressions of His will, carried out through providence, grace, and sometimes miracles.

Understanding God in this way calls Catholics to a relationship of love, trust, and faith, recognizing God's profound mystery and His intimate involvement in the world.




