From the Pastor (continued)

Dear Emmanuel Friedens,

Don't look now, but Lent is barreling toward us on February 18th. It will be a momentous week starting with Presidents' Day on Monday, the Lunar New Year on Tuesday, and Ash Wednesday on the 18th. It always makes me pensive when holidays line up like this—a decidedly United States celebration, a day that is big for Chinese culture and new beginnings, and then Ash Wednesday, which is the beginning of a period of contemplative journeying for Christians.

This Lent we will be contemplating Jesus' journey toward the cross as it unfolds, in order through John. As it does, we will pair it with *The Lord's Prayer*. I love this, because *The Lord's Prayer* is a heart's prayer. It is the kind of prayer to have in your back pocket when words fail, and you need to pray something, but you do not necessarily know what. In this way, it fits the feeling of Lent, and probably most of our feelings about the world right now.

Prayer is a very dear topic for me. I ended up writing an entire doctoral thesis and semi-book-like thing on it. I feel like prayer is about processing your way through things the best that you can. As such prayer is many things. When you look at the Psalms especially, you realize that there are many types, tones and pieces to praying. It can be something you read that is pre-written. It can be an activity, it can be extemporaneous, it can be a conversation between people, it can be music or song, it can be a protest, it can be sweet contemplative silence, or it can be one of the Christian originals, *The Lord's Prayer*.

When we ask "Lord Teach Me to Pray?" I think about what is behind the question. We are asking to walk closer to Jesus, to get to know our Divine made selves better, to understand the movements of the Holy Spirit in our lives better. Prayer is less about having the right words, and more about a way of being. To be prayerful, is to live into the promises from Lent to Easter, to understand that temptations and debts will give way to forgiveness and the kin(g)dom of God. This is why I feel especially blessed that we will be doing Sunday School activities after worship each week to live into the Worship that we have experienced together—because praying with your feet is one of the best ways to pray. Frederick Douglas said "Praying for Freedom never did me any good til I started praying with my feet." Thus, as we journey into Lent together, I look forward to praying in all the ways with you.

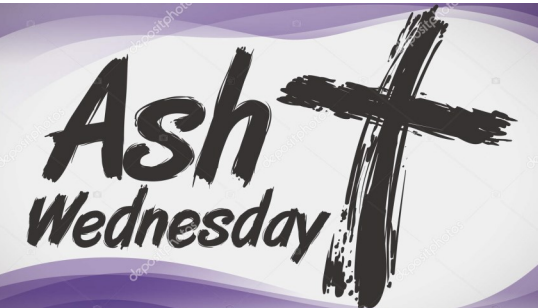
