### **Finance Committee Update—**

Taking a break from clearing SNOW to share the financial state of the church with everyone. As you can imagine the snow removal from this intense and quick starting winter is well on its way to meeting or exceeding the budgeted forecast, however it is a much-needed expense to ensure everyone’s safety. I am ready to see that first spring crocus pop out of the ground, how about you?

For fiscal 2025 we did end up in the red mainly because we fell short of our income projections as most of the expenses came in under budget. Thanks to our Trustees and other volunteers who donate time and product to help keep the expenses down. Thanks also to our staff for keeping the heat not too high and keeping an eye out for unnecessary lights left on.

For the 6<sup>th</sup> straight year, we paid our apportionments to the conference in full. We have begun some flooring projects with funds through the generosity of George T. Walker via the Lehigh Valley Foundation. This grant is given to us annually with the funds geared towards physical upkeep of the church and projects are determined by the Trustees with the idea of keeping the church in good condition for future generations.

Please, besides your weekly giving to the church General Fund (which covers ministries/operating expenses/ payroll/pastoral care/outreach...just to name a few), please help support our additional fundraisers. We have the 6 soup sales over the autumn and winter. We have the lasagna dinner in March/ Chicken BBQ in April/ Pork dinner in November. These dinners can be supported by donating towards supplies, attending or serving, (clean-up too!) Let’s hope for great weather in the last full week of August as we will be having our food stand at the West End Fair for the 4<sup>th</sup> year. Lots of ways to help with that fundraiser.

All gifts come from God. Whatever gifts we have, don’t hide them under a basket but share them and see what a difference we each can make.
