A TEMP FOSTER FOR AHS

As most of you know, our pets are all in temporary foster homes until the perfect permanent home can be found. Like our pets, Audrain Humane Society has also been actively seeking a temporary home, and we are excited to announce we have found one.

On August 1st, Audrain Humane Society held the first monthly meeting at our new location located at 211 West Monroe Street.

To be clear, **NO** pets are being housed at this location. We remain 100% foster based.

The new location gives AHS a home for our regular board and committee meetings, to store supplies, meet fosters, have a meet and greet with adopters and gives ample room to grow.

If you are a current foster, we will now be doing all booster vaccines at the new office space on specifically designated dates and times. If you need supplies, your Pet Pal Contact will meet you at the new location to pick up food, cat litter, flea/tick treatment, etc. You can also bring your foster pet here for special activities like the Soybean Festival.

With Pet Pals, Audrain Humane Society is growing. Our new space has a lot of potential, and we are excited to discover what the future has in store.

PET PALS - REUNITING PETS!!

Our Pet Pal Team is dedicated to the welfare of all the pets in the Pet Pal program. In July, our Care Team Coordinator presented a low – cost option to microchip all Pet Pal Pets that can be included without raising adoption fees.

All Pet Pal Pets will now be microchipped, and all adopters will be able to register their pets prior to leaving the new office. The pet will be registered not only to their new owner but also to Audrain Humane Society for life.

We are proud to offer this option to keep our pets united with their adopter or returned to Pet Pals if circumstances have changed.

We will also offer microchip service to all previous Pet Pal adopters for just \$20 per pet. Of course, any money raised from microchipping will be used solely for the Pets in our care.

If you find a pet, keep in mind that it could be one of ours. So many cats who are found are never scanned for microchips. All strays can be scanned at no cost at the vet's office or by asking Pet Pals. Always have a found stray scanned in hopes to reunite them with their rightful owners.

FELINE FRIENDS




Another new introduction coming soon is the combo vaccine for our cats.

If you are a current cat foster, please consider having your cat tested for and protected against Felv and don't forget to notify us if your cat is positive.

They all answered the plea for help and accepted dogs from the shelter into their rescue. This endeavor saved lives and provided the shelter with the space they needed to operate efficiently.

In August, we were notified of a hoarding situation outside Middletown. Like the Martinsburg hoarding case back in June, several dogs were living in filth and neglect. We safely removed



21 dogs from the property with the help of three other rescues. No Time to Spare, Diamonds in the Ruff, and Needy Paws St Louis did not hesitate to join us in this effort, and we could not have done this without them. The dogs were divided between Pet Pals, these three rescues and Columbia Second Chance. These dogs are missing most of their fur, have eye issues, masses, and infections but they are now receiving all the care they need.
