THE MOST HOLY BODY and BLOOD of CHRIST

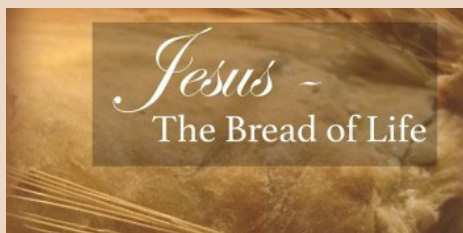
Today's Readings:

**Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16; Psalm 147:12-15, 19-20
1 Corinthians 10:16-17; John 6:51-58**

How Jesus in the Eucharist Helps us in Difficulties

This Sunday we celebrate the Sacrament of the Eucharist and the reason why we believe it is truly and physically the presence of Jesus.

In the first reading, we're reminded that God our Father always provides the food and drink that we need for survival in the desert days of life's hardships. What he did for the Israelites, he does for us today in whatever ways we experience hot trials and dry faith. He provides what we need by giving us the True Presence of Christ, who comes to us in the bread of Mass (the Eucharist), and in the presence of his Holy Spirit dwelling within us (Baptism and Confirmation), and in the priest whose ordination makes Jesus present to us in Confession.



The second reading tells us that the Eucharist increases our unity with Christ's body on earth, the church community through which he provides the various resources that we need. In this unity — when it's activated as it should be — no one lacks anything good because all necessary goods are shared. And ultimately in this unity, as Jesus said in the Gospel, we're assured of eternal life in heaven, where all needs are met perfectly and completely.

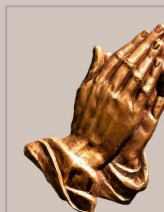

Explore the Gospel as a family: John 6: 51-58 – The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) – *Corpus Christi* is a feast that helps us remember the gift of the Eucharist. It is a day to focus on Jesus as the bread of life. It reminds us that God provides what we need, not only for our bodies but also for our souls. It also reminds us that we are one body in Christ. When we share the bread and cup, we are united as His people. It is a gift that nourishes us, strengthens us, and draws us closer to God and to one another. Family Chat: Do you realize that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist? How do you prepare to receive him? What do you think Jesus means when he says, “I am the living bread”?

Family Activity: Use some Legos to build a human shape. Talk about how each piece of Lego might represent another person in the parish that is part of the Body of Christ. The Church with her members share talent, time and treasure to maintain the Body of Christ. How does that work? Discuss how the different talents of everyone in the parish work together to show Christ to the world.

Family Prayer: Lord, thank You for the gift of the Eucharist. Help us to trust in You, to be grateful for all You give, and to receive Your Body and Blood with faith. 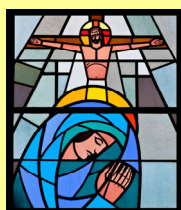
