We welcome your child to be baptized at Mater Dolorosa Church. Baptisms take place the fourth Saturday of every month at 11:30 a.m. Baptism Preparation Class is offered for families of scheduled baptisms, the third Saturday of every month at 11:30 a.m. Parents should contact the Parish Center *three months prior* to the desired date of the baptism to allow for preparation and for scheduling.

Families must be enrolled in Family Faith Formation one year prior to the direct preparation for each Sacrament.

Families must be enrolled in Family Faith Formation one year prior to the direct preparation for the reception of Confirmation.

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, & Joseph:

**Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14; Psalm 128:1-5;
 Colossians 3:12-21; Matthew 2:13-15,19-23**

How to Have Holy Families

The scriptures for this Feast Day instruct us on how to have holy families. The reading from Sirach tells children (young and old) to “honor” and “revere” their parents, to be considerate of them when they get old and feeble and to be kind to them.

The reading from Colossians instructs us to “put on love, the bond of perfection”, and to make sure that the peace of Christ controls our hearts. How? Saint Francis de Sales put it this way: “Never be in a hurry; do everything quietly and in a calm spirit. Do not lose your inner peace for anything whatsoever, even if your whole world seems upset.”

Verse 18 is not saying that wives should do this by obeying their husbands as if in a child-father relationship. To understand this scripture, replace the word “subordinate” or “submit” with “accept his loving protection”.

God has put the husband in charge of providing protection for the family (which is why in the Gospel reading it's Joseph, not Mary, who was given the dream). This includes spiritual protection, teaching holiness and leading the family to heaven.


Our Annual Archdiocesan Annual Appeal for 2025 has exceeded our goal as soon as all pledges are received.




