**January 4, 2026**  
**The Epiphany of the Lord**

**Isaiah 60:1-6; Ps 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-13;  
 Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6; Matthew 2:1-12**

Where did the faith of the Magi come from?

The Season of Christmas includes the celebration of the arrival of the magi from the East. Let's consider the humble adoration of the magi for the Christ child. The magi were Gentiles, and the Greek word "magi" meant oriental scientists. Despite sometimes being translated as "astrologers", their visit to the manger does not validate astrology.

Because they were not Jews, their determination to meet the Jewish savior says much about what the word "epiphany" means. The magi are good examples of believing in the importance of Jesus even without understanding what it would mean to them personally or to the rest of the world.

Only the Spirit of God can move someone to have faith, because faith is a gift of the Holy Spirit (see 1 Corinthians 12). The word "epiphany" means discovery, a revelation that changes our lives. Epiphanies are gifts from God as he collaborates with our desire for new growth.

We can imagine how the magi felt when they experienced an epiphany in the presence of the Christ child. Although they did not understand how this baby from a poor family could become king, they remembered him for the rest of their lives and listened for news from the land of Israel about Jesus. **Family Chat:** The Magi followed the star without knowing exactly where it would lead. This reminds us that our faith journey is not always clear, but we trust God. We are called to follow Him, even when the path is hard. What are some challenges that make it hard to stay on the right path? What is one way you can give your time, gifts, or effort to God or others this week?

**Family Challenge:** Your challenge this week is to follow your star. That means choosing one thing that helps guide you closer to Jesus and sticking with it, even when it's not easy. Maybe it's making time for prayer each day, being kind to someone who needs a friend, or just staying honest when it's tempting to take shortcuts. Like the Magi, you don't need to know how everything will turn out—you just need to take the next step with faith.

**Meet Our Extended Family : Saint Anselm of Canterbury - Bishop, Confessor, Doctor of the Church (1033-1109)** Doctor magnificus (Magnificent Doctor), Doctor Marianus (Marian Doctor), "Father of Scholasticism" – Monk, Prior, Abbott, Archbishop, Theologian, Philosopher. Anselm was born in or around Aosta in Upper Burgundy sometime between April 1033 and April 1034. At the age of fifteen, Anselm desired to enter a Monastery but, failing to obtain his father's consent, he was refused by the Abbot. The illness he then suffered has been considered a emotional effect of his disappointment but upon his recovery he gave up his studies and for a time lived a carefree life. Twelve years later, after careless disinterest in religion and years of worldly living, he finally fulfilled his desire to be a monk. He entered the monastery of Bec in Normandy, was elected prior three years later, and 15 years later, was unanimously chosen abbot. Considered an original and independent thinker, Anselm was admired for his patience, gentleness, and teaching skill.

**Family Prayer: Saint Anselm Prayer** - O my God teach my heart where and how to seek you, where and how to find you... You are my God and you are my All and I have never seen you. You have made me and remade me, You have bestowed on me all the good things I possess, Still I do not know you... I have not yet done that for which I was made....Teach me to seek you... I cannot seek you unless you teach me or find you unless you show yourself to me. Let me seek you in my desire, let me desire you in my seeking. Let me find you by loving you, let me love you when I find you. Amen. <https://young-catholics.com/>
