November 23, 2025 Our Lord, Jesus Christ, King of the Universe Today's Readings:

2 Samuel 5:1-3; Ps 122:1-5; Colossians 1:12-20; Luke 23:35-43

What the Authority of Jesus Looks Like

In this Sunday's Gospel reading, one of the criminals hanging next to Jesus on the cross represents us. Jesus is our king and we want to spend eternity with him in his kingdom. As long as we have this attitude, there is no rea-



son to doubt that when we die we will join Jesus in Paradise. Let's look at what the authority of Jesus is like. At the Last Supper, when he washed the feet of his disciples, he made it clear that the heavenly king exerts his authority by serving those who belong to his kingdom.

The next day, he took a crown of thorns instead of a crown of gold, because the glory of his kingship is not represented by earthly treasures but by riches that are given to others, the personal sacrifices that are motivated by love, even for those who don't deserve it.

After his resurrection, although he'd been healed from the destruction of death, his five crucifixion wounds were not healed. To this day, he still bears those wounds as a continual reminder to us that he does not use his authority for his own benefit, but for ours. Earthly kings wear expensive rings on their hands; our heavenly king wears the marks of sacrifice

We belong to God's kingdom when we lovingly serve others with Christ, when we understand the glory of giving generously to others, of making personal sacrifices, and of loving those who don't deserve our love. If we offer to Jesus our sufferings because we realize that they have value, we wear the five wounds of Jesus in our souls. Of course we will join Jesus in Paradise — we have already united ourselves to him!

Family Chat: In today's Gospel story, the people who do not recognize Jesus as King treat him cruelly. Do you think people today recognize Jesus as King? Why or why not? Which of the two criminals in today's story treated Jesus as King?

Liturgy Link: Today's Gospel tells us about the inscription on the cross. Find a crucifix in your church and see if you can find the inscription. What are the four letters you see? These letters represent the Latin inscription, Jesus the Nazarene, King of the Jews.

Meet Our Extended Family: Blessed Sebastian Kimura (Feast Day September 10) Sebastian Kimura was born in Japan in 1565 to Christian parents. As a matter of fact, Sebastian's grandfather was the first Japanese convert to be baptized by St. Francis Xavier. At the age of 12, Sebastian began learning and working with the Jesuits in Japan. He was 19 when he formally entered the Society of Jesus. In 1601, Sebastian became one of the first Japanese natives to be ordained a priest. It was around this time that the Japanese began persecuting Christians, and many foreign missionaries were forced to leave the country. As a Japanese native, Sebastian was able to remain in Japan and move around freely by disguising himself as a soldier, merchant, or laborer. He used his disguises to visit Christian families and administer the sacraments to people in prisons. When it became clear that the police were looking for him, Sebastian's superiors urged him to flee, but he was captured before he could leave and died a martyr for the faith. Sebastian and 204 companions were beatified by Pope


