Dear St. Raymond's Family,

How the Virgin Mary parallels the Ark of the Covenant

The Book of Revelation, in parts at least, reads like an action-adventure movie. Chapter 11 ends with a cliffhanger and the promise of a very big reveal in the verses to come.

"Then God's temple in heaven was opened, and the Ark of his Covenant was seen within his temple. ..."

Now, those of us who grew up with Indiana Jones know the kind of suspense that line can generate even now. Just imagine the excitement it roused in the first century A.D.

The Ark of the Covenant, built to hold the relics of the Exodus, had not been seen in centuries. It disappeared from historical records after the Babylonian conquest of Jerusalem in 586 B.C. According to the Second Book of Maccabees (2:4–10), the prophet Jeremiah had hidden it in a cave to protect it from the invading army, and it was never recovered.

But now comes John the Seer, and he claims to have seen it.

What he describes, however, corresponds to no other description of the Ark. What he saw was not a golden box topped by a mercy seat. John says instead that he saw *"a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars; she was with child"* (12:1–2).

Wait. He promised us the Ark, but he showed us a woman. What happened here?

It's a riddle, and the solution is to be found in another book of the New Testament.

At the beginning of Luke's Gospel we also find a woman. Her name is Mary, and like the woman in Revelation she is pregnant.

But as Luke tells her story, he draws from Old Testament stories...not about a woman, but about a box: the Ark of the Covenant. He sets up subtle parallels between Mary's visitation and David's effort to bring the Ark to Jerusalem (see 2 Samuel 6).

Luke tells us that Mary "arose and went" into the hill country (Luke 1:39), just as David "arose and went" into the same region to retrieve the Ark (2 Samuel 6:2). When Mary arrived, Elizabeth was struck by awe and unworthiness before Mary (Luke 1:43) as David had felt before the Ark (2 Samuel 6:9).

Parallels continue as the joy of this encounter causes the preborn John to leap (Luke 1:41), much as David danced with excitement before the Ark (2 Samuel 6:16).

Finally, Luke adds that Mary stayed in the "house of Zechariah" for "three months" (Luke 1:40, 56), recalling how the Ark was stationed in the "house of Obed-edom" for "three months" (2 Samuel 6:11).

Taken together, these parallels show us that Mary now assumes a role in salvation history that was once played by the Ark of the Covenant. Like this golden chest, she is a sacred vessel where the Lord's presence dwells intimately with his people. (I bring out many more parallels in the *Ignatius Catholic Study Bible*.)

In the end, however, she rises above the hill country and even above Mount Zion as she is assumed to heaven, and there she awaits and intercedes for "the rest of her offspring" (Revelation 12:17). These are good reasons we celebrate on August 15 **[the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary]**.

I place you and your family under the guidance and protection of our Blessed Mother Mary and St. Joseph. St. Raymond Nonnatus, pray for us.

El libro del Apocalipsis, al menos en algunas partes, se lee como una película de acción y aventuras. El capítulo 11 termina con un final en suspenso y la promesa de una gran revelación en los versículos siguientes.

“Entonces se abrió el templo de Dios en el cielo, y el Arca de su Alianza se vio dentro de su templo...”

Quienes crecimos con Indiana Jones sabemos el tipo de suspense que esa frase puede generar incluso ahora. Imaginen la emoción que despertó en el siglo I.

El Arca de la Alianza, construida para guardar las reliquias del Éxodo, no se había visto en siglos. Desapareció de los registros históricos tras la conquista babilónica de Jerusalén en el 586 A.C. Según el 2º Libro de los Macabeos (2:4-10), el profeta Jeremías la había escondido en una cueva para protegerla del ejército invasor, y nunca fue recuperada.

Pero ahora llega Juan el Vidente, y afirma haberla visto.

Lo que describe, sin embargo, no se corresponde con ninguna otra descripción del Arca. Lo que vio no fue una caja de oro coronada por un propiciatorio. Juan dice, en cambio, que vio *“una mujer vestida del sol, con la luna bajo sus pies y sobre su cabeza una corona de doce estrellas; estaba encinta”* (12:1-2).

Un momento. Nos prometió el Arca, pero nos mostró a una mujer. ¿Qué sucedió aquí? Es un enigma, y la solución se encuentra en otro libro del Nuevo Testamento.

Al comienzo del Evangelio de Lucas también encontramos a una mujer. Se llama María, y al igual que la mujer del Apocalipsis, está embarazada.

Pero al narrar su historia, Lucas se inspira en relatos del Antiguo Testamento...no sobre una mujer, sino sobre una caja: el Arca de la Alianza. Establece sutiles paralelismos entre la visita de María y el esfuerzo de David por llevar el Arca a Jerusalén (véase 2 Samuel 6). Lucas nos dice que María se levantó y fue a la región montañosa (Lucas 1:39), al igual que David se levantó y fue a la misma región para recuperar el Arca (2 Samuel 6:2). Cuando María llegó, Isabel se sintió sobrecogida y se sintió indigna ante María (Lucas 1:43), igual que David se había sentido ante el Arca (2 Samuel 6:9).

Los paralelismos continúan: la alegría de este encuentro hace saltar al nonato Juan (Lucas 1:41), de la misma manera que David danzó de emoción ante el Arca (2 Samuel 6:16).

Finalmente, Lucas añade que María permaneció en la “casa de Zacarías” durante “tres meses” (Lucas 1:40, 56), recordando cómo el Arca estuvo estacionada en la “casa de Obed-edom” durante “tres meses” (2 Samuel 6:11).

En conjunto, estos paralelismos nos muestran que María ahora asume un papel en la historia de la salvación que antes desempeñaba el Arca de la Alianza. Al igual que este cofre de oro, ella es un recipiente sagrado donde la presencia del Señor habita íntimamente con su pueblo. (Expongo muchos más paralelismos en *la Biblia de Estudio Católica de Ignacio*).

Al final, sin embargo, se eleva sobre la región montañosa e incluso sobre el Monte Sión al ser elevada al cielo, y allí espera e intercede por “el resto de su descendencia” (Apocalipsis 12:17). Estas son buenas razones por las que celebramos el 15 de agosto **[la Solemnidad de la Asunción de la Santísima Virgen María]**.

Y los pongo bajo el amparo y protección de la Santísima Virgen María y San José. San Ramón Nonato, ruega por nosotros.

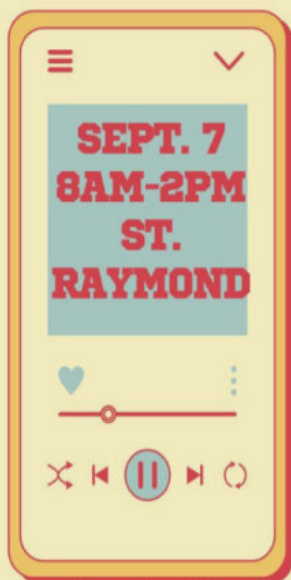

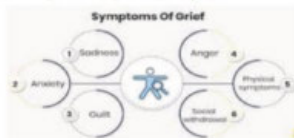

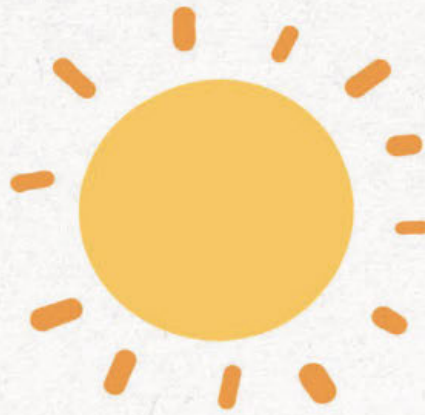
