# Welcome to Trinity! We are glad to have you worship with us this morning!

Our ultimate purpose in life is to glorify God and enjoy him forever. One of the greatest ways we can do this is to worship God corporately with God's people. At TPC we plan a worship service that is God-centered, God-directed, God-glorifying, anchored in the historical richness of tradition and is understandable by today's culture. This worship service seeks to focus on the majesty and grace of God through the use of the Scriptures, hymns (new & old), the sacraments, and prayer.

What follows is a liturgy or plan for our worship service. It seeks to tell the story of the gospel of grace. We are called by God into his presence to worship him alone. We remember the holiness and majesty of God and so we recognize our need of cleansing because of our sin. We remember the perfect provision God has made for us through Jesus Christ and his atoning death on the cross. We respond with thanksgiving. We are instructed by God through his Word. We commune with him through the Lord's Supper. And we are sent out with God's blessing.

As we worship God together through this re-enactment of the gospel, we pray that we will all grow in our knowledge of and love for the Lord, for one another, and in our desire to serve him in all we do.

#### Children in the service

We believe God calls us to nurture and disciple our children in the faith. One of the ways we do this is through corporate worship. So, children are welcome to be with the congregation during the entire service. A room for nursing mothers is available on the north side of the sanctuary. The foyer can be used for children who are crying or need some extra attention. There are speakers enabling you to hear the service in both locations. A nursery is available (when staffing is available) off the main hallway for children from birth through three years of age.

# Standing and sitting

During parts of the service the congregation is asked to stand (indicated by the † in the bulletin). However, we understand that some are not able to stand for various reasons, and we hope that you will feel free to remain seated.

### Giving

Our members and regular attenders contribute financially to the Lord's work in and through our church. Visitors should feel no obligation to give. If you do not own a Bible or know someone who does not own a Bible, please accept a free copy of the Scriptures to take with you. You can find one at the Welcome Center in the foyer.



  peace as he and his wife adjust to recent health changes. Pray for Tary as she continues to care for her
  parents in Wyoming. She has felt upheld by the prayers of this congregation. Pray for wisdom and clarity
  about the timing of her return home to Minnesota.
- Praise God for Dave Montalvo's steady recovery and increasing strength. Give thanks for an encouraging
  consultation with his hand surgeon, who said surgery is not needed at this time and will follow up in
  October. Pray for continued healing and a smooth transition back to work.
- Praise the Lord for the Trinity visitors who have been visiting Mayo patient Cathy Wells while her husband is
  away and she recovers from surgery. Continue to pray for healing of her shoulder and for successful PT/OT
  so she can return home at the end of August.
- Pray for Philip Goetz and Elsie (December) as they prepare for their wedding. Give thanks for the marriage
  of Parker and Greta Blezek. Continue to pray for this couple as they begin marriage together, and also
  support Greta's father as he goes through treatment for cancer.
- Continue to pray for Andrea Van Wyk (due in September), Rebecca Schwen (November), Jenny Knutson (December), and others in their earlier months of pregnancy. Please continue to pray for Andrea Van Wyk and the baby she is carrying as she has placenta previa. It is a fairly unusual case and could become serious if she were to go into labor unexpectedly. Please pray for the condition to resolve prior to when it is time for her to deliver. Pray for her doctors to have great wisdom and discernment. Pray also for those grieving the loss of a child and for those longing for children, that they would know the Lord's comfort and peace.
- Ask God to prepare the hearts of our Children's Ministry volunteers for a fruitful year of service beginning in September when our Sunday School and fall worship schedule begins. Also pray that God would raise up the next generation to love and serve him faithfully and courageously.
- Pray for those with ongoing or new medical needs, including Kent and Larina Brobst, Gail DeBoer, Steve and Gail DeFoster, and Elizabeth Runyon. Continue to pray for baby Alex, grandson of Keith and Ramie Phillips, as he continues to experience seizures despite medication increases. Pray for wisdom for his doctors as they adjust his treatment, and for peace and strength for his parents, Brooke and Spencer as they care for him. Also pray for Andy & Debbie Vaughn's 8 year old granddaughter, Kenna, has been having some health issues recently and was diagnosed as having seizures. An MRI scan has revealed either a congenital issue or a low-grade type of brain cancer. Please pray for Kenna, her parents (Abbie and Pat), and for Andy and Debbie as they walk through this very difficult season.
- Pray also for those battling cancer including Allison King and Phoebe Dumond. Pray for continued health, strength, and minimal side effects for Phoebe as she begins long-term oral treatment and monitoring.

# A Big Picture View of TPC—Our Purpose-Plan-Principles

### **<u>Purpose</u>** — Why does TPC exist – what is our purpose?

Our purpose is to make mature, grace-filled disciples of Christ who are growing in their knowledge and love for God, for people, and in their desire and ability to serve in the kingdom of God for God's glory.

- Matthew 28 the great commission to the church → make disciples
- Matthew 22 the great commandment to the church  $\rightarrow$  love God and love people
- Ephesians 4 equipping the saints for ministry and building up the body in love

### <u>Plan</u> — How will TPC accomplish our purpose of making mature, grace-filled disciples of Christ?

- (1) We plan to help people grow in knowledge and love for God by:
  - having weekly worship that is God-centered, God-directed, God-glorifying; is anchored in the historical richness of tradition; is understandable by today's culture; presents the grace of God; focuses on the Word, sacraments, and prayer
  - providing an education program for adults and children
- (2) We plan to help people grow in knowledge and love for others by:
  - encouraging gospel-centered community through small groups and fellowship opportunities
- (3) We plan to help people grow in their desire and ability to serve in the kingdom of God by:
  - equipping/training people to serve inside and outside TPC
  - providing opportunities for people to serve on committees and ministries inside TPC
  - sending people to serve in the kingdom of God with organizations/ministries outside TPC

# **<u>Principles</u>** —What are the things most important to us?

- (1) *Scripture* We are committed to the inerrant Word of God, which is inspired by the Holy Spirit, is the revelation of God's truth, and is infallible, authoritative, and trustworthy in all matters of faith and practice.
- (2) *Grace* We are committed to the gospel of God's amazing grace as the foundation of all we do at TPC and as the primary motivation for growing into mature disciples.
- (3) *Reformed Theology* We are committed to the reformed faith as it is articulated in the Westminster Confession of Faith & Catechisms and to teaching that is a warm and winsome demonstration of it.
- (4) Missions We are committed to the gospel going out into every aspect of culture, locally and globally.
- (5) *Discipleship* We are committed to a life-long process of growing in Christian maturity and Christ-likeness.
- (6) *Fellowship* We are committed to building community within the church by demonstrating God's love for us in our love for each other.
- (7) *Welcoming* We are committed to being a welcoming community open and welcoming to both Christians and non-Christians to the convinced and to the skeptic.
- (8) *Growing* We are committed to being a growing community internally as members of TPC grow both numerically and in Christ-likeness and externally as we see churches planted in SE MN for God's glory.

### THE LORD'S SUPPER

We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ and are under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the wine with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to the elders of this local church that you are in covenant with God and an active member of a congregation in which the gospel is faithfully confessed, taught, and believed. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for salvation. The Lord's Supper is a sacrament of bread & wine. For those who prefer, grape juice is provided in the tinted cups at the center of the communion trays. If you have any questions about participating, please speak with one of the elders before or after the service.

### Prayer for those searching for truth

Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Grant that I might be unafraid of the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Give me an understanding of you that is clear, convincing, and that leads to the life you promise. Amen.
