Challenge Partners

In 2022, Hove Park joined Challenge Partners to share practice, raise standards, and stay at the forefront of educational thinking.

Senior leaders completed two-day joint review visits at other schools to support self-evaluation and improvement. We also conduct an annual internal review. In November, four external senior leaders and a lead Ofsted inspector visited Hove Park for two days, meeting staff, students, governors, and observing lessons, assemblies, and tutor time. They were hugely impressed with the school, the culture and ethos. I've shared a couple of quotes from their report;

The school holds the Wellbeing Award, and a caring ethos runs throughout.

The curriculum is ambitious and has been carefully planned to develop the students' necessary skills, knowledge and cultural capital to succeed in life.

Technology is used effectively to enhance students' learning. All students have an iPad and access lesson notes on One Note, enabling them to revisit learning and catch up if absent.

The 'Every Child Should' enrichment offer motivates and inspires students to gain experiences beyond the classroom promoting inclusion and a sense of belonging.

GCSE Results

Senior Student Council



As part of our ECS scheme there are a team of Year 8 Every Child Should Ambassadors. They promote the reward scheme in the school by talking in assemblies, visiting tutor groups and will be at our Open Evening and Open Morning events. They have a great understanding of how others can earn their stars and will be able to explain how they earned theirs.

Year 9 Ramadan Assembly

Students from the Year 9 Equalities group delivered an assembly to educate their peers about Ramadan. The students demonstrated incredible maturity, and the assembly was extremely informative. We have students that follow many different religions at Hove Park School, and we value the diversity we have. We hope to follow this with more student led assemblies that celebrate the different cultures and religions in our student cohort.

Rainbow Bake Sale

Students from the Year 7 and 8 Equalities groups organised a rainbow bake sale to raise money for Stonewall, a charity that advocates for the LGBTQ+ community. This followed on from student led assemblies in February, to celebrate LGBTQ+ month, where students educated their peers about how to be an advocate for the LGBTQ+ community.

UK Army Logistics

Thanks to the UK Army Logistics who came in to tell our Year 10 students all about working for the British Army. We learned loads! We also worked in teams to construct the tallest tower and tested our fitness levels out with some military fitness drills.

Benfield Valley Hike

Under a bright sky and the rolling backdrop of the South Downs, Year 7 students once again set out on the annual Benfield Valley Hike that has become a cornerstone of our school's calendar.

Organised as part of our Every Child Should initiative, the event begins at the Valley Campus and winds through Benfield Valley before returning home, giving students a physical challenge and the chance to build resilience, teamwork and lasting memories beyond the classroom.





Houses of Parliament and Westminster

In October, 40 students from Year 10 went to the Houses of Parliament and Westminster Abbey as part of their PRE studies, in anticipation of their Year 11 course on the long history of democracy and parliament in the UK, stretching back to when it met in the Abbey Chapter House. They had a tour of both chambers in the Houses of Parliament and took part in a seminar looking at voting issues. After lunch, we looked at statues and the Jewel Tower before touring Westminster Abbey, packed with the tombs of kings, national figures, poets and the unknown warrior. Students also enjoyed the superb architecture and art works in the Abbey. With tombs of Mary and Elizabeth and Mary Queen of Scots to see in situ the trip was also useful for history GCSE.


Year 8 Bake Sale

Classical Architecture Tour

Six students from the KS4 Classics club went on a tour of Classical Regency architecture in Hove. Most Fridays, in Classics club, they study Homer's Odyssey, with forays into Roman art and culture. However, this time the students analysed the elements of Classical architecture in Hove. They studied the different orders, such as Doric, Ionic, and Corinthian, and learned to recognise other features, as well as how Classical architecture is an assemblage of parts with a beginning, middle, and end that mirror each other.





The Social Enterprise Challenge

Hove Park students participated in the Social Enterprise Challenge, the flagship program of the Brighton & Hove Albion Foundation for secondary school partners in the Sussex network.

Our students were invited to the Amex Stadium for the launch of the challenge, where they learned about the initiative aimed at empowering them to develop youth-led social action projects. Careers

Some of our Year 10 students went to find out about careers in leisure and tourism, at the iconic Brighton Pier @BTNPalacePier. They had a tour, split into teams and took part in a mocked-up 'assessment centre' – just as would-be employees do in real life. They were tasked with creating a new mascot, coming up with a business plan to 'sell' the Pier to investors, and designing a new product to market to visitors. They all worked hard to come up with thoughtful ideas and to present in front of the Pier management team, and got brilliant feedback for their creativity and concepts. Well done Year 10!



EcoTeam

Our EcoTeam celebrated another successful year working with other secondary schools to make our schools more sustainable. We visited Varndean School and even made smoothies from "out-of-date" but perfectly delicious fruit. We were impressed by their excellent recycling systems and enjoyed a walk through the Dorothy Stringer nature reserve, where we spotted 20 different species of butterfly and moth.

We're very excited to start our own biodiversity journey next year, supported by a £1,000 grant from South Downs Trust to Rewild Hove Park School. This funding will help us develop new habitats, run citizen science projects, and broaden awareness of environmental stewardship within our community.





Students Excel in DofE Award

The Duke of Edinburgh award is an outstanding mark of achievement for a young person and it begins with the Bronze Award, which Hove Park offers to all students in Year 9. Nearly 100 students from year 9 took the opportunity to begin the award and have been making progress towards completion.

After enrolment in September, Year 9 students began achieving their goals in activities in three sections; volunteering, a skill and a physical activity. Many students gained credit for all the amazing things they were already doing setting their own goals to become a better goal-scorer, achieve level 3 piano or learn an instrument from scratch or learning a language.


Many students discovered volunteering for the first time working with young people in primary schools, helping on the school allotment or in after school clubs in primary schools where they had been pupils or being a volunteer with Park Run. Many students have completed some of their sections, others are still ongoing.

The highlight is the expedition which happened in June. About 90 students, half of the Year 9 cohort, took the opportunity to go on the Bronze Expedition, for many the icing on the cake of the award. After training in navigation and campcraft and help with planning, they completed a two-day hike in the South Downs National Park in perfect summer weather, showing their ability to be self-reliant, work as a team, be resilient in the face of adversity, as well as practise the life skills they had learned.

In Year 10, those who had signed off their Bronze award, began the Silver in October. They continued activities to complete the sections or started something new. In the Summer term, they went on a practice expedition to Ashdown Forest, then their assessed expedition in Dovedale in

the Peak District. This was an amazing experience which has set up many of our students to go for Gold in sixth form!







Student Leaders

Year 8 Student Leaders are a group of exceptional students who have achieved all eight Every Child Should stars, by the end of Year 7. Their dedication and hard work have allowed them to explore new experiences and conquer challenges, that pushed them beyond their limits. From representing the school to taking on new challenges, joining clubs, assisting at parents' evenings, contributing to food fairs, and even participating in the HPS 5k race, these students have shown incredible determination and growth.

To further nurture their leadership skills, the Year 8 Student Leader Program offers a series of challenges divided into three distinct colours: blue, green, and red. Each student proudly wears a shield-shaped badge corresponding to the colour they are currently undertaking.

Year 8 Student Leaders regularly meet to plan various house activities within their tutor groups. These activities include: organising ice cream and book sales, contributing to Hove Park TV by filming club activities and conducting student

interviews, as well as assisting with tours during the Open Evening. Their commitment to making a positive impact on the school community is truly commendable.



China Trip

Students in the Mandarin Excellence Programme enjoyed a rich and immersive cultural and linguistic experience at Xi'an International Studies University (Yanta Campus) in China.

The programme combined daily Mandarin language courses with a variety of cultural activities, including traditional music and dance, martial arts, crafts, and local film screenings.

Our students also sampled authentic Chinese cuisine and took part in social exchange visits to iconic sites such as the Terracotta Warriors, the Great Tang All Day Mall, Xi'an Museum, and the City Wall. They engaged in meaningful activities with local Chinese students, including gift exchanges and collaborative projects, fostering cross-cultural understanding and friendships.

Highlights included the Welcome Ceremony, Closing Concert, and a vibrant cultural immersion at Yongxingfang.

Throughout the trip, students balanced structured learning with experiential enjoyment, all expertly guided by the staff and volunteers of Xi'an International Studies University. It was an unforgettable opportunity that greatly enhanced their Mandarin skills and appreciation of Chinese culture.

Goethe Institut in London

Students from Hove Park, Varndean and Cardinal Newman visited the Goethe-Institut in London. The Goethe-Institut is Germany's cultural institution abroad, which promotes the study of the German language worldwide and fosters international cultural exchange.

The visit focused on language skills for the new GCSE German specification and ended with a German meal in a lovely restaurant next to the Institut. Students enjoyed practical activities, cultural context discussions, and a brief tour of the center to learn about its global network and resources.

A Day of Athletic Excellence and Team Spirit





Tegan has been competing for Brighton Surf Lifesaving Club in the regional and national pool championships. At the Wessex Regional Nipper competition, Tegan medalled in seven out of the eight events, retaining her board, board rescue, and board relay titles. A week later, Tegan competed for the first time in the youth category at the Wessex Regionals. She gained a Gold in the manikin carry with fins, Silver in the obstacle race, and Bronze in the manikin carry without fins.



At the end of March, Tegan travelled to Cardiff for the Nippers British Surf Lifesaving Championships, where she competed against 98 other females in her age group. Tegan placed 8th in the tube rescue, 11th in the board rescue, 10th in the manikin relay, and 17th in the board and medley relay races.

Tegan had a fantastic finish to the season at the Youth British Surf Lifesaving Championships last weekend in Cardiff. Tegan placed 13th in the medley relay, 12th in the manikin carry with fins and manikin tow, 10th in the obstacle race, 5th in the manikin carry without fins, 4th in the manikin relay, and won Bronze in the line throw! We believe this is the first national medal for Team Brighton, and we are super proud!


New Scientist Live


