

EGC Steel Rules

RSO/CRSO must inspect and approve all member provided steel targets before use.

Steel targets can only be used in 3 areas

- Dedicated Steel pocket berm next to the shotgun fields
- Range 9
- Range 8
- Range 7 (rimfire range)

Types of steel/steel targets that are allowed:

- AR500: 3/8" thick (for centerfire pistol calibers, muzzle loaders, .22 mag, and any .17 rimfire)
- Mild smooth steel; AR400 or better >3/16" thick (for .22lr, .22l, .22 short)
- Commercially produced targets (i.e. dueling trees) in steel berm only

Steel Rules:

- Steel targets must be placed at the back of the berm (unless otherwise approved by RSO)
- Permanently mounted target (that do not swing/pivot backwards when hit) must be angled downward 20-45 degrees from the vertical
- Two attachment points must be used on steel targets that swing/pivot backward when hit, when hung. Target must be angled downward at 20-45 degrees

Minimum Steel target distances:

- Rimfire and Pistol calibers: 10 yards
- Shotgun (lead slugs) 200 meters (range 9 only)
- Centerfire Rifle calibers with muzzle velocity <3300 fps: 200m Range 9 Only

Ammo Restriction Rules on Club- Owned Steel Range 8 & 9:

- Amor Piercing ammo
- Solid bulled made of lead
- Rifle ammo containing any steel inside the projectile or in the jacket
- Shotgun shells with non-lead shot
- BBs from air guns
- Centerfire rifle calibers with unknown muzzle velocity or muzzle velocity >3300 fps

PROHIBITED STEEL TARGETS:

- Jacks
- If your steel target is outside of any of the above-mentioned targets, please see the RSO on duty for inspection and approval
