

## 2017 PEOPLE PATHWAYS PROGRESS REPORT

During 2017, the primary focus of People Pathways has been the development of a 2-mile segment of "PUTNAM NATURE TRAIL PHASE 2" that runs through beautiful rural central/western Putnam County between CR 150 West (Lone Star Road) and 300 West (Mount Olive Road).

We welcome this opportunity to share a few highlights as we gratefully acknowledge community partners who shared their time, talent, and treasure by contributing either funds, in-kind services, and/or reduced costs that helped create this segment of our community's growing multi-use trail system, our "linear park".

- **FUNDING**: A portion of Putnam County Community Foundation's "Envision 2016: Moving Putnam County Forward" Grant and a Duke Energy Foundation Grant to support environmental stewardship were funding partners.
- SCOUTING & TRAILBLAZING: With property and funding secured, the first brave volunteer "Scouts" and "Trailblazers" fought through brambles, briers, & brush to mark the trail for clearing.





• CLEARING: Initial clearing was done by Buzzi/Lone Star's "Big Rig" followed by Joe Spiker's Crew. During project development, care was taken within the 100-foot wide corridor to limit clearing to a 15-foot width for the multi-use trail to allow an ample border of trees and vegetation to preserve both the natural beauty of the area and wildlife habitat.





 HAULING, SPREADING, & GRADING, OH MY!!: With Hassler Trucking masterfully spreading 1,702 tons of Martin Marietta stone and Joe Spiker's Crew grading and compacting, an outstanding trail surface has been created to encourage healthy outdoor activities, walking, running, hiking, and bicycling.





• WELCOMING: On the east end, trail users will be greeted by trailhead parking designed by Civil Engineering Consultants, warmly welcomed by the trail shelter built by two volunteer master craftsmen with materials donated by ReMax Reality & Farmers Insurance, and encouraged to sit and rest-a-spell at the picnic table built by Putnam County Sheriff's Department. To further trail improvement, a Quail Forever volunteer reseeded the area and Green Street Maintenance tackled the job of invasive plant control and initial mowing.





On the west end, shared parking will be available at the DNR Fish & Wildlife parking area with access to the Putnam Nature Trail via a trail easement generously donated by DNR.

remaining items to finish at the time of this printing, such as staining, adding rail fencing, bollards, gates, and signage to complete this segment, we look forward to a trail opening celebration in the Spring.
