

Monthly Member Roundtable Top Takeaways October 13, 2020

The Institute is committed to keeping our members informed regarding cutting-edge developments. Below are the top highlights from Tuesday's October 13th member roundtable with Co-Chairs David Cohen and Mickey Silberman and Institute Legal Counsel Nita Beecher.

Highlights

- **1. Executive Order 13950.** Co-Chair Dave Cohen provided an update on The Institute's actions in response to EO 13050 which include:
 - Signing a letter with other employer organizations seeking rescission of the EO.
 - Preparing a public statement objecting to the EO and supporting affirmative action.
 - Holding meetings with OFCCP Director Leen seeking clarification on the EO's impact.
 - Sponsoring a public Town Hall on EO on 2 pm October 22nd with Director Leen and other employer organizations
- **2. Practical Impact of EO.** On practice impact of EO, Co-Chair Mickey Silberman said although debarment is possible, it is not likely. If Biden wins the election, the EO is likely be rescinded quickly.
- **3.** Letters to federal contractors on D&I. Silberman discussed the letters Microsoft and Wells Fargo received from OFCCP challenging their public statements in response to the #BLM protests.
- **4. Religious Freedom Regulations**. Institute Legal Counsel Nita Beecher noted that OFCCP's religious freedom regulations are expected to issue very shortly which The Institute felt were too broad.
- **5. AAP Verification Comments Due 11/13/2020.** David Cohen noted that OFCCP has issued its proposal for AAP verification and that The Institute will submit comments by November 13th. The initiative would establish a portal where federal contractors can annually verify completed AAPs and can use upload documents during audits.
- **6. EEOC Updates.** The Senate has confirmed three new EEOC commissioners: Keith Sanderling (R)(now Vice Chair), Andrea Lucas(R) and Joselyn Samuels (D). The EEOC issued proposed conciliation rules.
