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Financial Policies Related to Tuition and Non-Tuition Fees

Payment

An application fee of \$AUD132 for day students and boarding students must accompany the Application for Admission Form.

A **non-refundable** Enrolment Confirmation Fee of \$AUD750 per child/student is payable on confirmation of enrolment before the commencement of the child/student at the College, or at commencement if a place is not offered in advance. \$100 of the enrolment confirmation fee is for life membership of the Fairholme Old Girls' Association. In the case of Visa refusal, the enrolment confirmation fee will be considered in any refund calculation. Please see our Refund Policy.

The Australian Department of Home Affairs (Immigration) requires us to complete a Confirmation of Enrolment for International Students before they will issue a student visa. ***Before we complete this form we require payment of 1 study period or semester (not more than 24 weeks) of tuition fees as detailed in the following 2023 Schedule of Fees.***

These tuition fees will be deposited into an approved Trust Account established for the deposit of tuition fees paid in advance by International students. These tuition fees will remain in this Trust Account and will be drawn down as follows:-

- For an amount to pay for a service that has been delivered to the student;
- In the period of 2 weeks before the scheduled start of the registered course in which the student is enrolled - an amount that is not more than 20% of the student's tuition fee for the course;
- On the day the course starts - an amount that is not more than 45% of the total of the student's tuition fee for the course.

Tuition and non-tuition fees (for International Resident Students) are payable in advance at the commencement of each semester (refer due dates set out on Page 4).

The College reserves the right to alter any fees and charges at any time and to impose new or substitute fees and charges. Without prejudice to the College's right of recovery of any overdue amounts, a **late payment fee** may be charged if school fees are not paid by the due date each semester. This fee, which covers additional administration costs, shall be \$50 per month for each monthly period that the school fees remain in arrears.

The College may incur expenditure on items as may reasonably be required for the student during each semester and shall be reimbursed by the parents or guardians upon the issuing of a Tax Invoice. Fees for additional charges are payable forthwith upon the issuing of a Tax Invoice.

Unless otherwise agreed to by the College, the amount of any discount or other reduction in fees (including scholarships and remissions) will be forfeited and become immediately due for payment where fees are not paid in full by the due date for payment.

A student shall not be allowed to commence a new semester at the College if the school fees for the previous semester have not been paid. The College will grant an extension of time for payment only if there are exceptional circumstances outside of the parents' control. A request for such an extension of time for payment shall be made in writing to the College addressed to the Business Manager.

Change of Status and Withdrawal of a Student

To ensure appropriate care and supervision of our students, the College expects that each student will be in residence with either their parents, legal guardians or in boarding at the College.

A student may be withdrawn from the College upon the parents of the student giving at least one term's written notice (or pro-rata therewith at the discretion of the Principal or Business Manager) prior to such withdrawal. Unless otherwise agreed to by the College, in the absence of the required notice, tuition and where applicable, boarding fees shall be payable in full for the term in respect of which the withdrawal is made. The same notice and conditions apply where a student is to change status eg boarder to day girl.

Unless otherwise agreed to by the College, in the event of withdrawal of a student either for the next semester or the next year of enrolment, the College will require the payment of tuition, and where applicable, boarding fees for one full semester of the ensuing year.



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TUITION FEES:

Tuition Fees

Tuition and non-tuition fees (for International Students) are payable in advance at the commencement of each semester (refer due dates set out on Page 4).

Capital Levy

This Levy is applied on a family basis and is charged at the applicable rate for the eldest child in the family. Funds derived from the Levy are applied to the College for the purpose of replacing, upgrading and maintaining capital equipment and facilities other than buildings (e.g. ovals, gardens, tennis courts, landscaping and roadways).

International Student Levy

The International Student Levy, which applies to all students from International, provides substitute funding to the College for educating International students for whom the College does not receive Australian Government assistance.

NON-TUITION FEES:

Moderation Fee

The Moderation Fee, which applies to International students in Years 11 and 12, is charged to parents in Semester 2 each year. The fee is levied by the Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority and covers the cost of processing the Year 12 Certificate.

International Student Health Cover

The International Student Health Cover Levy, which applies to all International students, provides insurance that helps to pay an International student's medical and hospital care costs if incurred while studying in Australia. The levy is charged to parents with Term 1 additional charges.

Student Stationery

Fairholme College booklist are distributed yearly, and stationery packs may be purchased from the HOLMEstore on campus. Please refer to Page 5 for estimated costs.

Uniforms

All students enrolled from Prep to Year 12 are required to wear the full College uniform.

Goods & Services Tax (GST)

The College reserves the right to increase fees and charges to reimburse the College for the cost of any Goods and Services Tax (GST) which may be imposed on the College during the currency of the student's enrolment at the College in respect of services and goods supplied to the student by the College.

BOARDING FEES:

Boarding Fees

Boarding fees cover the cost of food and services for residential student. Board services include accommodation, residential supervision, health and nursing care, laundry facilities and cleaning. Please refer to page 5.
