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

Moorland Hall is a building that is steeped in history. The property started its life as a farmhouse on the edge of the parish of Mary Tavy in Devon. It was gradually extended and, by the late eighteen-hundreds, was known as Sunny Banks, under the ownership of John Francis Buller. Buller had become lord of the manor, first listed in the Domesday Book, and owner of much of the surrounding property and land, including the nearby Wheal Friendship mine, which at the time was the largest copper mine in the world. Sunny Banks would later be known as The Grey House and finally Moorland Hall... although the Grey Lady Ghost still haunted what would become our hotel.


