REFLECTION:

The disciples were gathered behind locked doors because of fear, then the Risen Jesus stands in their midst and they are then filled with joy as Jesus speaks words of peace and forgiveness. Peace and forgiveness open up the spaciousness of salvation, shattering the confines of locked doors and doubt. But Thomas does not believe the witness of the other disciples; he wants tangible evidence. When Jesus offers his hands and side, Thomas rather than touching only utters a profound profession of faith. (*Living Liturgy, p. 118*)

Holy Hour for Peace Reflection

Shalom Shalom

The word Peace can get thrown around a lot
A parent shouting at their kids:
Can I just get some peace and quiet?
Winston Churchill flashing a V for victory,
A symbol we now use as a peace sign,
But that victory came
When humans unleashed the most devastating power ever
used on the planet to destroy human life.
We have peaceful personality types who deny their own needs
because they think lack of conflict will keep them safe.

And we have others who seek inner peace,
But only so as not to deal with their negative thoughts and emotions.
This is not Peace

Shalom

Shalom is the Hebrew word in scripture we translate as Peace

In the translation of Exodus 21-22, shalom is translated as "make it good", "shall surely pay", "make full restitution" or to "restore".

The ancient Hebrew meaning of shalom was "to make something whole".

Not just regarding practical restoration of things that were lost or stolen.

But with an overall sense of fullness and completeness

In mind, body and estate.

Shalom literally means, "may you be full of well-being" or, "may health and prosperity be upon you."

Jesus knew this when he said "Peace be with You"

Saint Francis seems to have understood this when he was inspired to use the greeting Pace e Bene, Paz y Bien, Peace and Good.

A greeting he says he was given by the Lord.

Shalom

In his letter on the occasion of the 1972 World Day of Peace, Saint Pope Paul VI helps us understand this more.

He writes "If you want Peace, work for Justice."

If I'm only concerned for my own sense of wellbeing

There will never be peace

If I cannot work for justice for others

There will never be peace

If I cannot make the dignity of others a priority, their wellbeing, no matter their race, gender, religion, socio-economic status, or whatever

I will not have peace

We will not have Shalom

Shalom starts with me

With you

With us

Shalom

Our country is going through a great Trouble right now

It can seem very far away

It can seem incomprehensibly big

It can feel like there is nothing we can do where we are

Shalom seems so distant

As much as I want to be in Minneapolis right now

And I do wish I was there I have to be here.

And so, I have to ask myself

How can I work for justice, for peace, here and now?

How can I promote Shalom in the world from where I am?

The answers are never easy or obvious

But praying for the Shalom Jesus offers here in his own body and blood,

Is a start

Praying for Shalom will help open us to the possibilities

Of making Shalom in our own place

And in whatever place to which the Spirit calls us from here.

One of the recommended ways to participate in this Year of Grace is through a pilgrimage to a church or place of worship dedicated to Saint Francis or associated with his spirituality.

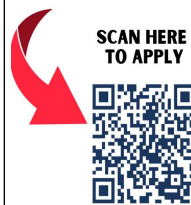
