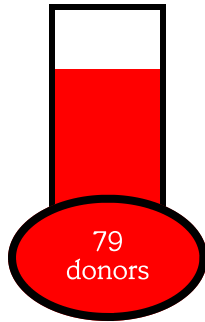

Our Mother and Advocate: The Power of Intercession

One of the most beautiful aspects of Catholic life is our relationship with Mary as our Advocate. It is essential to clarify that Catholics do not worship Mary; worship (*latría*) is reserved for the Holy Trinity alone. Instead, we honor her with a special devotion called *hyperdulia*. We ask for

her intercession because she is the "Queen Mother" of the Kingdom of Heaven. Just as the mothers of the Davidic kings in the Old Testament held a place of honor and advocacy at court, Mary stands at the right hand of her Son, bringing our petitions to Him with a mother's unique influence.

We see this intercessory role clearly at the Wedding at Cana. When the young couple's celebration was threatened by a lack of resources, Mary was the first to notice. She didn't wait to be asked; she moved with maternal instinct, telling Jesus, "**They have no wine**" (**John 2:3**). Even though Jesus remarked that His "hour had not yet come," He honored His mother's request. This teaches us that Jesus listens to His mother. When we feel that our own "wine"—our patience, our hope, or our resources—is running low, we can turn to Mary to speak to Jesus on our behalf.

The early Church understood this power. After the Ascension, the Apostles did not wait in isolation; they "**devoted themselves with one accord to prayer, together with... Mary the mother of Jesus**" (**Acts 1:14**). Today, she continues to pray with and for the Church. As our Advocate, she takes our imperfect prayers, purifies them with her love, and presents them to her Son. As St. Bernard of Clairvaux once wrote, we have never heard of anyone who fled to her protection and was left unaided. When we pray through Mary, we aren't taking a detour away from God; we are inviting the most righteous of all creatures to join her voice to ours, for we know that "**the fervent prayer of a righteous person is very powerful**" (**James 5:16**).

Questions to Ponder:

What "wine" is running short in my life right now that I should entrust to Mary's intercession?

Do I truly trust that Mary is my advocate, or do I try to carry my burdens entirely on my own?

Pentecost Sunday celebrates the dramatic descent of the Holy Spirit, transforming fearful disciples into courageous witnesses. This same divine presence is alive and active in our lives today, serving as our gentle advocate, comforter, and guide.

The beauty of the Holy Spirit lies in subtle movements within our daily routines. God's Spirit speaks in quiet promptings, inspires unexpected acts of charity, and grants us peace during difficult moments.

To experience this grace, we must cultivate awareness. By silencing the noise of the world, we can recognize this sacred guidance, surrender to divine love, and allow the Spirit's fire to renew our hearts today.

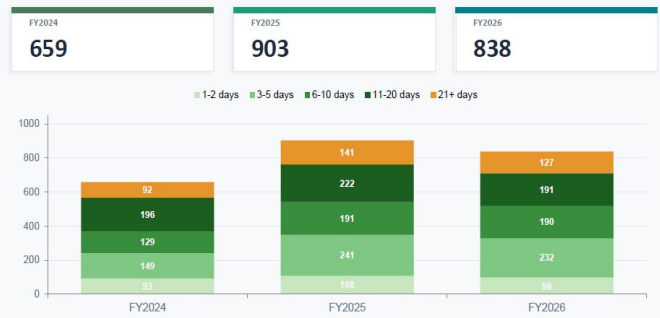

Fr. Virgil Cordano Center (FVCC) Impact Report-2025

Nearly 40% of everyone we served were not just one-time drop ins, they came to FVCC eleven times or more. These are not cold metrics, they are moments in people's lives.

Fr. Virgil Cordano Center | 2025 Impact Summary

All told, 1,039 individuals came through the door in 2025—people at every stage of housing instability, from someone living in their car to another sleeping on a friend's couch. Together they made more than 17,000 visits. But what happens when people are with us?

- 46 people connected to health and behavioral health services. For many, the first time in years they had seen a doctor.
- 46 individuals were helped to navigate government benefits applications like Medi-Cal, SSI, and CalFresh which helped to build the footing that makes housing sustainable.
- 13 people moved into permanent housing—each one the result of months, sometimes years, of relationship-building and navigating complex systems.

FVCC's role is to be the constant—the place people can trust, a place where they are known. What the data cannot capture is the human weight of a hot meal, clean clothes, a kind word, and the patient presence that says: You matter!

Thank you to all the supporters of the Fr. Virgil Cordano Center—thank you for carrying forward the vision that Sister Margaret and Father John imagined seven years ago.


