REFLECTION:

Of all the festivals on the liturgical calendar, this is the one that speaks most to us of pure, unfathomable mystery. We can only know something of God through what God has done for us and how God relates to us—these are the concrete traces of God among us. This solemnity reminds us that God does not exist in isolation but as a community of Persons in relationship to each other. The Trinity is a relational God who gives and loves. Do we choose to live an independent existence or a Trinitarian, communitarian, and self-giving way of living? The only way to living the kind of community the Trinity models for us is through love, the self-giving love that creates and sustains life. (*Living Liturgy, p. 156*)

While the word “trinity” does not appear in the Bible, it is deeply rooted in scriptures like Matthew 28:18-20 and 2 Corinthians 13:14. It was formalized for the entire Church by Pope John XXII in 1334, though its local celebration dates back more than 1600 years ago to combat the heresy of Arianism which denied Christ’s divinity.

Living the Marian Way: Modern Devotion and Practice

True devotion to the Blessed Mother is more than just a collection of prayers; **it is a way of life** that seeks to imitate her virtues of humility, purity, and radical trust. In our modern, fast-paced world, "Living the Marian Way" provides a necessary anchor for the soul. The most time-

honored spiritual practice is the Rosary. It is often described as a "compendium of the Gospel" because it allows us to meditate on the life of Christ through Mary's eyes. When we pray the Rosary, we are following the scriptural example that **"Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart" (Luke 2:19)**.

Beyond formal prayer, we are called to apply Mary's virtues to our modern practical lives. In an age of constant self-promotion and noise, Mary's humility is a powerful counter-cultural witness. She never sought the spotlight; her goal was always to magnify the Lord. We can mirror this by performing our daily work without seeking praise, offering it instead for the glory of God. Additionally, her "active listening" is a model for us. Jesus once said, **"My mother and my brothers are those who hear the word of God and act on it" (Luke 8:21)**. To live like Mary is to be a person of action—someone who hears the promptings of the Holy Spirit and moves quickly to help a neighbor in need, just as Mary hurried to help her cousin Elizabeth.

Modern devotion also includes the practice of Marian Consecration—entrusting our entire lives, our merits, and our struggles to her maternal care. This is not a "magical" act, but a conscious decision to let Mary "form" Jesus within us. By seeking her guidance, we find a roadmap for holiness that is accessible to everyone, whether we are students, parents, or retirees. When we face the stresses of the 21st century, we can find peace under her mantle, knowing that she is always leading us toward the peace that only her Son can give.

Questions to Ponder:

How can I create a small "space of silence" in my busy schedule to reflect on God's word as Mary did?

Is my devotion to Mary making me more attentive to the needs of the people around me?

The Mystery of Love: Living the Trinity Everyday

This Sunday, our parish celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. While the idea of one God in three Persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—can feel like an abstract theological puzzle, it is actually the ultimate blueprint for our daily lives.

At its core, the Trinity reveals that God is not a solitary observer, but a dynamic communion of love. God the Father generates love, God the Son returns that love, and the Holy Spirit is the bond of love between them. Because we are made in the image of this Triune God, we are hardwired for community and relationship. We cannot thrive in isolation.

Living within the love of the Trinity today means transforming our ordinary interactions into reflections of divine love. We mirror the Trinity when we practice selfless forgiveness in our families, offer authentic hospitality to lonely neighbors, and work for justice in our communities. Every time we make the Sign of the Cross, we remind ourselves that we are enveloped by this divine relationship. Let us challenge ourselves this week to step outside of our individualism and build a communion of love right where we are.

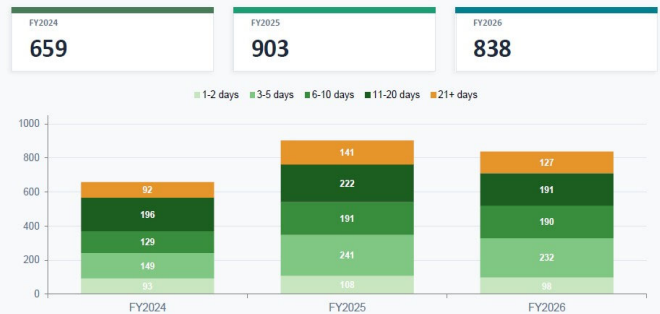

Fr. Virgil Cordano Center (FVCC) Impact Report-2025

Nearly 40% of everyone we served were not just one-time drop ins, they came to FVCC eleven times or more. These are not cold metrics, they are moments in people's lives.

Fr. Virgil Cordano Center | 2025 Impact Summary

All told, 1,039 individuals came through the door in 2025—people at every stage of housing instability, from someone living in their car to another sleeping on a friend's couch. Together they made more than 17,000 visits. But what happens when people are with us?

- 46 people connected to health and behavioral health services. For many, the first time in years they had seen a doctor.
- 46 individuals were helped to navigate government benefits applications like Medi-Cal, SSI, and CalFresh which helped to build the footing that makes housing sustainable.
- 13 people moved into permanent housing—each one the result of months, sometimes years, of relationship-building and navigating complex systems.

FVCC's role is to be the constant—the place people can trust, a place where they are known. What the data cannot capture is the human weight of a hot meal, clean clothes, a kind word, and the patient presence that says: You matter!

Thank you to all the supporters of the Fr. Virgil Cordano Center—thank you for carrying forward the vision that Sister Margaret and Father John imagined seven years ago.


