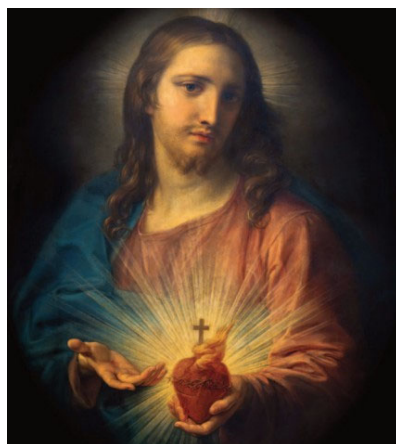

REFLECTION:

Jesus' gift of life to us through our participation in his Body and Blood is not simply for our own sakes, but for the sake of others. To receive this gift of life is to be compelled to give this gift to others. Eucharist nourishes us and gives us the strength to choose self-giving as a way of living and this is the only way to achieve eternal life. No wonder we call ourselves a Eucharistic people! 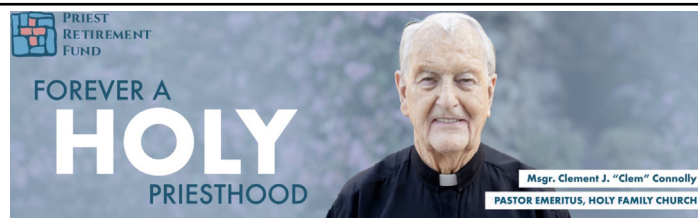
Father's Day is Sunday, June 21st

Religious Education & Faith Formation



(June is the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. We will share a month long series on the history and spirituality of this devotion. - Noël)

The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus History: A Divine Response to a Divided World

The modern devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus emerged from the quiet cloister of **Paray-le-Monial, France**, during the late 17th century. At this time, a humble nun named **St. Margaret Mary Alacoque** received a series of profound mystical visions. While the Church had long contemplated the pierced side of Christ from which blood and water flowed, these revelations provided a structured devotion centered on a physical yet divine heart as a "furnace of love." This was a direct response to **Jansenism**, a contemporary heresy that presented God as a distant, rigid judge. Through St. Margaret Mary, Jesus insisted that His Heart was on fire with love for all humanity, not just a chosen few.

The Sacred Heart represents the core of Christ's being—His total self-gift. It is the definitive answer to the human fear of being unlovable. By contemplating His Heart, we move from an abstract understanding of God to a personal encounter with a Savior who has a human heart, capable of feeling joy, sorrow, and rejection.

In 2026, as the United States celebrates its **250th anniversary**, the U.S. Bishops will formally consecrate the nation to the Sacred Heart. This recognizes that in a culture often marked by secularism and division, only the heart-to-heart relationship with Christ can provide the "wellspring of peace" needed for genuine national healing.

Thoughts for reflection:

Do I truly believe that Jesus loves me with a human heart, or do I view God as a distant, impersonal judge?

How can I participate in the healing of our nation by modeling the "gentle and humble heart" of Jesus in my daily interactions?

Faith & Future: A Snapshot of the Global Church

As we enter this new season, the global Catholic landscape is shifting in historic ways. Central to our conversation is Pope Leo XIV's first encyclical, ***Magnifica Humanitas***. In this landmark teaching, the Holy Father addresses the moral urgency of **Artificial Intelligence**, calling for "human-centric safeguards" in technology. The document also includes a profound apology for the Church's historical role in slavery, a move that has been warmly received by advocacy groups like the Knights of Peter Claver.

Closer to home, there is tremendous cause for hope. For the first time in over two decades, **adult conversions are rising**, driven largely by Gen Z's hunger for authentic community and tradition. This renewal is visible in the packed pews of the ongoing National Eucharistic Pilgrimage, which continues to unite parishes across the country.

Finally, as we navigate a polarized political climate, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) urges us to let the Gospel guide our civic engagement. Whether discussing immigration or the economy, we are reminded that our identity as Catholics comes first. Let us pray for our Holy Father and for unity!


