Next weekend—Missionary Cooperative Appeal—August 9 & 10, 2025

Each year, we host a missionary group assigned by the archdiocese's Mission Office. This year, the Diocese of Navrongo-Bolgatanga in Ghana will be represented by Fr. Rudy Alumam, a priest of this diocese in Ghana. The diocese, located in northern Ghana, has a population of about 2 million, with a Catholic population of 365,112. The early missionaries of northern Ghana embarked on preaching the Gospel and worked endlessly to form missionary disciples and promote local vocations as catechists, priests, brothers and sisters. Thanks to the formation mission of the missionaries and the grace of God, our missionaries continue to thrive.

Through time, our ailing priests and missionaries who have dedicated their lives to the Gospel now need a residence in a town where healthcare can be provided. They have no pension benefit to support their healthcare and upkeep.

This year's appeal for the diocese of Navrongo-Bolgatanga will go towards building a home for retired missionaries and priests in a city near a healthcare facility giving each person a quality of life deserving of their calling. Why a Catholic Funeral

In recent decades, there has been a noticeable decline in the number of Catholics choosing traditional Catholic funeral rites. This trend is influenced by several factors:

- Cultural shifts and secularization: There's a growing inclination towards non-religious or personalized "celebrations of life" that may not align with the structured rituals of a Catholic funeral Mass.
- Reduced religious affiliation among younger generations: Children of devout Catholics may have left the church or hold less traditional views, leading them to forgo a Catholic funeral for their parents or relatives.
- Emphasis on cost and convenience: Non-traditional funeral options, like direct cremation with a memorial service held weeks later, can be seen as simpler and less expensive than a traditional Catholic burial, according to Today's Catholic.
- Changing views on cremation: While the Catholic Church now permits cremation, provided it doesn't signify a denial of faith in the resurrection and the remains are respectfully interred in a sacred place, it still encourages burial as the preferred method. However, the rise in cremation rates and differing attitudes towards handling cremated remains (e.g., scattering or keeping at home) impact the observance of Catholic funeral rites.
- Focus on the individual rather than traditional rites: There can be a desire to personalize funeral services to highlight the life and interests of the deceased, shifting away from the more standardized rituals of a Catholic funeral.



The Importance of Catholic funeral rites

Catholic funeral rites are considered important for several reasons:

- Pastoral care and comfort: They provide a framework for mourning and offer consolation to the bereaved in light of their faith.
- Affirmation of faith and hope: The funeral Mass and burial rites place the death of a Christian within the context of Jesus's life, death, and resurrection, reminding attendees of the hope of eternal life.
- Dignity of the human body: Catholic tradition emphasizes the reverence and respect due to the human body, seeing it as a temple of the Holy Spirit and believing in the resurrection of the body.
- Support for the deceased & families: Prayers offered during the funeral Mass and afterwards are believed to benefit the soul of the deceased and help strengthen those who mourn them.

I don't know about you, but I read the obituaries every single day! You may think that's odd because I'm only 60, but believe me, most days I do know someone who died or a related person to the deceased. Something I keep seeing over and over again is that "funeral services will not be taking place," or there's no mention of services happening at all. Or there might be a "celebration of life at a later date". Now as a person in pastoral ministry I understand that there are many, many, many, reasons for what families do when their loved one dies. Families all differ on how they express their grief and how they navigate the grieving process. We do not judge or look down on what families do. But one thing that makes me sad is when I know someone was very Catholic and their family is not doing any sort of Catholic service of any kind. As a reminder, there are three formal rights to a Catholic funeral: the vigil service, the funeral mass, and the graveside service. You can have all three or any one of those or any combination of those. As I share in our annual Funeral Planning Workshop in November, you're a Catholic in good standing if you do all of them, some of them or none of them. But it just saddens me to think that people would be denied a Catholic Funeral Mass when they had attended Mass their whole life.

Now again I understand that families are each unique and most all families can have messy dynamics. People have outright hostile feelings toward the Catholic Church or they are calling themselves spiritual not religious. People are fallen away or resentful or angry or plain not interested. Again, many, many, many reasons. But if you want a Catholic Funeral Mass for yourself, you need to outline that in your will. Even if not one of your relatives is not in attendance, request a Mass to be said.

The prayers are exquisite and the pastoral care and comfort it provides is incalculable.




